AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 15th day of April, 1971, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which, after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Ravensthorpe, more particularly described in the schedule hereunder, a fire district;
- (b) assign the name Ravensthorpe Fire District to that district; and
- (c) include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, "Ravensthorpe Fire District" and in column two opposite that name, the name of the local authority, "Shire of Ravensthorpe."

### Schedule.

#### RAVENSTHORPE FIRE DISTRICT.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the southwestern corner of Ravensthorpe Townsite Lot 266 and extending northerly along the eastern side of Road Number 2656 to the southern side of Martin Street; thence westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the easternmost eastern boundary of Oldfield Location 182; thence northerly to and along that boundary and the eastern boundary of Location 967 (Reserve 28341) and onwards to the northern side of Morgans Street; thence 85 degrees 30 minutes, 9 chains and 50 links; thence 355 degrees 30 minutes, about 2 chains 14 and four tenths links

to the southern boundary of the late Mineral Lease 353 as shown on Mines Department Diagram 66/161; thence 88 degrees 16 minutes, about 3 chains; thence 358 degrees 16 minutes, 75 links along boundaries of that late lease; thence 85 degrees 30 minutes to the western side of Scott Street; thence generally northerly along that side and the western side of Road Number 4504 to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of Ravensthorpe Townsite Lot 534; (Reserve 10625); thence easterly to and along that boundary to the western side of Queen Street; thence generally northerly along that side to the south-western corner of Oldfield Location 460 (Reserve 9029); thence easterly along southern boundaries of that location and Locations 125 and 163 to the south-western corner of Location 227; thence easterly, northeasterly and southeasterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the northwestern side of Jamieson Street; thence generally north-easterly along that side to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern side of Elston Street; thence southerly to and along that side to the southern side of Minehen Street; thence westerly and southwesterly along that side to the north-eastern side of Neil Street; thence generally south-easterly along that side to the northern side of Road Number 2189 and onwards to the north-eastern corner of Ravensthorpe Townsite Lot 268; thence southeasterly along the southern side of Hopetoun Road to the northern corner of Lot 723; thence generally southeasterly, southwesterly, westerly and northerly along boundaries of that lot to the easternmost northeastern corner of Oldfield Location 117; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the southern side of Hopetoun Road aforesaid; thence westerly along that side to the northeastern corner of Ravenssthorpe Townsite Lot 704; thence southerly, easterly, again southerly, westerly, northerly, again westerly and again southerly along boundaries of Oldfield Location 299 (Reserve 18818) to the northern boundary of Location 267 (Reserve 8358); thence westerly along that boundary and onwards to the southwestern side of the 150 link road passing along the southwestern boundary of Location 265 (Reserve 13248); thence northwesterly along that side to the northernmost northern boundary of Reserve 8941 and thence westerly, southerly, and again westerly along boundaries of that reserve to the starting point. (Public Plan Ravensthorpe Townsite.)

Land Act, 1933-1969.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 237/17.—That Reserve No. 18803 should vest in and be held by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage in trust for the purpose of "Water and Conservation of Flora and Fauna".

(The previous Order in Council dated 25th September, 1963 is hereby superseded.)

Corres. 3177/55.—That Class "A" Reserve No. 24653 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River in trust for the purpose of "Recreation and Camping".

(The previous Order in Council dated 26th February, 1957 is hereby superseded.)

Corres. 2456/25.—That Reserve No. 29680 should vest in and be held by The Western Australian Wild Life Authority in trust for the purpose of "Conservation of Flora and Fauna".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1969.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 85/67.—That Reserve No. 30222 (Karrinyup Lot 465) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to The Commissioners of the Presbyterian Church in Western Australia to be held in trust for an "Aged Persons' Home".

Corres. 2520/61.—That Reserve No. 26267 (Kununurra Lot 237) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to The Presbyterian Church (New South Wales) Property Trust to be held in trust for "Church Purposes (Presbyterian)".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid bodies, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any

Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 22155 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Works in trust for "Water Supply Purposes": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Minister for Works in trust for "Water Supply Purposes" with power to the said Minister for Works to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

SCHEME TEXT.

THE Murray Shire Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the Town of Pinjarra.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.0 Scheme Title: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Town of Pinjarra Town Planning Scheme hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.1 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the Scheme Maps and enclosed by an open black line delineating, for the purposes of this Scheme, the district of the Town of Pinjarra.

