Local Government Act 1960-1982.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act 1960-1982, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

HOUSING LOAN GUARANTEE ACT 1957-1973.

Declaration Under and Pursuant to section 7F of the Housing Loan Guarantee Act 1957-1973.

I, THE Honourable Brian Thomas Burke, M.L.A., the Treasurer, have been requested under the provisions of section 7F of the Housing Loan Guarantee Act 1957-1973 (in this notice called "the Act") to do so, do by this notice declare the following matters, that is to say—

- (a) the maximum amount which the Treasurer may guarantee under the Act during the period commencing 19 May 1958, and ending 30 June 1984, is the sum of eighty five million dollars (\$85 000 000);
- (b) the maximum amount in respect of which agreements for indemnity may be entered into by the Treasurer during the period commencing 1 January 1962 and ending 30 June 1984, is the sum of seven million dollars (\$7 000 000);
- (c) the maximum rate of interest which an approved institution may charge on a loan to a borrower or on the purchase money to a purchaser in respect of any period whilst an agreement for indemnity is in force in respect of the loan or purchase money, is thirteen and one quarter per centum (13¼%); and
- (d) for the purposes of section 7B of the Act the maximum amount which an approved institution shall advance to a borrower on the giving of a first mortgage of a new house or the maximum amount of the purchase moneys which an approved institution shall permit to remain payable under a contract for sale and purchase of a new house before an indemnity is given by the Treasurer under the Act is seventy per centum (70%) of the value of a new house as defined in the Act.

Town Planning Scheme No. 1.

Scheme Text.

THE Narrogin Shire Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended), hereinafter referred to as "the Act", makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of:—

- (a) Preserving the amenity of the Shire of Narrogin;
- (b) Controlling land development;
- (c) Setting aside land for various uses;
- (d) Other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART I—Preliminary.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Narrogin Town Planning Scheme No. 1, hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to all land within the Shire boundary.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Narrogin, hereinafter called "the Council".

1.4 Arrangement of the Scheme.

This Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:—

- Part I—Preliminary.
- Part II—Reserved Land.
- Part III—Zones.
- Part IV—Non-conforming Use of Land.
- Part V—General Provisions.
- Part VI—Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

- Land Use Maps.
- Scheme Maps.

1.5 Interpretation.

(a) In this Scheme, the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out hereunder, or in the Act, or in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967.

(i) Development: Means the use or development of any land and includes the erection, construction, alteration or carrying out, as the case may be, of any building, excavation or other works on any land.

(ii) Effective Frontage: Means the length of the line drawn at the front setback parallel to the main street frontage from one side boundary to the other.

(iii) Health Farm: Means a farm adapted to accommodate paying guests for health and/or recreation purposes but does not include a hospital, institutional home or other institutional building.

- (iv) Main Roads: In this Scheme, unless the context requires otherwise, "main roads" means the roads designated as such on the Scheme Map and which are the responsibility of the Main Roads Department.
- (v) Piggery: Means any building, enclosure, or yard in which one or more pigs are kept, bred, reared, or fattened for purposes of trade.
- (vi) Road House: Means a restaurant or shop, attached to a service station, for the provision of meals and refreshments to the travelling public.
- (vii) Rural Use: Means land and/or buildings used in the pursuit of agriculture.
- (viii) Service Industry: Means a use in which industrial operations are conducted for the express purpose of rendering services directly concerned with the day to day needs of the local community, and where the processes carried on, the machinery installed, the number of persons employed and the amount of vehicular traffic generated would not be detrimental to the amenity of the area concerned by reason of noise, vibration, smell or any other cause.
- (ix) Stock Sales Yard: Means Land and/or buildings used in the holding, display or orderly management of farming stock for the purposes of sale.
- (x) Trade Display: Means the open display of farm machinery or industrial equipment for sale.
- (xi) Veterinary Hospital: Means land or a building or buildings used for, or in connection with, the treatment of sick animals and may include the accommodation of such animals.
- (xii) Zoological Garden: Means land and/or buildings used for the purposes of confining or displaying animals, especially wild animals, to the public together with such other buildings as are ordinarily used therewith.

PART II—Reserved Land.

2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.2 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the granting of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III—Zones.

