PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Excellent Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and Its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

PURSUANT to section 2 of the Anniversary of the Birthday of the Reigning Sovereign Act, 1937, I the said Governor do hereby declare and proclaim with the advice and consent of the Executive Council that the 11th day of October, 1971, shall be observed as a holiday in honour of the Birthday of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second, in lieu of any other day which may be prescribed or appointed in that hehalf under any other Act or appointed in that behalf under any other Act or under any industrial award or agreement.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth on the 17th March, 1971, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:-

Forests Act, 1918-1969.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 420/68; L. & S. 314/68.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1969, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposals be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament, his proposal dated the 17th day of Seprariament, his proposal dated the 17th day of September, 1969, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown Lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown Land as State Forest No. 16 described in the Schedule hereto:-


