BARRISTERS' BOARD AMENDMENT RULES 1983.

MADE by the Barristers' Board under section 6.

- Citation. 1. (1) These rules may be cited as the Barristers' Board Amendment Rules 1983.
(2) In these rules the Rules of the Barristers' Board*, as amended, are referred to as the principal rules.
- Rule 4 amended. 2. Rule 4 of the principal rules is amended by deleting "seven" and adding at the end of the rule the following:—
"Except where the first Tuesday in the month of April in a year is a day when the offices of the Supreme Court are not open, in which case the annual election shall be held on the second Tuesday in the month of April".
- Rule 7 amended. 3. Rule 7 of the principal rules is amended by deleting—
"In such event it shall not be necessary to hold the meeting referred to in rule 8 (d)".
- Rule 8 amended. 4. Rule 8 of the principal rules is amended—
(a) by deleting subrule (1) and substituting the following subrule—
" (1) If there are more candidates than the number of vacancies, the method of election shall be as follows—
(a) the Secretary shall at least 10 days before the day of the election send to each practitioner entitled to vote a ballot paper initialled by him containing the names of all candidates set out in the order determined by lot by the Secretary and indicating by means of an asterisk those candidates who are retiring members;
(b) practitioners desirous of voting shall leave the names of all candidates for whom they desire to vote intact and score through the remaining names with a pen or pencil and shall return the ballot paper to the Secretary in an envelope sealed and endorsed "Ballot Paper" so as to reach the Secretary not later than 12 o'clock noon on the date of the election;
(c) no practitioner shall vote more than once in any election. " ;
(b) in subrule (3), by deleting "the seven candidates in favour of whom the largest number of votes have been cast and declare those seven candidates elected" and substituting the following—
" with respect to the number of vacancies the candidates in favour of whom the largest number of votes have been cast and declare those candidates elected " ; and
(c) in subrule (4), by deleting "seven" and substituting the following—
" with respect to the number of vacancies the "

- Rule 19 amended. 5. Rule 19 of the principal rules is amended by deleting paragraph (c).
- 6. Rule 28 of the principal rules is repealed and the following rule is substituted:—
 “ 28. For the purposes of section 15 subsection (2) (a) of the Act examinations are prescribed in the following subjects, viz:—
 Practice and procedure.
 Conveyancing.
 Accounts.
 Law Practice and Office Organisation.
 One subject in law (which may comprise 2 half units) chosen in consultation with the Dean of the Law School of the University of Western Australia and with the approval of the Board from those subjects offered at the Law School towards the degree of Bachelor of Jurisprudence.
 The above examinations shall collectively constitute the “Practice Examination”.
 Subject to Rule 31 (ii) every Articled Clerk while articled shall attend at the University of Western Australia the lectures provided in those subjects and pass the Practice Examination. ”

- Rule 39 amended. 8. Rule 39 of the principal rules is amended by deleting paragraph (c).
- Rule 61 amended. 9. Rule 61 of the principal rules is amended by deleting “in writing” and substituting the following—

- Rules 63 and 64 repealed and rule 63 substituted. 10. Rules 63 and 64 of the principal rules are repealed and the following rule is substituted—
 “ 63. If any of the particulars furnished by a practitioner in an application for a practice certificate ceases to be true and accurate at any time before the practice certificate issued with respect to that application expires, the practitioner shall notify the Secretary immediately of the changed particulars and the Secretary shall amend the register kept under this Part accordingly. ”

CITY OF PERTH PARKING FACILITIES ACT 1956 AND AMENDMENTS.

By-law No. 60—Care, Control and Management of Parking Facilities.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 13 December 1982 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendments to By-law No. 60:—

1. That a new Clause be added after Clause 28A as follows:—

“ 28B (1) A person shall not enter a parking station without first obtaining the permission of an inspector on duty in that station unless that person is:—

- (a) employed at the parking station and is in the course of his duties;
- (b) a police officer and is in the course of his duties;
- (c) driving a vehicle into the parking station or coming to the parking station to remove a vehicle from the parking station;
- (d) a passenger in a vehicle entering the parking station or is a person intending to leave the parking station as a passenger in a vehicle.