3.1 The Scheme Area is divided into the following zones:—

- Urban.
- Rural.
- Special Rural.
- Industrial.

3.2 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.4 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such use being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that table.

3.3 Where a use is not mentioned in the list of "Use Classes", it shall be included in the appropriate use class at the discretion of Council.

3.4 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this Clause have the following meanings.

- "P" A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
- "AA" A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.
- "IP" A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.
- "X" A use that is not permitted.

## PART IV—Non-conforming Use of Land.

## 4.1 No provision of this Scheme shall prevent:

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or,
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended) or by any other by-laws made under that Act, for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

## 4.3 Change of Non-conforming Use.

The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-

conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

## 4.4 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use.

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 4.3, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or buildings shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

## PART V—General Provisions.

5.1 In considering applications for approval to commence development, Council shall have regard to approved Main Roads Department plans of major road works.

## 5.2 Urban Zone.

5.2.1 Commercial Use: Maximum plot ratio and site coverage shall be 0.5. In considering applications for approval to commence development, Council shall have regard to the effect of the development on neighbouring areas, traffic safety, the appearance of the building, landscaping and amenity provisions described in this Part of the Scheme.

## Notes:

- (i) In areas served by reticulated sewerage disposal, the responsible authority may approve duplex dwellings on lots of 1 000 sq. metres with a minimum effective frontage of 20 metres.
- (ii) Where the land fronts a main road Council may increase the setback to include a projected road widening.
- (iii) Council may vary rear and side setback requirements for carports and outbuildings provided requirements of the Uniform Building By-laws are met.

5.2.3 Multiple Street Frontages: Setbacks from all effective street frontages shall conform to the standards for front boundaries, except in the case of a lot at a corner of intersecting streets, where the minimum setback from not more than one secondary street may be reduced to one half the minimum setback from the effective frontage to the primary street or streets. The minimum average width for any corner lot shall be 20 metres.

## 5.3 Industrial Zone.

5.3.1 Except in special cases the following shall apply.

5.3.2 In considering applications to develop within the Industrial Zone, Council shall have regard to the aesthetics of proposed development, traffic and site safety and the effect of the development on neighbouring areas.

5.3.3 Council shall apply the parking, loading and amenity provisions of this Part of the Scheme.

5.3.4 Multiple Street Frontages: Setbacks from all effective street frontages shall conform to the standards for front boundaries, except in the case of a lot at a corner of intersecting streets, where the minimum setbacks from not more than one secondary street may be reduced to one half the minimum setback from the effective frontage to the primary street or streets.

## 5.4 Rural Zone.

5.4.1 Except where lot sizes or dimensions, site conditions or special conditions apply, all development including residences, farm buildings and outbuildings shall be set back at least 20 metres from any lot boundary or projected road alignment or realignment. Minimum setbacks from Main Roads shall be 40 metres from existing 20 metre reserves and 30 metres from existing 40 metre reserves.

5.4.2 Council may impose conditions on any development pertaining to the following:—

- (a) site safety, in particular safety of access to the development;
- (b) amenity;
- (c) landscaping;
- (d) rehabilitation of the land after excavation.

The Council shall consult the Main Roads Department prior to approving access to any proposed development from a Main Road.

#### 5.5 Special Rural Zone.

The following provisions shall apply generally to all land included in the Special Rural Zone in addition to any provisions which are more specifically applicable to such land under this Scheme.

- (a) The Council's policy for the Special Rural Zone shall be to select areas within the rural areas wherein closer subdivision will be permitted to provide for such uses as hobby farms, horse breeding, rural/residential retreats, intensive agriculture including market gardens and viticulture, and also to make provision for retention of the rural landscape and amenity in a manner consistent with the orderly and proper planning of such areas.
- (b) The provisions for controlling subdivision, land uses and development relating to specific Special Rural Zones will be as laid down in the First Schedule to this Scheme and future subdivision will accord with the plan of subdivision for the specified area referred to in the Schedule and such plan of subdivision shall form part of the Scheme.

