Preference will be given to applicants with research and field experience over a broad range of matters of an engineering nature and/or involving the physical sciences. An understanding of systems analysis is desirable but not essential. Any knowledge of industrial management, economics, computers as well as of bush-walking or similar outdoor activities should be indicated.

(g) University degree or the equivalent, majoring in one or more of the natural sciences.

Preference will be given to an applicant with a broad knowledge of natural sciences and with research and field experience.

(j) Age—Person under 30 years desired.

(k) (a) Junior Certificate including English, Mathematics A and B and Physics. Mechanical Drawing an advantage.

(b) Qualified fitter in the electrical, general engineering or mechanical field.

(c) Experience in repair and adjustment of weighing machines or petroleum measuring instruments an advantage.

(l) Leaving Certificate and two tertiary Education units in scientific or mathematical subjects and 4 years relevant experience, or the Certificate in Applied Science, or approved equivalent.

(m) Junior Certificate in six subjects including English, Maths A, Maths B and Drawing or an acceptable trade qualification, plus at least two years' relevant practical drawing office experience.

(n) The successful applicant should—

(i) Have had experience in Water Supply Maintenance and construction works operated by the Metropolitan Water Board.

(ii) Be familiar with the operation and organisation of the work carried out from Metropolitan Water Board Depots and the general policies regarding the laying of services and water mains.

(iii) Have had considerable experience in the supervision and handling of men.

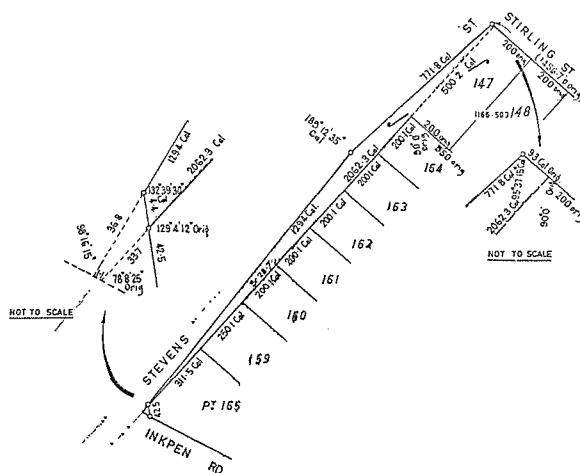