(2) A person who enters a parking station in breach of subclause (1) of this clause shall not remain in that station after having been required to leave the station by an inspector.

(3) A person shall not loiter in any part of a parking station. ”

2. That Clause 60 be amended by deleting subclauses (i) and (iii) and substituting therefor the following:—

“ (i) in the case of an offence under Clause—

13, 28B (1), 30 (i), 30 (ii), 32, 33 (i), 33 (iii), 34 (i), 34 (ii), 34 (iii), 36, 37, 39 (i), 39 (iii), 39 (v) 40 and 41—Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00). ”

“ (iii) in the case of an offence under Clause 28B (2), 39 (ii), 39 (iv), 43 and 58A—Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00). ”

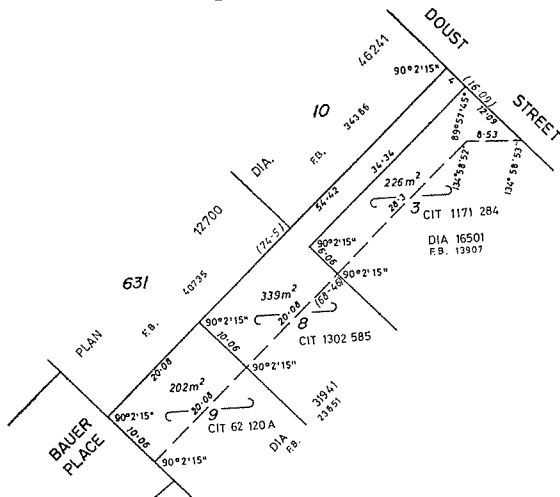

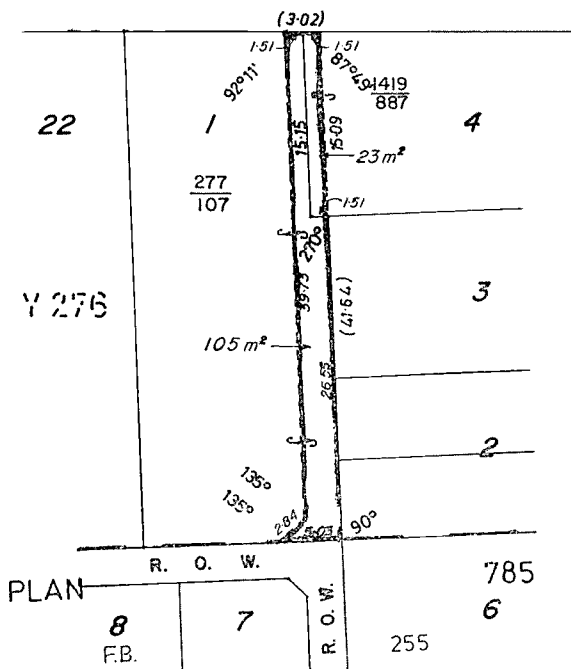

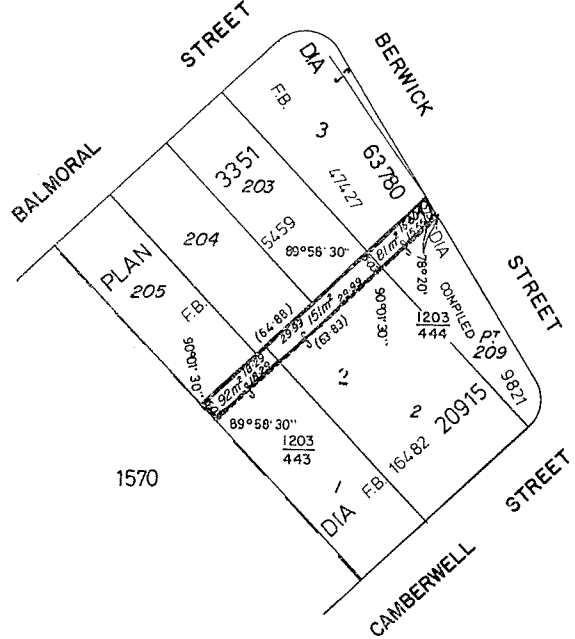

VINCENT STREET



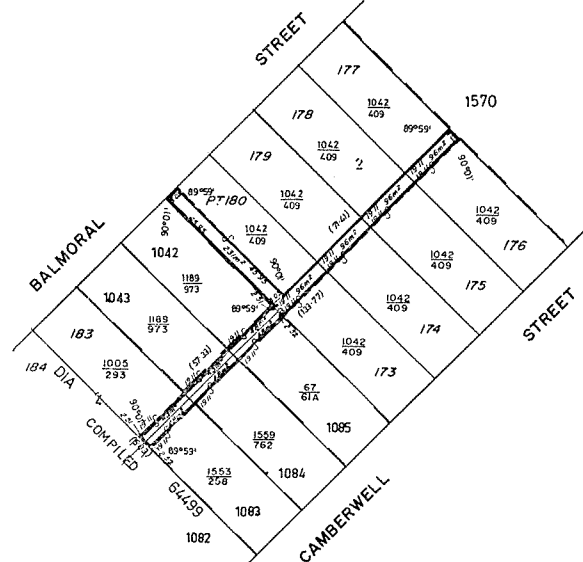

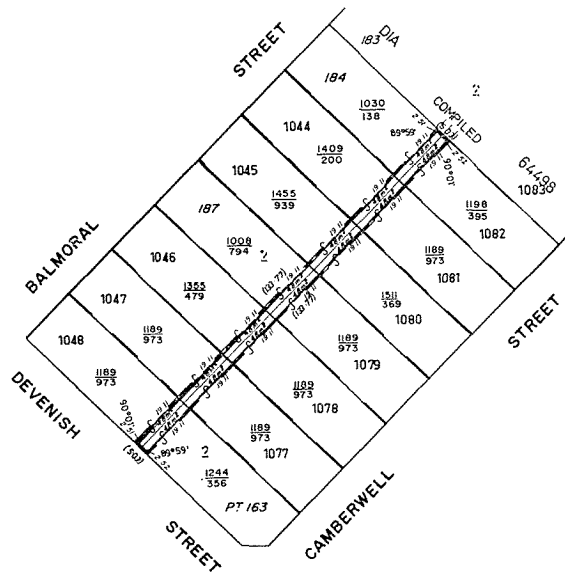

Fencing By-Laws.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 9 November, 1982, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:

1. All previous By-laws relating to fencing published in the *Government Gazette* of 2 April 1968, and 8 August 1975, are hereby repealed.

2. In these By-laws—

"Building Surveyor" means a Building Surveyor of the Municipality of the Shire of Rockingham;

"Business Zone" means any area so zoned under the provisions of the Town Planning Scheme of the Shire of Rockingham for the time being in force under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 as amended;

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Rockingham;