No development shall be permitted in any Special Rural Zone until the Council has prepared or required the owner(s) of the land to prepare, a submission supporting the creation of the Special Rural Zone and such submission shall include:—

- (i) A statement as to the purpose or intent for which the zone is being created.
- (ii) The reasons for selecting the particular area the subject of the proposed zone with particular reference as to how this relates to the Council's Policy.
- (iii) A plan or plans showing contours at such intervals as to adequately depict the land form of the area and physical features such as existing buildings, rock outcrops, trees or groups of trees, lakes, rivers, creeks, swamps, orchards, wells and significant improvements.
- (iv) Information regarding the method whereby it is proposed to provide a potable water supply to each lot, and the effect, if any, this water supply would have on nearby agricultural land, forest or areas of ecological importance particularly wetland areas.
- (v) The proposed staging of the subdivision and development and the criteria to be met before successive stages are implemented.
- (vi) The proposed means of liquid waste disposal and demonstrate that such disposal method will not affect other lands, either adjoining lots within the subdivision or lands external to the subdivision, nor will cause pollution of any wetland area.
- (vii) The definition of skylines and landscape faces that are important elements of the rural character or environmental amenity and how they are to be retained.

(viii) The relationship of the proposed development to adjoining reserves, particularly in terms of access.

(ix) Details of the location, nature and existing degree of preservation of any building of historic or architectural significance, any aboriginal site, any area of botanical or scientific interest, and any unique wildlife habitats, and indicates the means by which such features (if any) are to be treated.

(x) An assessment of the natural drainage conditions of the land and the means of overcoming any drainage problems either existing or caused by the proposed development and indicates the means of treating any areas of specific problem (e.g. areas of actual or potential erosion).

(c) The Scheme provisions for a specific Special Rural Zone shall include a plan of subdivision showing:—

(i) The proposed ultimate subdivision including lot sizes and dimensions but lots shall not be smaller than 2 hectares.

(ii) Areas to be set aside for Public Open Space, pedestrian accessways, horse trails, community facilities, etc. as may be considered appropriate.

(iii) Those physical features which it is intended to conserve.

(iv) The proposed staging of the subdivision where relevant.

(d) In addition to the plan of subdivision, the Scheme provisions for a specific Special Rural Zone shall specify:—

(i) The facilities which the purchasers of the lots will be required to provide (e.g. their own potable water supply, liquid and solid waste disposal systems, etc.).

(ii) Proposals for the control of land uses and development which will ensure that the purpose or intent of the zone and the rural environment and amenities are not impaired.

(iii) Any special provisions appropriate to secure the objectives of the zone.

(e) In addition to a Building Licence, Council's prior approval to commence development is required for all development including a private dwelling house and such application shall be made in the form of the Second Schedule of this Scheme and be subject to the provisions of this Part of the Scheme.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 11.3 (4) of the Uniform Building By-laws, not more than one private dwelling house per lot shall be erected.

(g) The Council may, by notice served upon individual land owners or upon a subdivider of land within this zone, require the preservation of specified trees or groups of trees and thereafter no landowner or subdivider shall cut, remove or otherwise destroy any tree or trees so specified unless the Council rescinds the notice or order.

(h) In addition to such other provisions of this Scheme as may affect it, any land which is included in a Special Rural Zone shall be subject to those provisions as may be specifically set out against it in the First Schedule entitled "Special Rural Zones—Provisions relating to Specified Areas" as set out under the First Schedule to the Scheme.

(i) Notwithstanding the provisions of this Scheme and what may be shown in the plan of subdivision specified in the First Schedule, the Town Planning Board may approve a minor variation to the subdivisional design but further breakdown of the lots so created shall be deemed to be contrary to the provisions of the Scheme.



5.6 (a) Vehicle Parking and Loading.

Any person who carries out development shall make provision for adequate parking in accordance with the requirements of Table No. 2, to the satisfaction of the Council.

(b) Size and Location of Car Spaces and Loading Facilities.

The minimum dimensions of every required parking space shall be 5.5 metres x 2.5 metres including all access driveways. Adequate manoeuvring space shall be provided to parking bays and in general for right angle parking the minimum driveway width will be 5.5 metres. Council may impose conditions prescribing landscaping, screening and the proportion of parking bays which may be approved in front of the building setback line. Council shall also have regard to the location of footpaths and proposed footpaths and the effect on traffic movements and safety of parking areas and cross-overs. The Council may also apply conditions on any proposed development ensuring that adequate provision is made for service vehicles and the loading and unloading of goods at the site.