1.2 General Intent: The intent of this Scheme is to direct and control the development of the Scheme Area in such a way as shall promote and safeguard the health, safety and convenience and the economic and general welfare of its inhabitants and the amenities of every part of the Scheme Area.

1.3 Responsible Authority: The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Murray (hereinafter referred to as the Council).

1.4 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:—

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—Reserved Land.

Part III.—Zones.

Part IV.—Non-conforming Uses.

Part V.—General Provisions.

Part VI.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Map.
- (2) Scheme Map.

1.5 General Obligations: Subject to the provisions of the Act and all regulations made thereunder and to Part IV of this Scheme, no person shall depart or permit or suffer any departure from the requirements and provisions of the Scheme nor shall any person use or permit the use of any land or building or undertake or permit any new work if the use, new work, reconstruction, alteration or modification does not conform with the Scheme or would tend to delay the effective operation of the Scheme.

1.6 Relationship of Scheme to By-laws: The provisions of this Scheme shall have effect, notwithstanding any by-law for the time being in force in the District and where the provisions of the Scheme are inconsistent with the provisions of any by-law, the provisions of the scheme shall prevail.

1.7 Uniform General Building By-laws: In addition to the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws, the conditions set down in Part III shall apply to residential dwelling units in the various zones: Provided that where the provisions of this Scheme are inconsistent with the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws, then the provisions of this Scheme shall prevail.

1.8 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

1.9 Appeal Rights: Any person grieved by a decision of the Council exercising its discretionary powers embodied in Part III and Part V of this text may appeal from such decision to the Minister for Town Planning who may uphold, reverse or vary the decision of Council, and the order of the Minister shall be binding and final. An appeal to the Minister made under this provision shall be lodged with the Minister not later than 28 days after the Council has given notice of its decision. The appeal shall describe the land subject of the appeal and shall set out the appellant's interest in that land, the nature of proposed development, the grief caused by the Council's decisions and the grounds for appeal.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

Reservation of Land and Development  
Thereof.

2.0 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval, the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

(e) Where under this Scheme land is reserved for Parks and Recreation, the Council may approve rural development of the land so reserved, providing such development in no way detracts from the Council's intention of securing a pleasant and usable parklands system for both active and passive recreational pursuits.

2.1 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.



PART III.—ZONES.

3.0 Zones Specified in the Scheme: The following use zonings are specified and described in this Scheme. They are scheduled in Table No. 1 Zoning Table and described by Distinctive Notations on the Scheme Map.

- Residential A.
- Residential B.
- Residential C.
- Town Centre.
- Industrial.
- Rural.

In addition, the following Special Use Zones are specified and described in this Scheme, but are not scheduled in Table No. 1:—

Service Station, Private Clubs and Institutions, Hotel, Place of Public Assembly, Racecourse and Stables, Offices, Caravan Park, Chalet.

3.1 Table No. 1 appended to this clause indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of the "Table". The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 have the following meanings:—

- P—A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
- AA—A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.
- IP—A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.
- X—A use that is not permitted.

Any use not specifically listed in Table No. 1 shall be included either in the appropriate use class or special use class at the discretion of the Council.

3.1.1 Any person who intends to use land for a purpose which is only permitted with the special approval of the Council shall make written application to the Council for such approval and the application shall state:—

- (a) The legal description of the land and the particulars of the Certificate of Title.
- (b) The names and addresses of the registered proprietors and of all other persons having an interest in the land and the nature of their interest.
- (c) The full name and address of the applicant and the nature of his interest in the land.
- (d) The purposes for which the applicant desires to use the land, together with plans and statements illustrating and explaining the nature and details of the proposed use.
- (e) The reasons why the Council should exercise its authority to permit the proposed use.

3.1.2 The Council shall consider the application and may refuse its approval or may resolve to approve the application with or without conditions or, the Council may resolve that notice of the proposed use should be given to those ratepayers and residents likely to be affected by the granting of the application.

3.1.3 If the Council so resolves the applicant shall give notice of the proposed use to those owners of land scheduled by the Council, and cause to be published in a newspaper circulating in the Scheme Area notice of the application setting out in abbreviated form the information contained in the application and stating that objections may be made to the Council within a specified period, being not less than twenty-eight days from the publication of the said notice.