"Dangerous" in relation to a fence means a fence carrying or designed to carry an electric charge or a fence containing exposed broken glass or any other harmful projection or material and includes a fence which through lack of maintenance or repair becomes a dangerous fence but does not include a fence in an Industrial Zone having barbed wire as its only harmful material where such barbed wire is not less than 1 800 mm in height at any point;

"District" means the municipal district of the Shire of Rockingham;

"dividing fence" means a fence that separates adjoining lots of different owners whether the fence is on the common boundary of those lots or on a line other than the common boundary;

"height" in relation to a fence means the distance between the top of a fence at any point and the ground immediately below that point;

"Industrial Zone" means any part of the District, classified as an Industrial Zone under the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme published in the *Government Gazette* of 9 August 1963 as amended from time to time;

"lot" means a lot as defined by section 2 of the Town Planning and Development Act 1980 as amended;

"Residential Zone" means any part of the District, classified as an Urban Zone under the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme published in the *Government Gazette* of 9 August 1963 as amended from time to time;

"Rural Zone" means any part of the District, classified as a Rural Zone under the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme published in the *Government Gazette* of 9 August 1963 as amended from time to time except those portions of those parts of the District that are areas gazetted as Singleton and Peelhurst Townsites that are not zoned residential;

"Special Rural Zone" means any part of the District, classified as a Special Rural Zone under the provisions of the Town Planning Scheme.