(c) Number of Parking and Loading Spaces to be Provided.

- (i) Where a site is to be used for a purpose stipulated in the first column of Table No. 2, car parking spaces of the number specified in the second column of that table shall be provided before that site is used for that purpose. Where a use is not mentioned in the first column of Table 2, it shall be included in the appropriate use class at the discretion of Council.
- (ii) Where a site is to be utilised for commercial purposes the Council may permit it to be so used notwithstanding the prescribed number of parking spaces is not to be provided on or in the opinion of the Council sufficiently close to the site provided that the owner or occupier of such site makes satisfactory arrangements with the Council with respect to off-street parking in the vicinity of the site.
- (iii) Where in the opinion of the Council the provision of the number of parking spaces prescribed in Table 2 would be excessive in a particular case the Council may permit the particular site to be used for the purpose proposed if such number of parking spaces are provided as the Council considers adequate. In deciding whether the number so prescribed is excessive in a particular case, the Council shall have regard to the nature of the use to be made of the site, the known or likely volume of goods or materials, or the numbers of people moving to or from the site and the likelihood or otherwise of congestion of traffic on any road or other public place in the vicinity.

  - (c) Other To be determined by Council in consultation with the Authority involved before building operations commence.
- 6. Motor Repair Stations and Service Stations 2 for each working bay plus one for each person employed on-site.
- 7. Warehouses, show-rooms, storage yards and carriers' depots including incidental offices on premises used for such purposes One for each 100 sq. metres of display and 1 to each 100 sq. metres of gross floor area, or one for every 2 persons employed on the site; whichever is the greater.
- 8. Industry One for each 100 sq. metres of gross floor area or one for every 2 persons employed on the site; whichever is the greater.
- 9. Shops 8 for each 100 sq. metres of gross floor area.
- 10. Administrative, commercial and professional offices One for every 40 sq. metres of floor area or one for every 2 employees, whichever is the greater.

5.7 Appearance of Buildings.

All buildings shall be maintained by the owner and occupier thereof so as to preserve the amenities of the locality and their harmony with the exterior designs of neighbouring buildings.

5.8 Within the Urban and Industrial Zones a minimum of 20 per cent of the area of every lot developed shall be designed, developed and maintained as natural planting and pedestrian space (access driveways between street alignment and setback alignment may be included within the 20 per cent of the area maintained as natural planting).

PART VI—Administration.

6.1 Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purposes of Part II, shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

6.2 The Council may by an authorised officer at all reasonable times enter any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.3 Any application for planning consent shall be lodged with Council in the form of Form No. 1 of the Second Schedule to this Scheme for any development which is not permitted in Table No. 1 of this Scheme. Notwithstanding the fact that planning consent is not required to permit certain buildings in certain zones, Council shall nevertheless have regard to the requirements of the Scheme when issuing a building licence.

6.4 An applicant has a right of appeal under Part V of the Act in respect of the exercise of a discretionary power by the Council under the Scheme.

6.5 Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (TENDERS FOR CONTRACTS)  
REGULATIONS 1983.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Local Government (Tenders for Contracts) Regulations 1983.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which section 6 of the Local Government Amendment Act 1982 comes into operation.
- Interpretation. 3. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—  
 “duly submitted”, in relation to a tender, means submitted to the place specified in the relevant invitation to tender before the time of closing of tenders so specified, whether or not the tender complies with any other requirement in the invitation to tender;  
 “invitation to tender” means an invitation required by regulation 4;  
 “proposal” means a proposal submitted or purporting to be submitted in response to a notice delivered under Clause 3 of the Schedule;  
 “regulation” means one of these regulations;  
 “Schedule” means the Schedule to these regulations;  
 “subregulation” means a subregulation of the regulation wherein the term is used;  
 “tender”, used as a noun, means a tender submitted or purporting to be submitted in response to an invitation to tender.
- Circumstances in which tenders shall be invited. 4. A council shall invite tenders for the execution of work or for the furnishing of goods (in regulations 5, 6, 7 and 9 referred to as “the required work or goods”) where the amount of the proposed contract to be entered into with the municipality equals or exceeds \$10 000 unless—  
 (a) in the opinion of the council the execution of the work or furnishing of the goods in question relates to an emergency;  
 (b) the proposed contract is for the provision of professional services;  
 (c) the other party to the proposed contract is another municipality, a regional council or a State Government department, instrumentality or agency; or  
 (d) the proposed contract may be entered into by the council pursuant to regulation 9, 10, 11 or 12.
- Invitation to tender. 5. (1) An invitation to tender shall—  
 (a) be published at least once in a newspaper circulating throughout the State;  
 (b) contain a brief description of the required work or goods;  
 (c) where detailed information is available relating to the required work or goods, state where that information may be obtained or inspected;  
 (d) state where tenders may be submitted;  
 (e) where the council requires tenders to be submitted in a particular form or manner or to bear an identifying reference, state that requirement; and  
 (f) specify the date and time of the closing of tenders.  
 (2) The date to be specified as the closing date in an invitation to tender shall be such date as is considered by the council, having regard to the nature of the proposed contract, to allow sufficient time for the preparation and submission of tenders but in any event shall be not less than seven days after the first publication of the invitation to tender pursuant to subregulation (1) (a).

