AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 20th day of October 1971, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:-

> Securities Industry Act, 1970. Interpretation Act, 1918-1970.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Securities Industry Act, 1970 and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1970 doth hereby declare:

1. That in this Order in Council-

"bank" means a bank as defined in section 5 of the Banking Act 1959, of the Parliament of the Commonwealth, or any Act in amendment or substitution of that Act and includes the Commissioners of the Rural and Industries Bank of Western Australia;

"life office" means a corporation registered under a law of the Commonwealth relating to life insurance;

"merchant bank" means a corporation which has a paid up capital of not less than \$1,000,000 and which is a public company under the law of a State or Territory of the Commonwealth and in respect of which the Registrar, as defined in the Act, has issued a certificate in or to the effect that he is satisfied that the principal functions of the corporation are one or more of the following functions

- (a) underwriting issues of securities;
- (b) advising and assisting corporations in relation to-
 - (i) the raising of capital by them;
 - (ii) corporate reconstructions and amalgamations;
 - (iii) the acquisition of securities of other corporations primarily for the purposes of exercising control by the first mentioned corporations of such other corporations;
- (c) dealing in bills of exchange or otherwise operating in the money market;

"superannuation scheme" means any scheme or fund the income of which is for the time being exempted from income tax pursuant to the provisions of sections 23 (jaa) or 23 (ja) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936, of the Commonwealth, as amended from time to time, or is a scheme or fund to which section 23F of that Act applied in relation to its last year of income:

"trustee" in relation to a superannuation scheme includes any person responsible for the administration or mangement of the scheme; and

"the Act" means the Securities Industry Act, 1970.

- That section 18 of the Act does not apply to or in relation to any person who is a stockbroker under any corresponding law.
- 3. That section 10, Division 2 of Part III, and Part VI of the Act do not apply to or in relation to a bank that carries on the business of dealing in securities solely as incidental to the conduct of its banking business only by-
 - (a) dealing in the debentures, stocks, or bonds of any Government or any public statutory authority of the Commonwealth or of any State or Territory of the Commonwealth or of any Local Government body in any State or Territory of the Commonwealth;
 - (b) accepting appointments as banker to an issue of securities and doing anything pursuant or incidental to the terms of such an appointment.
- 4. That section 11 and Division 2 of Part III of the Act do not apply to or in relation to any person in the employment of such a bank as is

referred to in clause 3 of this Order in Council if the Act would not apply to him but for that employment

- 5. That section 10, Division 2 of Part III, and Part VI of the Act do not apply to or in relation to a life office or a trustee of a superannuation scheme which or who is a dealer within the meaning of the Act by reason only of occasionally dealing in securities incidentally to the management and administration of life insurance business or a superannuation scheme, as the case requires, subject to the condition that the life office or trustee, as the case may be, lodges with the Registrar, as defined in the Act, within two months after the 30th June in each year a statement in or to the effect of Form 12 in the Second Schedule to the Securities Industry Regulations, 1971, and containing particulars of all dealings in securities which have been made by him, otherwise than with stock brokers, holders of dealers' licences, and exempt dealers, during the last preceding year ending on the 30th June.
- 6. That section 11 and Division 2 of Part III of the Act do not apply to or in relation to any person employed by or acting for or by arrangement with such a life office, or such a trustee of a superannuation scheme, as is referred to in clause 5 of this Order in Council, in so far as that person acts as a dealer's representative by reason of his performing the functions of a dealer for that life office or trustee.
- 7. That sections 41 and 42 of the Act do not apply to or in relation to a merchant bank if the merchant bank carries on the business of dealing in securities by reason only of—
 - (a) carrying out any function which the Registrar, as defined in the Act, has certified to be one of its principal functions or doing anything incidental to the carrying out of such a function; or
 - (b) doing anything which is incidental to the management and administration of investments of a client if the amount of the investment managed or administered for the client is not less than \$100,000.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1969. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.


Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1970.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1970. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1970, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas Millars Australia Pty. Ltd., of 112-152 Pilbara Street, Welshpool, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the Regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond for \$25,000 charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt Millars Australia

Pty. Ltd. from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1970, for a period terminating on the 15th day of September, 1973.