3. (1) Subject to sub-bylaw (2) of this By-law, for the purposes of the Dividing Fences Act 1961 (as amended) "a sufficient fence"—

- (a) in a Residential Zone is a dividing fence constructed in accordance with the minimum specifications and requirements set out in the First Schedule hereto;
- (b) in an Industrial Zone is a dividing fence constructed in accordance with the minimum specifications and requirements set out in the Second Schedule hereto;
- (c) in a Rural Zone or in a Special Rural Zone is a dividing fence constructed in accordance with the minimum specifications and requirements set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

(2) Where adjoining lots are in different Zones:

- (a) and one of those lots is in a Residential Zone a sufficient fence is a dividing fence between those lots constructed in accordance with the specifications and requirements set out in the First Schedule hereto whether or not that fence is constructed on the lot within the Residential Zone;
- (b) and neither of those lots is in a Residential Zone, a sufficient fence is a dividing fence between those lots constructed in accordance with the requirements and specifications set out in either the First Schedule, the Second Schedule or the Third Schedule hereto, as the Council may in each case determine.

(4) A person shall not erect a fence between the building line and the front boundary of a lot unless the fence complies with the following specifications:

- (a) the fence is not higher than 1.8 m at any point; and
- (b) for at least 25% of its length the fence is not closer than 450 mm to the front boundary.

5. In a Residential Zone where a vehicle driveway or other accessway to a street exceeding 1.5 m in width meets a street alignment, a fence shall not be erected in the area enclosed by:

- (a) a line drawn at an angle of 45° to the street alignment from a point on that alignment 2 m from the driveway or accessway;
- (b) the edge of the driveway or accessway first intercepted by that line; and
- (c) the street alignment from that edge to the point referred to in paragraph (a).

6. (1) This By-law applies to land in a Residential Zone.

(2) Subject to sub-bylaw (3) of this By-law, where land has boundaries on intersecting streets a person shall not construct a fence abutting on any of those boundaries in excess of

- (a) .75 m in height for the first 6 m of its length from the point at which the street alignments intersect; or
- (b) .75 m in height at any point if there is a building on the land facing one of those streets.

(3) Where the intersection of the two streets has been truncated the distance of 6 m referred to in paragraph (a) of subclause (2) of this By-law shall be measured from the point where the line of truncation meets the boundary of the land on which the fence is erected.

7. A person shall not construct a fence which is not a dividing fence unless that fence complies with the minimum specifications prescribed by these by-laws for a sufficient fence in the Zone in which that fence is to be constructed.

8. Where any part of a fence is within 7.5 m of a street, the owner and occupier of the land on which that fence is erected shall maintain that fence in good and substantial repair, order and condition and shall ensure that the fence does not become dangerous, dilapidated or unsightly.

9. A person shall not construct a fence which exceeds the minimum specifications prescribed by these by-laws with respect to that fence if the Council is of the opinion that a fence constructed in excess of those specifications on that land would have an adverse effect on the safety, convenience or use of any other land or the safety or convenience of any person.

10. Without the prior written approval of the Council, a person shall not construct or repair a fence with second-hand materials.

11. A person shall not use corrugated galvanised iron or flat iron in the construction or the repair of any fence.

12. Except in a Rural Zone, a person shall not use or retain barbed wire in a fence below a height of 1.8 m from the ground.

13. Without the prior written approval of the Council, a person shall not construct or retain a dividing fence as a retaining wall.

