WHEREAS it is provided by section 26 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1970, that where in the opinion of the Minister it is desirable that any plant or the refuse of a plant should be burnt during prohibited burning times in order to prevent or eradicate disease arising or likely to arise from the plant or refuse, the Governor, may, on the recommendation of the Minister, by proclamation authorise the burning of the plant or refuse of the plant during prohibited burning times or during any period of prohibited burning times and declare that such proclamation shall take effect either generally or in the particular district specified in the proclamation; and whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable that the plants or refuse thereof specified hereunder should be burnt during prohibited burning times in order to prevent or eradicate disease in the particular districts specified hereunder: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby authorise the burning, subject to the Regulations, of the undermentioned plants or refuse of the plants during the periods and in the particular districts set out in the schedule hereto.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth on the 1st December, 1971, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1963-1965.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*), by subsection (2) of section six in Part II of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1963-1965, that where the Governor is satisfied that, if the benefits conferred by that Part are extended to judgments given in the superior Courts of any Commonwealth country, or given in the superior Courts of any foreign country, substantial reciprocity of treatment will be assured as respects the enforcement within that Commonwealth country or in that foreign country, as the case may be of judgments given in the Supreme Court, he may by Order direct—

- (a) that Part II of the Foreign Judgments Act, 1963-1965, shall extend to that foreign country; and
- (b) that such courts as are specified in the Order shall be deemed to be superior Courts of that Commonwealth country or of that foreign country for the purposes of that Part;

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, being so satisfied with respect to judgments given in the superior Courts of Sierra Leone doth hereby direct—

- (a) that Part II of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1963-1965, shall extend to Sierra Leone; and
- (b) that the Supreme Court of Sierra Leone be deemed a superior Court of that country.

