WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (4) of section 130 of the Liquor Act, 1970, that the Governor may at any time cancel a proclamation made under section 150 of the Licensing Act, 1911; and whereas the Governor, by a Proclamation made the 19th October, 1966, and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th published in the Government Gazette on the 28th October, 1966, did declare that on and after the 1st November, 1966, certain portions of the State specified in that Proclamation should be areas for the purposes of section 150 of the Licensing Act, 1911; and whereas it was enacted by paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 5 of the Liquor Act, 1970, that almy proclamation made under the Licensing Act, 1911, that corresponds to a proclamation that might have been given under section 130 of the Liquor Act, 1970, should have the same force and effect as if it were made under that Act; and whereas it is now deemed desirable that on and after the 1st day of July, 1971, such proclamation be cancelled to the intent that the provisions of section 130 of the Liquor Act, 1970, shall no longer apply to any portion of the State: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby and consent of the Executive Council do hereby declare that on and after the 1st day of July, 1971,

the proclamation made on the 19th October, 1966, and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th October, 1966, be cancelled.