14. If, in the opinion, of the Building Surveyor, any fence is in a state of disrepair or is not in good order or condition or is dangerous, dilapidated or unsightly or the fence has been constructed or retained in breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws, the Council may give written notice to the owner or occupier of the land upon which that fence is erected requiring the owner or occupier to repair, restore to good order and condition, make safe or otherwise bring that fence into compliance with the requirements of these By-laws within such time as the Council stipulates in the notice.

15. Where the owner or occupier of land to whom a notice under By-law 14 of these By-laws has been given does not comply with the requirements of that notice within the time specified therein, the Council may, by its servants, agents or contractors with or without vehicles, plant, equipment and materials, enter upon the land on which the fence is erected and any other land in respect of which the fence is a dividing fence for the purpose of carrying out the requirements specified in the notice. The Council may recover in a Court of Competent Jurisdiction from the owner of the fence the costs and expenses incurred by the Council in carrying out those requirements.

16. A person shall not commence to construct a fence or alter, enlarge or change the materials comprised in or the structure of a fence without first giving to the Council in writing full particulars of the fence, alteration enlargement or change sufficient to enable the Council to determine whether the provision of these By-laws will be complied with.

17. Any person who fails to comply with any provisions of these By-laws commits an offence and shall be liable on conviction to:

- (a) a maximum penalty of \$500;
- (b) an additional penalty of \$50 for each day during which the offence continues.

First Schedule.

Fences in Residential Zones.

- (a) A fence along a side boundary—

For a distance of 7.5 m from the street alignment the fence shall be constructed of:

- (i) brick or concrete;
- (ii) chain link wire mesh;
- (iii) stone;
- (iv) timber; or
- (v) other materials approved by the Council of any combination thereof.

Subject to the foregoing—

A free-standing fibrous cement fence shall be bolted and capped. The fence shall be sunk into the ground to a depth of at least 300 mm or to a depth equal to at least 25 per cent of the length of a sheet of the fibrous cement whichever is greater and otherwise in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.

If other than a free-standing fibrous cement fence it shall comply with the following requirements:

Front corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 1.8 m and rear corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 2.1 m and intermediate posts shall be 125 mm x 75 mm x 2.1 m spaced at not more than 2.7 m centres.

All posts shall have tops of 51 mm weather and shall be sunk at least 600 mm into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm soled and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 150 mm x 25 mm x 250 mm struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows or rails.

Rails shall be 75 mm x 50 mm each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

A fence other than of brick or concrete shall be covered for the first 7.5 m from the street alignment with chain wire mesh or other approved materials and for the next bay by 75 mm x 18 mm sawn pickets or palings of graduated length rising from 1 050 mm to 1.8 m.

Thereafter the fence shall be completely covered with 75 mm x 18 mm x 1.8 m sawn pickets or palings or other approved materials.

All pickets or palings shall be double yankee nailed to each rail.

Schedule—*continued*.

(b) A fence along a rear boundary—

Corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 2.1 m and intermediate posts shall be 125 mm x 75 mm x 2.1 m spaced at not more than 2.7 m centres.

All posts shall have tops with 37 mm weather and shall be sunk at least 600 mm into the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm soles and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee strutted with 150 mm x 25 mm x 450 mm struts.

Posts shall be 75 mm x 50 mm each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

Fence shall be completely covered with 75 mm x 18 mm x 1.8 m sawn pickets or palings double nailed to each rail or other approved materials.

(c) Where all or portion of the side boundary of one lot forms all or portion of the rear boundary of another lot, the provisions relating to rear boundaries shall apply to that portion of that side boundary as so comprises such rear boundary unless otherwise prohibited by these By-laws.

Second Schedule.

Industrial Zones.

A fence consisting of chain link mesh to a height of 1.8 m on top of which are three strands of barbed wire carrying the fence to a total height of not more than 2.1 m supported by galvanised iron or concrete posts of not less than 30 mm diameter spaced at not less than 3 m centres and sunk into concrete in the ground to a depth of at not less than 600 mm with the concrete having a minimum diameter of 150 mm.

Third Schedule.

Rural Zones and Special Rural Zones.