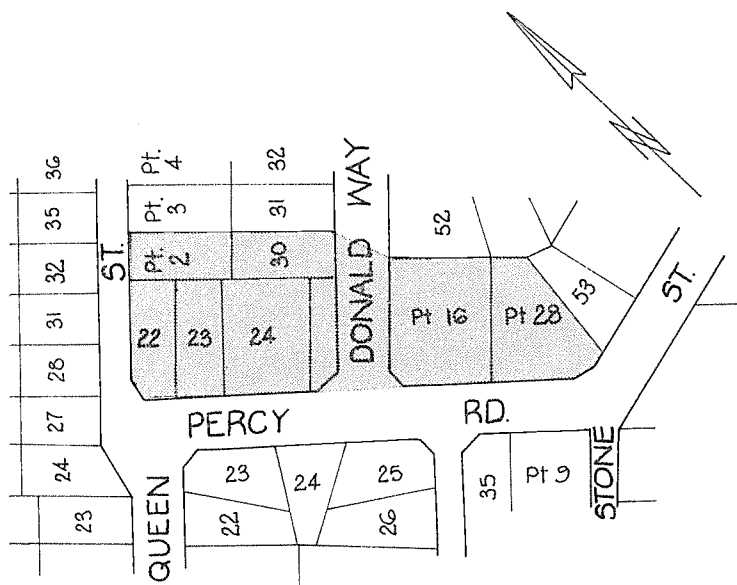

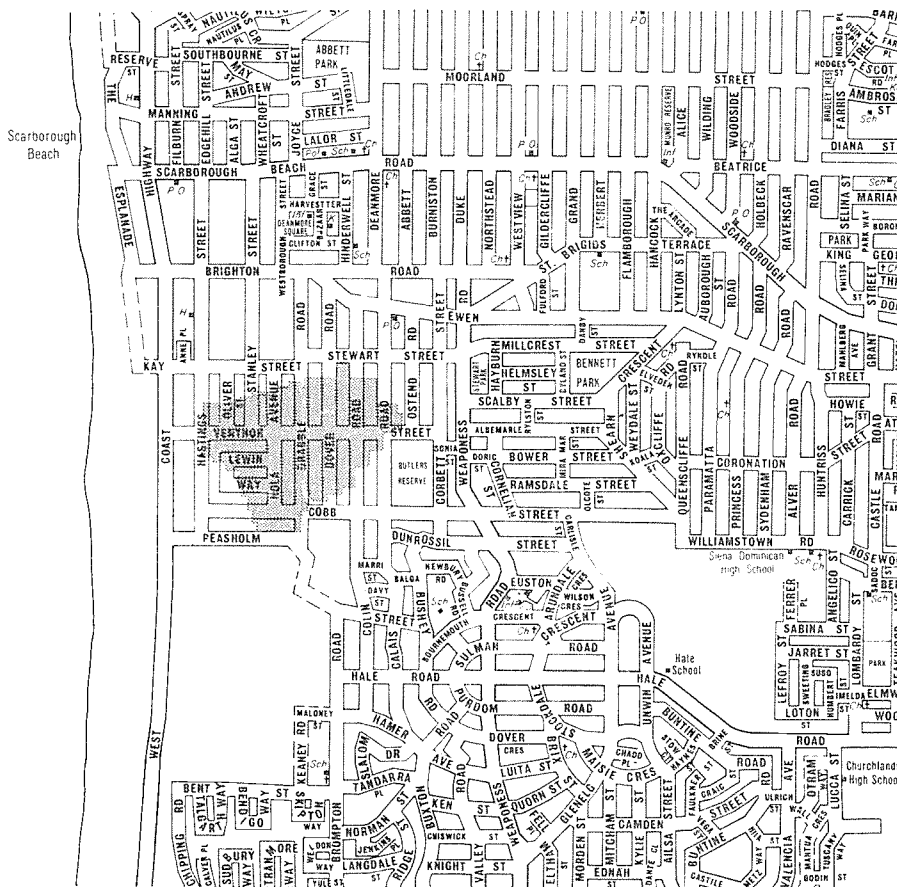

- (1) That the period from five o'clock in the forenoon of January 1, 1972, until seven o'clock in the afternoon of December 31, 1972, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto in those parts of the State

- (4) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg or any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture or for the purpose of sale.
- (5) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (6) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms and Guns Act, 1931, and having a calibre of less than thirty-one fortieths of an inch in internal diameter (ten gauge) provided that this restriction shall not prohibit a person who is a native within the meaning of the Native Welfare Act, 1905, from using any native artifact in the taking of wild ducks.
- (7) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks from any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand.
- (8) That a person shall not take or attempt to take more than ten wild ducks in any one day of the open season.
- (9) That a person shall not have under his control or in his possession or keep in any cool store or any freezing chamber or other premises at any one time—
 - (a) on opening day more than ten wild ducks;
 - (b) on any day other than opening day of the open season, more than twenty wild ducks.

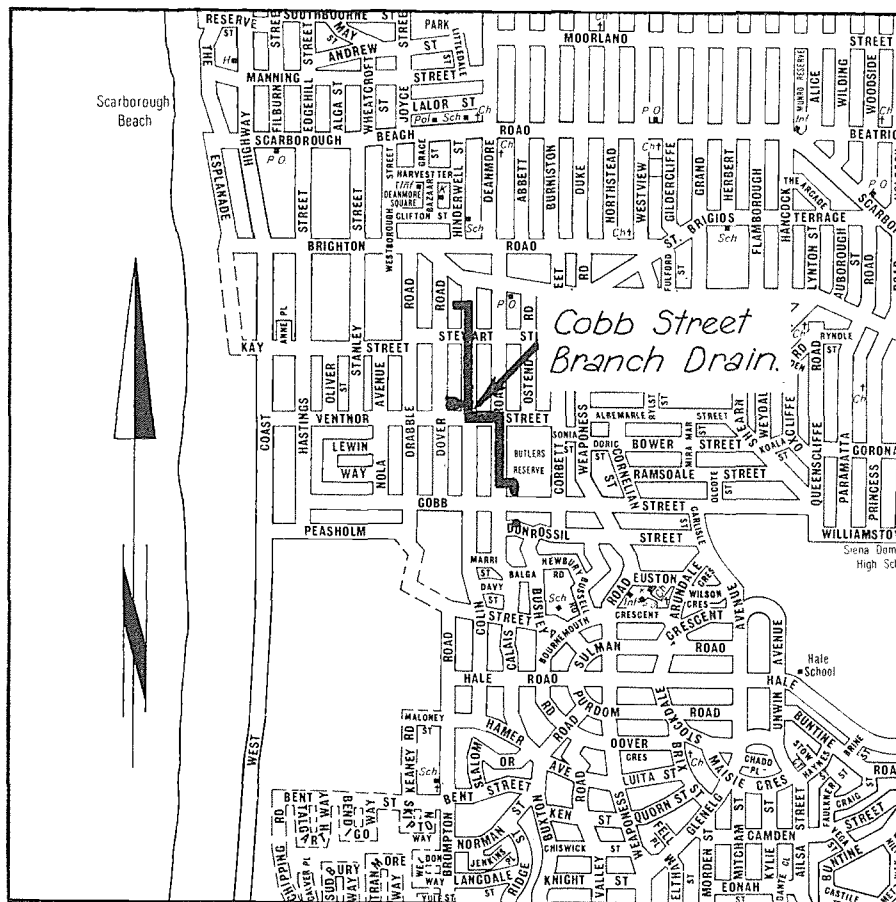
