ACTING pursuant to the powers conferred by Regulation 48A of the Navigable Waters Regulations, the Department of Marine and Harbours, by this notice, revokes subparagraphs (1) (o) (i), (ii) and (iii) of the notice published in the *Government Gazette* edition of 24 December 1982 relating to Canning River water ski areas and substitutes the area set out hereunder therefor provided that this revocation and substitution will apply only for the period 1 April 1983 to 11 April 1983 (inclusive) and that after 11 April 1983 the situation will revert to normal when the water ski areas will be those as gazetted on 24 December 1982.

(o) Canning River:

All the waters of the Canning River between the upstream side of the Mt. Henry Bridge and a line drawn 100 metres downstream and parallel to a line joining Fifth Avenue at Rossmoyné and Salters Point but so that no boat or skier shall approach within 60 metres of the foreshore on the west bank between Mt. Henry Bridge and the junction of Bull Creek, or within 60 metres of the southern foreshore at Rossmoyné between the junction of Bull Creek and the point 100 metres downstream of Fifth Avenue, or within 60 metres of the northern foreshore of Aquinas Bay from the foot of Sulman Avenue to a sign on the foreshore on the eastern side of Mt. Henry.

All water ski-ing in this area shall be in an anti-clockwise direction and no person shall engage in water ski-in except between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and sunset.

It shall also be a condition of water ski-ing in this area that no boat being within 300 metres of Mt. Henry Bridge shall turn across the directional line of traffic.

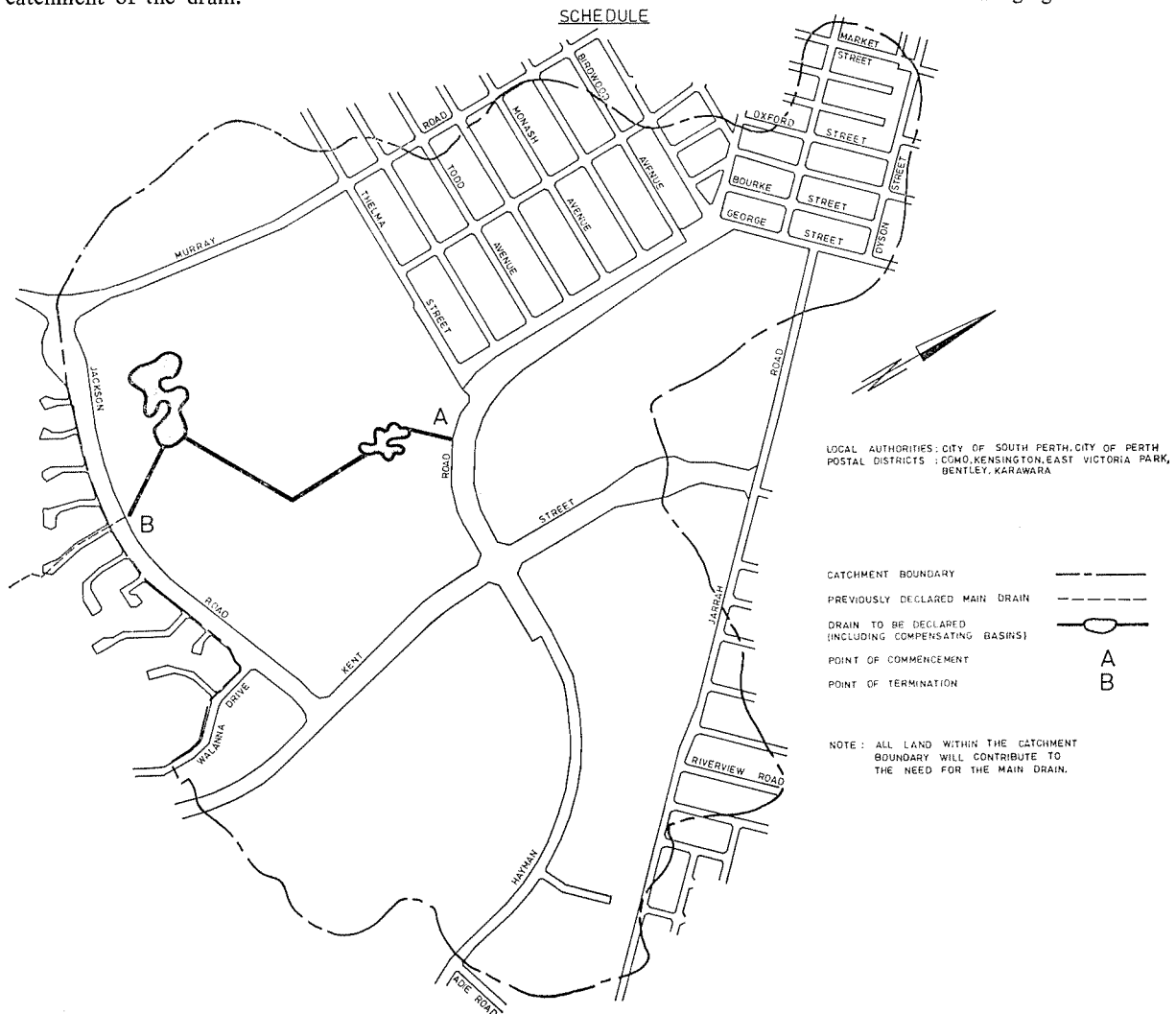