The fence shall be erected from posts set not less than 600 mm in the ground and not less than 1.2 m out of the ground and spaced not more than 4.5 m apart with strainer posts set 1 050 mm in the ground and suitably and securely strutted at all corners, gateways and fence line angles but not exceeding 200 m apart. Each fence post shall have not less than five 12 mm suitably spaced holes, to be threaded with not less than five plain galvanised wires. Wire shall be wrapped around strainer and strained tight.

The fence shall not exceed 1.5 m in height at any point within 7.5 m of a street.

The following materials shall be used:—

- (a) Wire—shall be high tensile wire and not less than 2.642 mm diameter (12 gauge).
- (b) Posts—
 - (i) if of timber, to be cut not less than 1.8 m long by 100 mm diameter at small end if round or 125 mm x 62 mm if split or sawn.
 - (ii) if of iron, steel or concrete, the posts shall be not less than 1.5 m in length.
- (c) Strainer Posts—not less than 2.25 m long and 150 mm diameter at small end shall be cut from timber.
- (d) Barbed wire may be affixed along the fence as follows:—
 - (i) in the case of a fence accessible to the public on the inside of the fence;

Municipality of the Shire of Toodyay.

By-laws Relating to Stalls.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 19 October 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by His Excellency the Governor, the following By-laws:—

1. In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the meanings set out against them hereunder respectively—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Toodyay.

“District” means the municipal district of the Shire of Toodyay.

“Clerk” means the Shire Clerk or the person acting for the time being in that position.

“Licence” means a stall holder’s Licence issued pursuant to these By-laws.

“Licensee” means a person to whom a Licence is granted under these By-laws.

“Stall” means a movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of goods, wares merchandise or services.

“Stall Holder” means a person in charge of a stall.

“Voluntary Organisation” means a charitable benevolent religious literary cultural recreational sporting or other voluntary institution association club society or body whether incorporated or not whose members are not entitled nor permitted to receive any profit pecuniary or otherwise from the transactions thereof.

2. A person shall not set up or conduct a stall in on or near any street or way within the District unless he is the holder of a current licence issued to him by the Council in accordance with these By-laws.

3. A person who desires to obtain a licence to set up and conduct business at a stall shall make application in writing to Council in the form of Form 1 as set out in the First Schedule of these By-laws.

- 4. A licence shall:—
 - (a) state the type of goods or services which are authorised to be sold at the stall;
 - (b) specify the size of the stall;
 - (c) specify the date and times the stall may be set up;
 - (d) specify the place in which the stall may be set up;
 - (e) specify the conditions (if any) on which the licence is issued;
 - (f) be in the form of Form 2 as set out in the First Schedule of these By-laws.
- 5. Unless otherwise specified, a licence granted by the Council shall remain valid until the 31st day of December next after the issue thereof unless previously revoked.
- 6. A licence shall not be transferable.
- 7. A stall licence fee shall be as prescribed in the Second Schedule to these By-laws and shall be paid by the Licensee prior to the issue to him of a licence.
- 8. The Council may revoke a licence on any of the following grounds:—
 - (a) that the stall holder has committed a breach of these By-laws;
 - (b) that the stall holder has committed a breach of any condition on which the licence held by him was issued;
 - (c) that the stall holder has engaged in dishonest practices in or on respect of the sale of goods at the stall;
 - (d) that the stall holder is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
 - (e) that the stall holder has transferred the licence issued to him or does not himself carry on the business.
- 9. No person shall set up or conduct a business at a stall:—
 - (a) except at the place specified in the licence issued to him; or
 - (b) in a street way footpath or other public place or within 20 metres thereof or at a distance nearer than 5 metres to another stall set up in the street way or footpath or other public place.
- 10. A stall holder shall not:—
 - (a) conduct business at a stall except between the hours specified in the licence;
 - (b) deposit any box basket or receptacle (except a receptacle for litter) outside his stall;
 - (c) make any noise or disturbance to the annoyance of neighbouring residents or passers by;
 - (d) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway;
 - (e) act in an offensive manner.
- 11. A stall holder shall carry his licence with him and produce it upon demand to an Officer or employee of the Council.
- 12. A stall holder shall have his name legibly displayed on every stall operated by him.
- 13. A person who commits an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a maximum penalty of \$200 and to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20 per day.