- Register of tenders. 6. (1) A council shall cause a register of tenders to be opened and maintained.
- (2) The register of tenders shall contain the following particulars with respect to each tender submitted—
- the date on which the tender was received;
  - a brief description of the required work or goods;
  - the name of the person submitting the tender; and
  - the amount of the consideration sought in the tender.
- Confidentiality of tenders. 7. A council shall cause all duly submitted tenders to be kept in safe custody until the question of entering into a contract in relation to the required work or goods has been determined.
- (2) An employee, member or agent of a council shall not disclose any particulars of a tender before the time of closing of tenders specified in the relevant invitation to tender.
- Consideration of tenders. 8. (1) Subject to subregulation (2) a council shall consider all duly submitted tenders, and no other.
- (2) A council may decline to consider a tender that does not comply with a requirement in the invitation to tender that tenders be submitted in a particular form or manner or bear an identifying reference.
- (3) A council may accept the tender that it considers to be the most advantageous, or, if no tender considered by it is, in its opinion, satisfactory may decline to accept any tender.
- (4) Without limiting the generality of matters that a council may have regard to in deciding whether or not a tender is the most advantageous a council is hereby authorized to have regard to the extent to which, if a contract was entered into with the person who submitted the tender—
- goods furnished pursuant to, or used in connection with, the contract would be manufactured in the State or in the municipal district; or
  - services provided pursuant to, or in connection with, the contract would be provided by persons residing in the State or in the municipal district.
- (5) As soon as practicable after considering tenders a council shall cause notice to be served on each person who duly submitted a tender advising whether or not his tender was accepted.
- Variation of requirements before entry into contract. 9. (1) Subject to subregulation (3) where a council, having considered tenders submitted in response to an invitation to tender, considers it necessary or desirable to make any variation in respect of the required work or goods, it may, without again inviting tenders, enter into a contract, providing for the execution of the work or the furnishing of the goods and giving effect to that variation, with the person who, in its opinion, submitted the most advantageous tender.
- (2) Where the person mentioned in subregulation (1) is unable or unwilling to enter into a contract pursuant to that subregulation or the council is unable to arrange such a contract on terms that are satisfactory to the council, that subregulation may be applied in relation to the person who, in the opinion of the council, submitted the next most advantageous tender, and so on.
- (3) A council may enter into a contract pursuant to this regulation if, and only if, it is satisfied that the variation in respect of the required work or goods is of a minor nature having regard to the total amount of the contract.
- Alternative procedures may be adopted in certain cases. 10. Where a council is of the opinion that having regard to the nature of work that it requires to be executed or goods that it requires to be furnished or the cost of preparing plans, specifications or other information for the purpose of adequately describing the work or goods, it would be advantageous if proposals to execute the work or furnish the goods were invited only from persons capable of satisfactorily executing the work or furnishing the goods, the council may, without calling tenders, enter into a contract for the execution of the work or the furnishing of the goods in accordance with the Schedule.
- Schedule. 11. A council may, without inviting tenders, enter into a contract for the execution of work or the furnishing of goods where, during the period of six months immediately preceding the date on which the contract is entered into—
- the council has invited tenders for the execution of the work or the furnishing of the goods and—
    - no tender was duly submitted; or
    - no tender considered by the council was, in its opinion, satisfactory; or
  - the council has invited applications for the registration of interest in relation to the work or goods under Clause 2 of the Schedule and—
    - no application was submitted to the place specified in the invitation before the time so specified;

- (ii) none of the persons who submitted applications to the place specified in the invitation before the time so specified was, in the opinion of the council, capable of satisfactorily executing the work or furnishing the goods;
- (iii) no proposal was duly submitted; or
- (iv) no proposal considered by the council was, in its opinion, satisfactory.

