THE City of Perth under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended), and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of:—

- (a) enabling the comprehensive redevelopment of the land within the Scheme area;

- (b) Portion of Perth Town Lot G6 and being the whole of the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1351 Folio 164;
- (c) Portion of Perth Town Lot G7 and being the whole of the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1429 Folio 653;
- (d) The portion of Perth Town Lot G7 the subject of Diagram 411 and being the whole of the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1340 Folio 868;

## Part III—Development.

3.1. (a) In this Scheme:—

"gross total floor area" means the floor area of a building calculated in the manner prescribed by the provisions of any Town Planning Scheme, by-law, order or regulation applying from time to time to the Scheme Area for the purpose of ascertaining the permissible plot ratio;

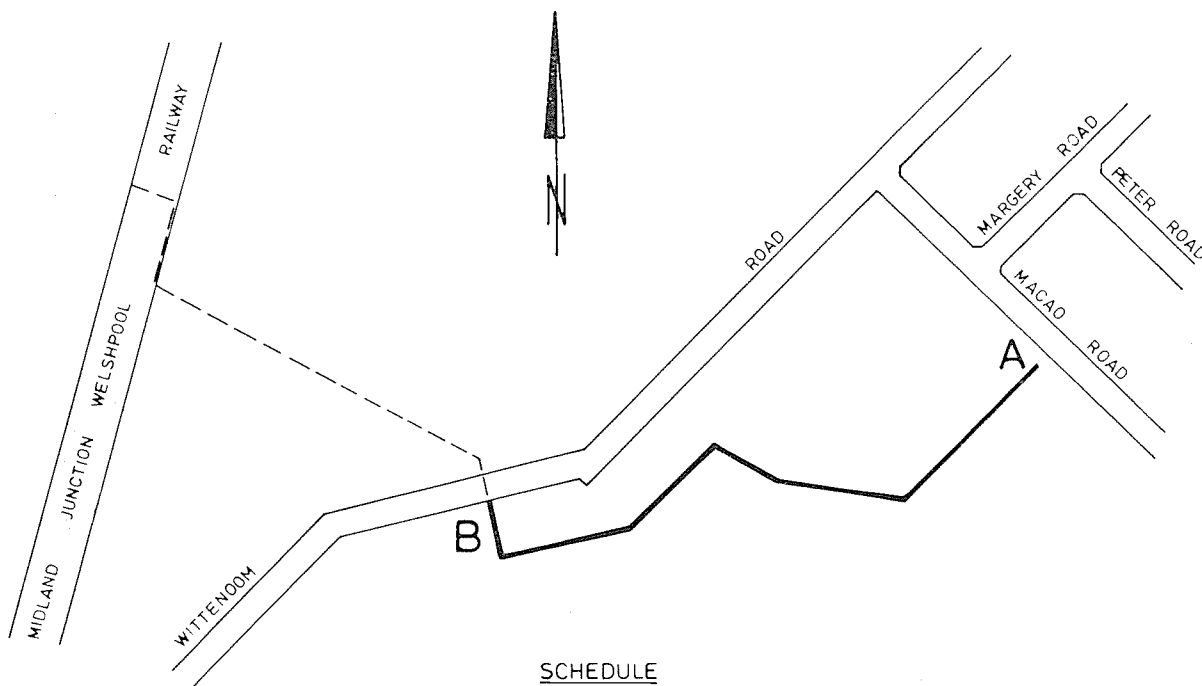

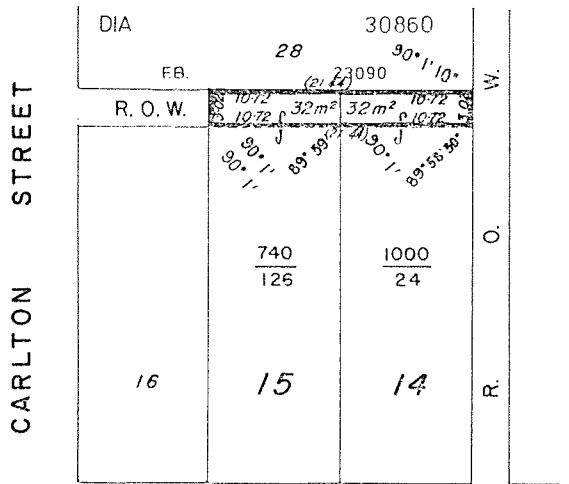

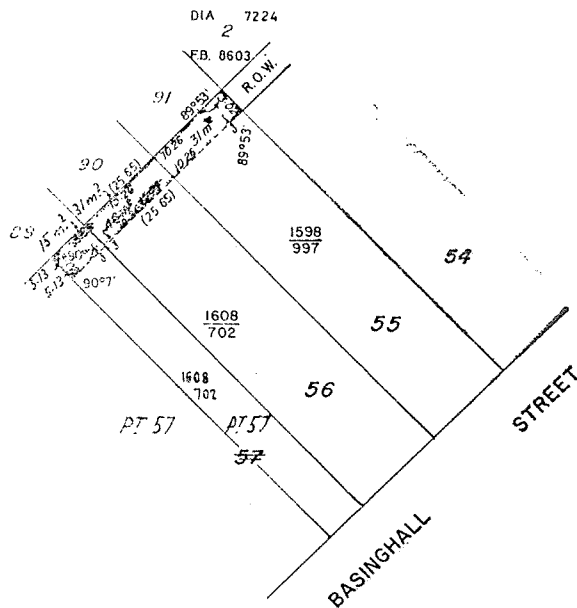