3.1.4 Within twenty-eight days of the expiry of the objection period the Council shall again consider the application and any objections lodged opposing the proposed use and shall resolve to refuse or grant its approval or to grant its approval subject to conditions.

3.1.5 The Council may enter into agreements with the applicant whereby the applicant covenants for himself and his transferees to carry out and observe the conditions imposed by the Council in granting its approval.

3.2 Residential A Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are listed in Table No. 1. Within this zone the Council will exercise its discretion to permit "AA uses" after consideration of overall development plans prepared and submitted by or on behalf of landowners to show the proposed subdivision of land, the proposed land use pattern the allocation of land for various public uses, including reserves for parks and recreation, the co-ordination of proposed subdivision and land usage with adjoining properties and with existing and proposed public utility systems.

3.2.1 The following bulk and location controls will apply to residential uses which are permitted or which may be permitted with Council approval within this zone:—

3.2.2 Where uses other than residential are proposed within this zone then control of such uses and standards of development shall be generally in accordance with controls and standards applied to similar uses elsewhere in the Scheme Area.

3.2.3 The Council will apply the following accommodation factors to multi-unit development to assess density of occupation:—

3.2.4 Within the Residential A Zone the Council will only permit multi-unit development which complies with the requirements of clauses 3.2 and 3.2.1, and where convenient association with recreational and or commercial and community facilities justify such closer settlement and, where the developer has entered into an agreement with the Council for additional open space to be provided over and above the normal 10 per cent. of gross area required to be reserved for public recreation as a condition of subdivision approval by the Town Planning Board.

3.3 Residential B Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are listed in Table No. 1. The following bulk and location controls will apply to residential uses which are permitted or which may be permitted with Council approval within this zone.

3.3.1 Where uses other than residential are proposed within this zone then control over such uses and standards of development shall be generally in accordance with controls and standards applied to similar uses elsewhere in the Scheme Area.

3.4 Residential C Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are listed in Table No. 1. The bulk and location controls including parking provisions of the GR5 Code of the Uniform General Building By-laws will apply to residential uses which are permitted or which may be permitted with Council approval within this zone provided that a plot ratio of .70 may not be exceeded.

3.4.1 Where uses other than residential are proposed within this zone the control over such uses and standards of development shall be generally in accordance with controls and standards applied to similar uses elsewhere in the Scheme Area.

3.5 Notwithstanding the provisions of clauses 3.2 and 3.4.1 of this part a dwelling house may, subject to the approval of the Council be erected on any lot within a residential zone which has been subdivided with the approval of the Town Planning Board.

3.6 Town Centre Zone: The uses permitted in this zone with the approval of the Council are listed in Table No. 1. In determining whether or not any proposed use may be permitted the Council will have reference to the Town Centre Development Policy Map annexed to the Scheme Map. The term "Extensive Business" means land and buildings used for business undertakings which require extensive ground areas and the term includes drive-in theatres, drive-in restaurants, caravan parks and motels. The Town Centre Development Policy Map is, for the purposes of this Scheme, an element of the Scheme Map. Unlike the zoning sheets of the Scheme Map it does not classify areas for specified uses, rather it indicates the types of uses which the Council considers appropriate for various areas within the Town Centre Zone and a road system which the Council believes is desirable to attain safe and efficient movement of goods and people in and about the Town Centre.

3.6.1 Complementary to the Town Centre Development Policy Map which expresses Council policy relating to distribution of uses within the Town Centre Zone the Council will administer the following policy relating to standards of development and the preservation of safety, convenience and amenity within the Zone.

Planning and development within the Town Centre Zone shall be carried out to the approval of the Council incorporating the principles and provisions enumerated below:—

- (1) Buildings shall be designed and constructed to secure an integrated layout and to attain visual harmony between buildings erected from time to time on various land holdings.
- (2) Provision shall be made for planting and landscaping of the development to enhance its appearance and to secure harmonious relationship between the development and the existing or potential use of adjoining land.
- (3) Service for shops shall be provided by vehicle access to the rear of such shops and such access shall be screened from public view to the satisfaction of Council.
- (4) Off street parking space shall be laid out to provide maximum safety and convenience to users in accordance with the standards detailed in clause 5.2 of this Scheme Text.
- (5) Access from public roads to parking areas shall be sited to reduce traffic hazards to a minimum.
- (6) Any service station or petrol filling station proposed within the Town Centre Zone shall be located and designed in such way as to secure the safe and orderly circulation of vehicular traffic and not interfere with the safety and convenience of pedestrian movement.