By-law Relating to Standing Orders.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all the other powers enabling it the Council of the Shire of Wanneroo hereby records having resolved on 22 September 1982, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendments to its By-law relating to Standing Orders as published in the *Government Gazette* on 11 November 1977 and amended from time to time.

1. Clause 2. Include after the interpretation "Council" the following interpretations:—

"Management Executive" means the Committee of senior officers of Council comprising the Shire Clerk, Director of Financial Services, Director of Community Services, Director of Technical Services, Director of Planning Services.

"Policy Manual" means the document in which the policies of Council as resolved from time to time are recorded.

2. Clause 105. Delete the words "Finance Committee" and substitute the words "Finance and Community Services Committee".

3. Clause 115. Delete all of the provisions of the clause after the passage "the Councillors—" and substitute the following:—

- (1) The Finance and Community Services Committee.
- (2) The Technical Services Committee.
- (3) The Town Planning Committee.
- (4) The Policy and Resources Committee.

4. Clause 117. Revoke the entire clause and substitute the following:—

The powers and duties of the Standing Committees shall be as follows:—

The Finance and Community Services Committee.

- (1) To oversee the functions of the Finance and Community Services Divisions.
- (2) To prepare annually the necessary budgets for all funds of the Council for submission to the Policy and Resources Committee.
- (3) To supervise the finances of the Council and to examine and check all accounts and generally supervise the collection and expenditure of Council's revenue.
- (4) To pass all accounts for payment.
- (5) To carry out the duties of the Finance Committee as prescribed in the Local Government Accounting Directions.
- (6) To establish and review from time to time all fees and charges imposed by Council.
- (7) To consider and recommend to Council any requests for allocation of funds for unbudgeted expenditures and expenditures in excess of budget allocations.
- (8) To approve the writing-off of accounts, fines and charges that are irrecoverable.
- (9) To supervise and control the following activities of the Shire—
 - (i) operations of the Administrative Department;
 - (ii) administration of the various Acts, regulations and By-laws, and the provision of services related to community and public health;
 - (iii) provision of facilities and services related to community education and welfare;
 - (iv) provision of library services;
 - (v) provision of facilities and services related to community recreation;
 - (vi) co-ordination of cultural activities within the community including the arts, crafts and related activities;
 - (vii) preservation of sites of historical importance including the operation of museums;
 - (viii) provision of services for suppression of fires in all parts of the Shire district not within the Metropolitan Fire District;
 - (ix) enforcement of those Act, regulations and By-laws delegated by Council to the Security Department;
 - (x) centralised electronic data processing facilities.
- (10) To oversee Council's public relations programme.
- (11) To oversee matters related to the employment of officers, employees, and workmen which impinge upon Council's industrial relations policies.
- (12) To deal with specifications for the calling of tenders for the supply of goods and services required by the Finance and Community Services Divisions and to accept such tenders which are within the appropriate budget allocation and are in accordance with Council's tender policies.
- (13) To consider and recommend to Council, or in relation to major policy the Policy and Resources Committee, such By-laws, amendments to By-laws and amendments to the Policy Manual affecting the operations of the Finance and Community Services Divisions as it considers necessary.
- (14) To receive and deal with petitions, deputations and complaints from ratepayers and residents related to functions of the Council delegated to the Committee.
- (15) To exercise such powers, duties and responsibilities which may from time to time be delegated to the Committee by the Council in the Policy Manual.
- (16) To enquire into and report upon such matters as may be referred to it by Council or other Standing Committees for investigation and report.

Technical Services Committee.

