WHEREAS by section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1969, it is provided that where the Commissioner is of the opinion that a controlled access road should be provided and should be entered and departed from at specified places only, he shall make a recommendation to the Governor accordingly and that if of opinion that the recommendation should be given effect the Governor may, by Proclamation, proclaim the controlled access road and the places only at which the controlled access road may be entered or departed from; and whereas the Commissioner is of opinion that a controlled access road should be provided as hereinafter described and has made a recommendation to the Lieutenant Governor accordingly; and whereas I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said State, am of opinion that such recommendation should be given effect: Now, therefore, I the said Lieutenant Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that the parcel of land coloured red in Plan M.R.D. Child Welfare Act, 1947-1970.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 (2) (a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1970, it is provided that the Governor may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court and may determine the respective seniorities of such members; and whereas by section 19 (1) (b) (ii) of the said Act the Governor may amend, vary or revoke any such appointment: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby appoint Margaret Isobel Moseley as a Member of the Children's Court at Williams.

Local Government Act, 1960-1970.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

I, THE UNDERSIGNED MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURE, being the Minister charged with the administration of the Agricultural Products Act, 1929-1968, acting in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon me by section 3D of the said Act and on the recommendation of the Stone Fruit Sales Advisory Committee constituted under the Act, do hereby prohibit the sale, except for the purposes of export, of all stone fruits of kinds and varieties listed in Column 1 of the schedule hereto that are below the minimum sizes specified in Column 2 of the schedule, from the 15th day of November, 1971 until the 30th day of April, 1972.

A person shall not sell, except for the purpose of export from the State, any stone fruit of which the sale is, pursuant to the provisions of section 3D of the Act prohibited, and any person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.
