PURSUANT to section 9 of the Marine and Harbours Act 1981, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the proclamation published under that Act in the *Government Gazette* on 5 February 1982 and varied by proclamations so published on 19 February 1982 and 21 May 1982 by deleting PARTS A and B of the description of the Fremantle Boat Harbour as set out in the Schedule to that proclamation as so varied and substituting the following PARTS—

“ PART A.  
 All that portion of land and sea bed shown bordered in red on Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Plan 1206.

PART B.  
 All that portion of land being Fremantle Lots 1996 and 1997 as shown surveyed on Lands and Surveys Plan 15338. ”

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1974-1982.

## ROAD TRAFFIC CODE AMENDMENT 1983.

MADE by the Lieutenant Governor, and Deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic Code Amendment 1983.

Reg. 1607A inserted. 2. After regulation 1607 of the Road Traffic Code 1975\* as amended, the following regulation is inserted—

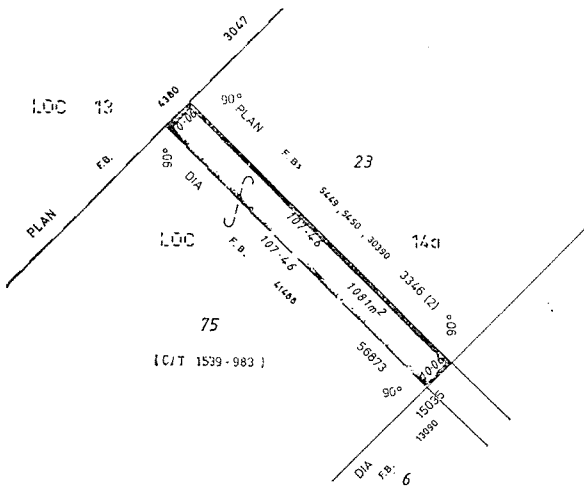

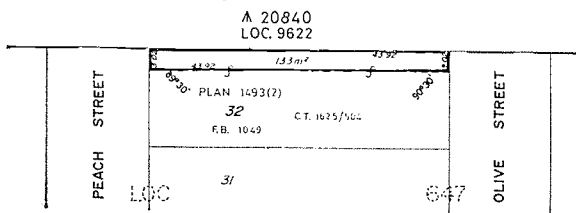

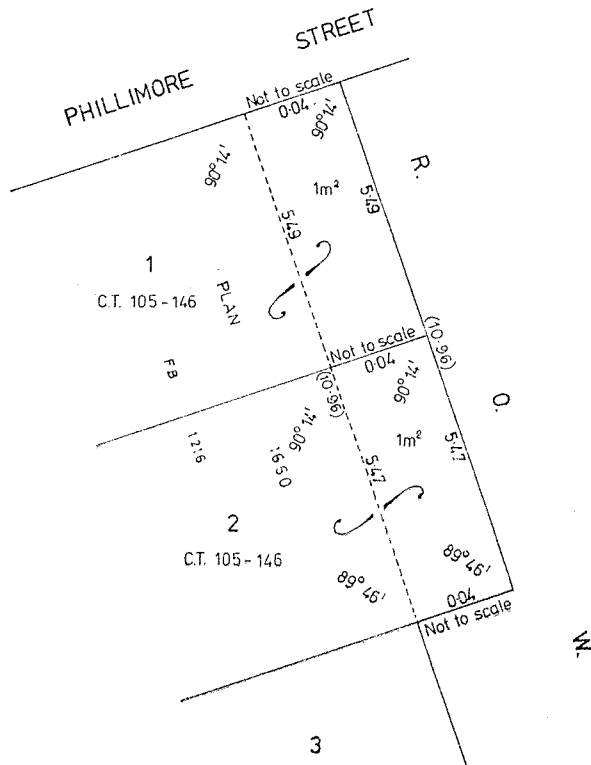
