WHEREAS by section 13 of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1969, it is enacted that the Governor may on the recommendation of the Commissioner, declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a Main Road and may, in like manner and on the like recommendation, declare that any Main Road shall cease to be a Main Road; and whereas the Governor, by Proclamation, published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of January, 1930, declared, inter alia, that the road described in Schedule I hereto shall be a Main Road; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of the said road described in Schedule I hereto shall cease to be a Main Road and that the portion of the said road described in Schedule II hereto shall be a Main Road: Now therefore, I, the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that the portion of the Moora-Geraldton Road described in Schedule I hereto, heretofore declared to be a Main Road as aforesaid, shall cease to be a Main Road and that the portion of the Moora-Geraldton Road, as aforesaid and described in Schedule II hereto shall be a Main Road within the meaning of the Main Roads Act 1930-1969, that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the Main Road and that the said Proclamation is hereby varied accordingly.

SCHEME TEXT.

Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Cockburn Town Planning Scheme No. 5 Newton Street (North) Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

Responsible Authority.

2. The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Cockburn (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

Maps.

The following maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme-

Land Use Map.

Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the land within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and on the Scheme Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

General Objects.

- 5. The general objects of the Scheme are:-
 - (a) To plan within the Scheme Area suitable roads.
 - To plan the subdivision of land within (b) the Scheme Area.
 - (c) To ensure the proper drainage of the roads and of those parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage or other such works.
 - (d) To facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area.
 - (e) To make provision for land to be used for Public Open Space and drainage purposes.
 - (f) To make provision for the reticulation of sewerage throughout portion of the Scheme

Method of Carrying Out Objects.

- 6. As and when owners of land within the Scheme Area subdivide their land such subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an over-all plan of subdivision for the Scheme Area.
- 7. The Scheme Map forms a basis for sub-division and development of the Scheme Area but the Council may with the consent of the Town Planning Board permit alterations or variations to the subdivision of the land shown on the Scheme

Map where in its opinion circumstances justify such action provided that no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole and no alteraton shall be made to the position of the roads and public open space shown on the Scheme Map.

Subdivision.

8. An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide his land either alone or in conjunction with other owners shall submit a plan of proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board as required by the Town Planning and Development Act of Western Australia.

New Roads.

- 9. Subject to the following clauses all new roads and footways within the Scheme Area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of land therein and each owner shall when subdividing his land make the land available for the roads and footways and pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads and footways within the land owned by him.
- 10. In cases where the situation of a new road or footway within the Scheme Area is such that it would be fair and equitable that the owners of land served or capable of being served by the road or footway should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road or footway and apportion the value of the land made available and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them the amount (if any) payable by each such owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.
- 11. The Council may resume or otherwise acquire the whole or any portion or portions of the land required for new roads or footways and may construct and drain any new roads or footways within the Scheme Area. If the Council shall do so prior to the subdivision of the land in which such road or footway is situated the costs of the construction and drainage of the said road or footway and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions as and when they subdivide their land or at the expiration of three months notice given by the Council whichever shall first happen.
- 12. If an owner shall claim compensation for the resumption from him of land to be used as a road or footway there shall be set off against the amount of compensation payable to him the amount by which the value of the remainder of his land has been or will be increased by the construction of the roads or footways within the Scheme Area and by the operation of the Scheme.
- 13. If an owner shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessors in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road or footway within the Scheme Area he shall before the approval of his plan of subdivision release the Council from the payment of compensation or repay to the Council the compensation by it to him or his predecessor in title as the case may be.

the costs of the said sewerage reticulation works shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners as and when they subdivide their land or at the expiration of three months' notice given by the Council whichever shall first happen.

- 16. (1) If an owner of land within the Scheme shall subdivide his land into a larger number of lots than those shown on the Scheme Map he shall pay to the Council a sum of money equal to 1/260th of the total costs of the sewerage works carried out by or at the expense of the Council in respect of each such additional lot.
- (2) If an owner shall construct a building or buildings which will contain dwelling-houses or dwelling units of a greater number than there are subdivision lots owned by him he shall pay to the Council a sum of money equal to 1/260th of the total costs of the sewerage works carried out by or at the expense of the Council in respect of each such additional dwelling-house or dwelling unit.
- (3) All moneys received by the Council pursuant to the provisions of this clause shall be applied by the Council in the development of Public Open Space or land-scaping drainage sites within the Scheme Area.

Public Open Space.