Variation of requirements after entry into contract.

12. Where, having entered into a contract for the execution of works or the furnishing of goods, a council considers that—

- (a) it is necessary or desirable to make any variation in respect of the work to be executed or the goods to be furnished under the contract; and
- (b) it would not be practicable or reasonable to enter into a contract to give effect to that variation with a person other than the person with whom the firstmentioned contract has been entered into,

the council may, without inviting tenders, enter into a further contract with that person to give effect to that variation.

#### PROCEDURE FOR ENTRY INTO CONTRACTS AFTER INVITING REGISTRATION OF INTEREST.

Interpretation.

1. In this Schedule "clause" means a clause of this Schedule.

Invitation to register interest.

2. (1) Where, in relation to the execution of work or the furnishing of goods (in this Schedule referred to as "the required work or goods"), a council is of the opinion described in regulation 10 it may invite persons to apply to register their interest in submitting a proposal to execute that work or furnish those goods.

(2) An invitation under subclause (1) shall—

- (a) be published at least once in a newspaper circulating throughout the State;
- (b) contain a brief description of the required work or goods;
- (c) state where applications for the registration of an interest may be submitted;
- (d) where the council requires an application for registration to be submitted in a particular form or manner or to bear an identifying reference, state those requirements;
- (e) specify the date and time of the closing of applications for registration of interest.

Invitation to submit proposals.

3. (1) Where a council has published an invitation under Clause 2 it may cause a notice to be delivered to each person who—

- (a) has, in response to the invitation, submitted an application to the place specified in the invitation before the time so specified; and
- (b) is, in the opinion of the council, capable of satisfactorily executing or furnishing the required work or goods.

(2) A notice under subclause (1) of this clause shall—

- (a) invite the person to whom it is delivered to submit a proposal to execute or furnish the required work or goods;
- (b) state where the proposal may be submitted;
- (c) be accompanied by detailed information concerning the required work or goods or state where this information may be obtained or inspected;
- (d) where the council requires proposals to be submitted in a particular form or manner or to bear an identifying reference, state that requirement; and
- (e) specify the date and time of the closing of proposals.

Register, custody and consideration of proposals; variation of requirements.

4. The provisions of regulations 6, 7, 8 and 9 and the definition of "duly submitted" in regulation 3 shall apply to and with respect to proposals and for the purpose of that application of those provisions—

- (a) a reference in those provisions to a tender shall be construed as a reference to a proposal; and
- (b) a reference in those provisions to an invitation to tender shall be read as a reference to a notice delivered under Clause 3.

The Municipality of the Shire of Bayswater.

By-law Relating to the Payment of Rates and Charges.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 23 March 1983 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law:—

1. Rates and Charges imposed by the Council of the Shire of Bayswater under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1960-1982 shall become due and payable on the day on which the memorandum referred to in section 550 (1) of the said Act is published in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Notwithstanding the requirements of Clause 1 hereof, the rates and charges may, at the option of the ratepayer, who is in actual occupation of the rateable property being used exclusively for residential purposes, and upon approval being granted to a written application, substantially in the form of the First Schedule, by such officers as shall be nominated from time to time by Council, be paid in the following manner:—

(a) in the case of a recipient of a recognised Health and Concession Card issued by the Department of Social Security and who does not qualify for entitlement under the Pensioners' (Rates, Rebates and Deferments) Act 1966-1982, and upon receipt of a written application, substantially in the form of the First Schedule, by the Council by no more than eight (8) equal calendar monthly instalments; and

(b) in the case of a person who is not the recipient of a Health and Concession Card as outlined in Clause 2 (a) and upon receipt of a written application, substantially in the form of the First Schedule, by the Council, by no more than six (6) equal calendar monthly instalments;

with, in each case, the first instalment being payable within thirty (30) days of the date as defined in Clause 1 above.