3.7 Industrial Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are listed in Table No. 1. The Council intends to administer the controls and regulations listed below in addition to its discretion to permit or to refuse general industrial uses, so as to secure a pleasant and efficient industrial environment attractive to the workforce, fully equipped in terms of services to serve a wide range of industry whilst permitting optimum productivity from the industrial land resource.

3.7.1 When considering any application for development within the zone the Council shall have regard to the provision and preservation of amenities which are commensurate with the establishment and operation of a modern industrial estate, particularly in relation to safe and efficient

movement of goods and people; aesthetically pleasing layout, disposition and construction of buildings, plant and ancillary facilities and, to safe, convenient and compatible relationship between various uses within the zone.

3.7.2—The following bulk and location requirements shall apply to all industrial undertakings within the zone.

- (1) Maximum Site Coverage: No site shall be built upon to exceed a site coverage of 70 per cent.
- (2) Setback of Buildings from Site Boundaries: No part of any building shall be built upon that area of land between the street alignment and the building setback line drawn parallel thereto 50 feet within the site.

Provided that: In regard to any corner site the minimum setback from the street alignment shall apply to the frontage of the site to the road or roads of higher category as determined by Council and the setback from the lesser roads shall be not less than 30 feet.

- (3) Building Setback Areas: No use of the area between the street alignment and building setback lines shall be permitted other than for planting or for pedestrian and vehicular circulation and parking in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme except that; not more than 20 per cent. of the setback area may be used for trade display purposes approved by Council.
- (4) Pedestrian and Garden Space: Every person who constructs or who substantially reconstructs, alters or adds to a building or who changes the use of any land or building within the zone shall make provision for 25 per cent. of the building setback area between the street alignment and the minimum building setback line to be set aside, developed and maintained as garden space for pedestrian use only. The layout of the pedestrian and garden space shall be to the satisfaction of the Council who shall have regard to the interrelation of buildings, parking areas and open spaces and to traffic movement both on the subject site and on adjoining sites.
- (5) Parking and Loading: Off street parking and loading spaces shall be laid out to provide maximum safety and convenience to users in accordance with the standards detailed in clause 52 of this Scheme Text.

3.8 Rural Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are listed in Table No. 1. Where uses other than rural are permitted within this zone then control over such uses and standards of development shall be generally in accordance with controls and standards applied to similar uses elsewhere in the Scheme Area.

3.9 Service Station Zone: Within this zone service station use only is permitted.

3.10 Hotel Zone: Within this zone hotel use only is permitted.

3.11 Racecourse and Stable Zone: An area of 195 acres has been zoned for racecourse and stable purposes in two locations; one centred on the Pinjarra Race Club property and the other on the Pinjarra Trotting Club property. Within this zone, land and buildings may be used only for activities directly associated with the racing, training and stabling of horses. No person shall use any land or building nor construct or reconstruct any building for residential, business or industrial purposes without the written consent of Council.

3.12 Private Clubs and Institutions: Within this zone the designated uses only are permitted.

3.13 Place of Public Assembly: Within this zone the designated uses only are permitted.

3.14 Offices: Within this zone office use only is permitted.

#### PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (1) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (2) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (1) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.

(2) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.3 Change of Non-conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use:

- (1) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under clause 4.3 when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (2) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

#### PART V.—AMENITY CONTROL.

5.1 Vehicle Parking and Loading: The purpose of this clause is to secure the provision of off-street parking and loading facilities in relation to the use of land so as to reduce or prevent the congestion of traffic on any road or public place. Every owner or occupier who constructs or who substantially reconstructs, alters or adds to a building on any site or changes the use of any land or building shall make provision in accordance with the requirements of Table II for vehicles used in conjunction with the site (whether by occupiers, their employees or invitees or other persons) to stand on or, in the opinion of the Council sufficiently close to the site but not on a street while being loaded or unloaded or awaiting use.