- 17. It is intended that the land coloured green on the Scheme Map shall be reserved for Public Open Space and drainage purposes.
- 18. The Council may as and when it deems fit acquire the said lands coloured green or any parts thereof either by purchase or resumption or partly by one method and partly by the other.
- 19. Each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall prior to the final approval by the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land and subject as hereinafter provided transfer to the Council an area of land equal to one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided or developed by him or such other areas as the Town Planning Board shall upon approval of the Plan of Subdivision require.
- 20. If within a portion of the Scheme Area the subject of subdivision and development it is not possible to transfer an area of land equal to one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided the Council may make or receive a cash adjustment so that the value of the land (if any) to be transferred with or subject to the cash adjustment equals one-tenth of the land the subject of the subdivision.
- 21. If within a portion of the Scheme Area the subject of subdivision and development more than one-tenth is required by the Council for Public Open Space or drainage purposes the owner shall transfer to the Council the land required by it

for that purpose and the Council shall pay to the owner by way of compensation the value of the land exceeding the said one-tenth as shall be required by the Council. If the Council so agrees the Council may transfer to the said owner other land in or near the Scheme Area either owned by the Council or acquired by it for that purpose to compensate him for the land in excess of the said one-tenth required by the Council in which case the amount payable by the Council to the owner shall be reduced accordingly.

- 22. The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any land transferred to or acquired by it for the purpose of Public Open Space or drainage purposes provided that all moneys received by the Council in respect of such sales and all moneys received by the Council under Clause 20 hereof shall after making all necessary payments to owners and paying the costs of land (if any) acquired for transfer to owners under Clause 21 hereof be expended by the Council in the acquisition or improvement of land for Public Open Space or drainage purposes in or near the Scheme Area concerned.
- 23. If the Council shall have resumed land for Public Open Space roads or drainage purposes it shall be reimbursed all compensation and costs paid by it from moneys received by it from the sale of land or under the preceding clauses hereof and upon the owner from whom the land was resumed subdividing his land the value of one-tenth of his land to be made available for Public Open Space or drainage purposes hereunder shall be assessed on the basis that such land has not been

Scheme Costs.

- 24. The costs or estimated costs of the following items are hereinafter referred to as "Scheme Costs":—
 - (a) The administrative costs of the Scheme.
 - (b) The cost of the survey of the roads the public open space and drainage areas shown on the Scheme Map.
 - (c) The drainage works necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area and the acquisition of land for drainage purposes.
 - (d) All other costs and expenses which shall be payable by the Council in order to complete the Scheme.

Payment of Scheme Costs.

25. Each owner shall prior to the final approval by the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land or at the expiration of three months' notice given by the Council whichever shall first happen pay to the Council an amount which bears the same proportion to the Scheme Costs as the area of the owner's land bears to the whole of the land within the Scheme Area that is privately owned at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme.

Estimate of Scheme Costs.

26. If any of the items of Scheme Costs have not been paid or ascertained at the time of a subdivision or of the giving of a notice as aforesaid they may be estimated by the Council. An estimate may be revised from time to time.

Valuations.

- 27. Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme the value shall be determined by a disinterested and competent valuer appointed by the Council.
- 28. If an owner objects to the value so determined he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the

value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

29. If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected by such revaluation shall forthwith be notified of any change in value.

Land Owned or Acquired by the Council.

30. All or any of the land now owned by or subsequently acquired by the Council within or near the Scheme Area may be used by the Council for any purposes appropriate to the Scheme and if such purpose is one for which an owner is required to make land available or for which land may be acquired by the Council pursuant to this Scheme the Council shall be compensated for the value of the land so used by the Council.

Arbitration.

31. Any dispute or difference between the owners as to any matter which by the terms of this Scheme may be determined by arbitration may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator he may be nominated by the Council.

Powers and Authorities of Council.

- 32. In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—
 - (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.
 - (b) To make agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
 - (c) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.
 - (d) If any owner of land within the Scheme Area does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the terms of the Scheme or by reason of the nature of his land is unable to subdivide or develop it and his failure to do so will in the opinion of the Council unduly delay the completion of the Scheme the Council may resume the land of such owner or owners and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.
 - (e) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under paragraph (d) it shall have all the powers of an owner in the subdivision development and disposal of the said land. If the owner has not been paid compensation for the resumption of his land the Council shall before selling the land so subdivided and developed offer the new lots to the owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption subdivision or development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one calendar month of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon such subdivision and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. balance (if any) of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.

- (f) If the offer mentioned in paragraph (e) hereof be not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.
- (g) The Council may resume any land within the Scheme Area for roads and footways public open space or drainage purposes.
- (h) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under paragraph (d) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- To extend the time within which payments have to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.
- 33. Twenty-eight days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to Section 10. of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.
- 34. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by Section 13. of the Act.

Claims for Compensation.

35. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme may be made within six months of the Scheme coming into operation.