- (1) To oversee the functions of the Technical Services Division.
- (2) (a) To have the general direction of work ordered and sanctioned by the Council, and of the design, construction and maintenance of all streets, roads, ways, drains, bridges, road furniture and other public places under the care, control and management of the Council.
 - (b) To oversee the acquisition of land for the formation of new streets and the widening of existing streets.
 - (c) To have the management and direction of works associated with the protection and preservation of coastal lands and the development of facilities and amenities thereon.
 - (d) To administer the By-laws relating to Extractive Industries No. 9 and to exercise the powers of Council under those By-laws to issue licences and renew licences for extractive industries in the district.
 - (e) To have the management and general direction of all matters relating to traffic management.
 - (f) To supervise the designation and the maintenance of parking controls.
 - (g) To deal with all matters relating to the collection and disposal of refuse.
- (3) (a) To oversee the administration of the Uniform Building By-laws and other By-laws and policies of Council relating to building.
 - (b) To have the general direction of all works on the construction, maintenance and operation of Council buildings.
- (4) (a) To supervise the development and maintenance of all parks, reserves and recreation grounds.
 - (b) To supervise Council's tree planting programme.
- (5) To have the management and general direction for the specification, purchase, maintenance and disposition of all Council mobile plant and vehicles.
- (6) To deal with specifications for the calling of tenders for the supply of materials, goods and services required for Council's works programme and to accept such tenders which are within the appropriate budget allocations and are in accordance with Council's tender policies.
- (7) To deal with specifications for the calling of tenders for building projects, reserves development and the engaging of contractors and consultants required by the Technical Services Division and to accept such tenders which are within the appropriate budget allocations and are in accordance with Council's tender policies.
- (8) To administer Council's By-laws and policies relating to the operations of the Technical Services Division.
- (9) To receive and deal with petitions, deputations and complaints from ratepayers and residents related to functions of the Council delegated to the Committee.
- (10) To exercise such powers, duties and responsibilities which may from time to time be delegated to the Committee by the Council in the policy manual.
- (11) To enquire into and report upon such matters as may be referred to it by Council or other standing Committees for investigation and report.

Town Planning Committee.

- (1) To oversee the functions of the Planning Services Division.
- (2) To generally oversee all development and subdivision within the district to ensure the orderly and proper development and use of land in accordance with the relevant Town Planning Scheme.
- (3) To review periodically Council's gazetted Town Planning Schemes and to recommend to Council amendments thereto or new schemes as considered necessary.
- (4) To oversee and report to Council on all activities under Council's gazetted Town Planning Schemes.
- (5) To exercise the powers, duties and responsibilities of Council in relation to the following matters—
 - (i) to approve all applications to develop received under the provisions of Council's Town Planning Scheme which conform with Council's Town Planning Schemes, By-laws and policy;
 - (ii) to recommend to the Town Planning Board applications for the subdivision of land which conform with the relevant Town Planning Scheme and Council's policy;
 - (iii) such other matters which may from time to time be delegated to the Committee by Council in the Policy Manual.

- (6) To establish the specifications for the calling of tenders for the supply of goods and services required by Planning Services Division and to accept such tenders which are within the appropriate budget allocation and are in accordance with Council's tender policies.
- (7) To receive and deal with petitions, deputations and complaints from ratepayers and residents related to functions of the Council delegated to the Committee.
- (8) To enquire into and report upon such matters as may be referred to it by Council or other Standing Committees for investigation and report.

Policy and Resources Committee.

- (1) To advise Council on the development, implementation and periodic review of its corporate plan.
- (2) To oversee the manpower and physical resources of Council to ensure their effective and efficient strategic utilisation.
- (3) To review proposals from Standing Committees and the Management Executive for the adoption or amendment of major policy.
- (4) To consider applications for and to recommend to Council appointments to senior positions as defined in the Policy Manual.
- (5) To enquire into and report upon such matters as may be referred to it by Council or other Standing Committees for investigation and report.

5. Clause 120A. After Clause 120 add the following Clause 120A—

Any Councillor may attend a meeting of a Committee of which he is not a member but he shall not take part in any of the proceedings of the Committee unless granted permission to do so by the Chairman of that Committee Meeting.