5.2 Size and Location of Car Space: The minimum dimensions of every required car parking space shall be 18 feet by 8 feet, excluding all access drives. When considering any development application, the Council shall have regard to and impose conditions on the details of locating and designing the required car parking spaces. In particular, the Council shall take into account, and may impose conditions concerning—

- (i) the proportion of car spaces to be roofed or covered;
- (ii) the proportion of car spaces to be below natural ground level;
- (iii) the means of access to each car space and the adequacy of any vehicular manouevring area;
- (iv) the location of the car spaces on the site and their effect on the amenity of adjoining development, including the potential effect, if those spaces should later be roofed or covered;
- (v) the extent to which car spaces are located within required building set-back areas;
- (vi) the locations of proposed public footpath, vehicular crossings, of private footpaths within the lot, and the effect on both pedestrian and vehicular traffic movement and safety;
- (vii) the suitability and adequacy of proposed screening or natural planting; and
- (viii) the suitability and adequacy of elevated structural decks for development and service as a proportion of the required area for natural planting and pedestrian space.

5.3 Number of Parking and Loading Spaces to be Provided: The number of spaces to be provided in respect of any particular site shall be determined by Council having regard to the nature of the use and the known or likely volume of goods, materials or people moving to and from the site, and where the use is stipulated, not less than the number of spaces set down in Table 2 hereunder.

6. Theatres, cinemas, halls and non-residential clubs	1 to every 4 persons whom the building is designed to accommodate.

12. Industry ....	1 to every 500 sq. ft. of gross floor area, or 1 to every 2 persons employed whichever is the greater.

5.4 Preservation of amenities: No building shall be so constructed or finished or left unfinished that its external appearance would disfigure the locality or tend to depreciate the value of adjoining property. Further, all land and buildings shall be so used and maintained as to preserve the amenities of the neighbourhood in which they are situated.

5.5 Nuisance: No Lot, building or appliance shall be used in such a manner as to permit the escape therefrom of smoke, dust, fumes, odour, noise, vibration or waste products in such quantity or extent or in such a manner as to create or be a nuisance to any inhabitant of the neighbourhood of such land or to traffic or persons using roads in the vicinity.

5.6 Traffic Entrances: If in the opinion of the Council separate entrances to and exits from any lot for road vehicles are desirable for the avoidance of traffic hazards on public roads adjacent thereto it may require the owner to provide such entrances and exits as it may direct.

5.7 Places and Objects of Historical Interest and Natural Beauty:

No person shall, without the written consent of the Council, wilfully destroy, remove, modify or damage any object or place registered on the Schedule of Places and Objects of Historical Interest and Natural Beauty.

The Council may, after giving public notification of its intention to cancel any such registration and after considering any objections lodged within 28 days of such public notification, resolve to remove any place or object from the Schedule and the Council thereupon shall make the appropriate alteration to the Schedule and notify accordingly the owner or occupier of the land upon which the object or place is situated.

Public notification shall include notice in a local newspaper, a letter to the National Trust of Australia (W.A.) and a letter to the Royal W.A. Historical Society.

## PART VI. FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Disposal of land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 In addition to all other powers vested in it the Council may acquire land and buildings within the Scheme Area and enter into agreements and arrangements with any of the other owners of land within the Scheme Area.

6.3 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

6.4 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.5 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

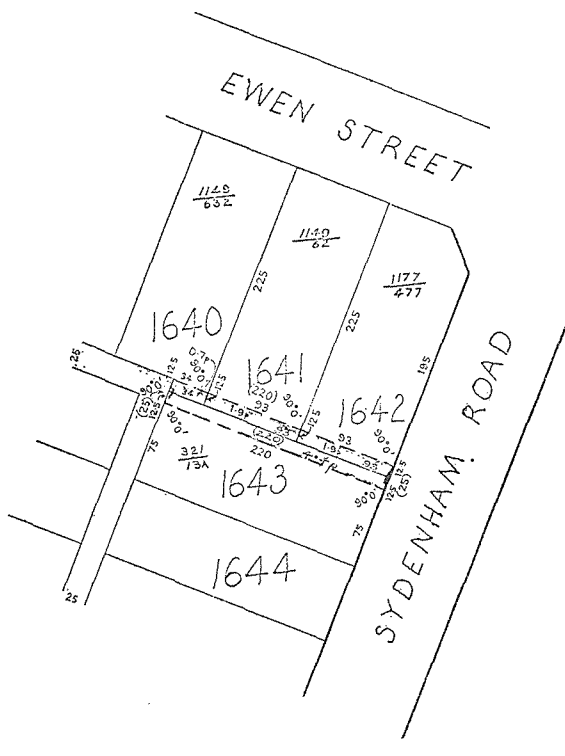
