HEALTH (DISPOSAL OF LIQUID WASTE) REGULATIONS 1983.

MADE by the Lieutenant Governor, and Deputy of the Governor in Executive Council under sections 134 (53) and 343 (5).

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Health (Disposal of Liquid Waste) Regulations 1983.

Application. 2. These regulations shall apply to the districts specified in Schedule 1 to these regulations.

ment. 3. These regulations shall come into operation 28 days after the day on which they are published in the *Government Gazette*.

tion. 4. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—
“contractor” means a person who has notified the Commissioner of his intention to undertake for reward the collection of transport of liquid waste pursuant to regulation 5;
“liquid waste” has the meaning conferred on “sewage” in the Act;
“person” includes a company or partnership;
“regulation” means one of these regulations;
“Schedule” means a schedule to these regulations;
“sullage” means liquid waste from bathrooms, laundries and kitchens including floor wastes from those sources;
“the Act” means the Health Act 1911.

notified. 5. A person shall not undertake for reward the collection or transport of liquid waste unless he has notified the Commissioner in writing of his intention and of the address of the premises from which he will operate.

in writing. 6. (1) The Commissioner may, by notice in writing, direct a contractor to comply with such conditions relating to that collection or transport as may be specified in the notice, and may in like manner vary or revoke the terms of any such notice.

(2) The Commissioner may, where he considers that a contractor is not a fit and proper person to collect and transport liquid waste, on any grounds relating to the collection, transport and disposal of liquid waste including a conviction under section 98 of the Act or the regulations, direct that contractor by notice in writing not to collect or transport liquid waste, either indefinitely or for such period as is specified in the notice.

(3) A contractor shall comply with any notice, condition or direction received from the Commissioner under this regulation.

Liquid waste
to be taken
to certain
sites. 7. (1) A person who collects liquid waste from any premises shall transport that liquid waste to one of the appropriate sites specified in Schedule 2, except where approval or direction of the Commissioner has been given for the liquid waste to be transported to some other site.

(2) A person shall not deposit liquid wastes of the categories set out in Schedule 3 at any site other than a site referred to in item 1 of Schedule 2.

(3) A person shall not deposit liquid waste of the categories set out in Schedule 4, at any site other than a site referred to in item 2 of Schedule 2.

Certain
wastes not
compatible. 8. A person shall not transport in a vehicle at any one time any liquid waste set out in Schedule 4 until he has ensured, (by consultation with the Public Health Department if he is in doubt,) that the liquid wastes to be mixed are compatible.

- Vehicle to be marked. 9. Where a contractor operates a number of vehicles to collect or transport liquid waste he shall cause each of those vehicles to be marked with a distinguishing number (in arithmetical progression) conspicuously displayed on both sides and following the term "No.", together with the name of the contractor operating the vehicle, all being in lettering of not less than 150 mm in height.
- Vehicles to be sound. 10. A contractor operating a vehicle used for the collection or transport of liquid waste shall ensure that it is of sound construction and kept in good repair and constructed and used in such a manner as to prevent the spillage of liquid waste or the emission of fumes or effluvia from the vehicle.
- Requirement relating to certain wastes. 11. A person proposing to have liquid waste, other than liquid waste from—
 (a) septic tanks;
 (b) sullage systems;
 (c) grease traps; or
 (d) oil trap waste of a quantity less than 500 litres,
 removed from premises, shall—
 (e) before the first occasion of such removal, after the coming into operation of these regulations, notify the Commissioner of his name and the address of the premises from which the liquid waste will be removed;
 (f) ensure that any liquid waste is in a suitable condition to be transported in accordance with guidelines issued by the Commissioner; and
 (g) comply with any directions of the Commissioner in relation to the removal of the liquid waste.
- Statement of, and receipt for, liquid waste. 12. (1) Before any liquid waste of the type referred to in regulation 11 is removed from premises, the person arranging the removal shall provide the driver of the vehicle to be used in the disposal of the liquid waste, with a written statement in a form approved by the Commissioner, detailing the name and address of the producer of the liquid waste, the nature of the liquid waste and its category number, determined from the categories set out in Schedule 3 and certifying to the correctness of this information to the best of his knowledge.
 (2) The driver of the vehicle referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation shall give a receipt for the liquid waste, to the person arranging the removal, in a form approved by the Commissioner.
- Statement to be given to site attendant. 13. (1) Before discharging liquid waste in accordance with regulation 7, the driver of a liquid waste disposal vehicle shall provide the attendant in charge of the disposal site with a written statement in a form approved by the Commissioner, detailing the names and addresses of the producers of the liquid waste, the nature of the liquid waste and its category numbers, determined from the categories set out in Schedule 3.
 (2) The attendant in charge of any site specified in Schedule 2 shall on receipt of the forms referred to in regulations 12 or 13, determine that the categories of liquid waste referred to therein are of the categories allowed to be discharged at that site, as specified in Schedule 2, and shall sign a form for receipt of the liquid waste approved by the Commissioner and return a copy of the form to the driver of the vehicle and shall then direct the discharge of the liquid waste into a receptacle or part of the site approved for that purpose by the Commissioner.
- Use of liquid waste vehicle. 14. A person shall not transport any material other than liquid waste in a vehicle which has been used for the transport of liquid waste except with the approval of the Commissioner.
- Persons not to make untrue statements. 15. A person shall not make any untrue or misleading statement or provide incorrect details in any form or written statement required by these regulations.
- Offences. 16. A person who does any act, prohibited from being done, or fails to do any act required to be done by these regulations commits an offence.
 Penalty: \$200 plus a daily penalty, if applicable, of \$4.
