WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*), by subsection (2) of section six in Part II of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1963-1965, that where the Governor is satisfied that, if the benefits conferred by that Part are extended to judgments given in the superior Courts of any Commonwealth country, or given in the superior Courts of any foreign country, substantial reciprocity of treatment will be assured as respects the enforcement within that Commonwealth country or in that foreign country, as the case

Regulations.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations, the regulations made under the provisions of the Mining Act, 1904, as reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th January, 1969, as amended by notices published from time to time in the *Government Gazette*, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st January, 1972.
- Schedule amended. 3. Form No. 57 in the Schedule of Forms and Fees to the principal regulations is amended as to the items and charges under the heading Rents and Royalties by substituting for the charge of "\$0.50", shown in relation to the item "Mining lease", the charge of "\$2.00", and by deleting the references in that item to rentals under section 49.

MINING ACT, 1904-1971.

Iron Ore Reserves.

1. Applications are invited for rights of occupancy for iron ore over the land temporarily reserved from occupation pursuant to the provisions of section 276 of the Mining Act, 1904-1971, and contained in the reserves specified in the schedule hereto.

2. In respect of reserves that are grouped with brackets in the schedule, applications may be made for such reserves either separately or in the specified groups.

3. Details of the locations of the reserves and the conditions under which rights of occupancy may be granted are available for inspection on the 1st Floor of the Mines Department, Mineral House, 66 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3.30 p.m.

4. Applications are also invited for rights of occupancy for iron ore over existing Crown land north of the 26° South parallel of latitude, such land to be temporarily reserved from occupation pursuant to the provisions of section 276 of the Mining Act, 1904-1971. 5. Subject to the provisions of sections 276 and 277 of the Mining Act, 1904-1971, the Minister may authorise any person to temporarily occupy all or any of the reserves in the schedule hereto, and the land to be reserved from occupation referred to in paragraph 4 herein. Rights of occupancy will not necessarily be granted in respect of any of the specified reserves or the land referred to in paragraph 4.

6. Successful applicants will be granted occupancy rights for a period of one year. Applications for renewal of rights of occupancy may be considered in the light of the past performance of the applicant on the reserve in question and will be subject to the provisions of section 277 of the Mining Act, 1904-1971.

7. It is anticipated that a new Mining Bill will be introduced into the Parliament of Western Australia during 1972 and that it will contain transitional provisions which will enable holders of rights of occupancy of temporary reserves whose performance in respect of such reserves is satisfactory to take advantage of the benefits of the new legislation.

8. All applications should reach the Under Secretary for Mines, 66 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, by 18th February, 1972, and should incorporate full details of proposed exploration programmes, including expenditure, and of the relationship of those programmes to present mining operations, where appropriate.