3. Rates and Charges which are in arrears from the previous year or years shall be due and payable with the first instalment unless arrangements acceptable to Council are made.

4. In each case where a ratepayer elects to pay by instalment in accordance with Clause 2, each instalment will be subject to an administration fee not exceeding one dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) and the total administration fees shall be payable with the first instalment.



5. If the first instalment and the written application as defined in Clauses 2 and 3 above are not received within thirty (30) days from the date as defined in Clause 1 above, rates and charges become due and payable in full within thirty-five (35) days of such date.

6. If any instalment shall be in arrears for a period of two (2) months or more then the total outstanding balance shall become due and payable forthwith.

Uniform Building Amendment By-laws 1983.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation and principal by-laws. 1. (1) These by-laws may be cited as the Uniform Building Amendment By-laws 1983.

(2) In these by-laws the Uniform Building By-laws 1974\*, as amended, are referred to as the principal by-laws.

Part 30, Div. 2 substituted. 2. Part 30 of the principal by-laws is amended by repealing Division 2 and substituting the following Division—

“ *Division 2—Seismic Activity*

**Interpretation**

30.2 In this Division—

“timber framing connector” means a manufactured connector system for timber joints formed from 1.2 mm galvanised steel and pre-punched to take nails;

“Zone” means a Seismic Zone defined in the Ffth Schedule.

**Standard to be Applied to Buildings Within its Scope**

30.3 A building which is in Zone A, Zone 1 or Zone 2 and to which Australian Standard 2121, being item 61 of the First Schedule, applies shall be designed and constructed in accordance with that standard.

**Construction of Certain Residential Buildings in Zone A**

*Application of this By-law*

30.4 (1) This by-law applies to—

- (a) buildings of Class I; and
- (b) buildings of Class IA, II or III in which the building elements separating the different occupancy units are vertical and not horizontal,

that are more than four storeys in height and are constructed in Zone A.

*Design and Construction of Structural Members*

(2) The structural members of a building to which this by-law applies shall be—

- (a) designed by a practising structural engineer; and
- (b) constructed,

in accordance with Australian Standard 2121, being item 61 of the First Schedule, as if the building was a building to which that standard applied.

**Construction of Certain Residential Buildings in Zone 1**

*Application of this By-law*

30.5 (1) This by-law applies to—

- (a) buildings of Class I; and
- (b) buildings of Class IA, II or III in which the building elements units are vertical and not horizontal,

that are constructed in Zone 1.

*Prohibited Construction*

(2) In a building to which this by-law applies the following are prohibited—

- (a) unreinforced masonry unless permitted under Table 30.5 or designed by a practising structural engineer;
- (b) overhanging ornamentation, parapets, and free standing masonry chimneys.

*Design and Construction of Structural Members*

(3) Subject to sub-by-law (4) the structural members of a building to which this by-law applies shall be—

- (a) designed by a practising structural engineer; and
- (b) constructed,

in accordance with Australian Standard 2121, being item 61 of the First Schedule, as if the building was a building to which that standard applied.

*Alternative Design and Construction in certain cases*

(4) Where a building to which this by-law applies—

- (a) does not have a roof of concrete tiles or terracotta tiles; and
- (b) is of one storey in height,

sub-by-law (3) need not be complied with in relation to the design and construction of the structural members of the building if those structural members are designed and constructed in accordance with Table 30.5.

TABLE 30.5

**SINGLE STOREY RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS IN ZONE 1 WITHOUT CONCRETE TILE OR TERRACOTTA TILE ROOF—ALTERNATIVE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION**

**1. Foundations and Footings**

- (a) Stumps supporting framed structures to be of steel or reinforced concrete and stumps with an out of the ground length exceeding 650 mm to be braced.
- (b) Floor beams to be fixed to the top of stumps with two 10 mm diameter bolts or the equivalent thereof.
- (c) Corner stumps to be braced in two directions and where a building dimension exceeds 10 m in length or width intermediate bracing to be used at 10 m maximum centres.
- (d) The bottom plates of framed structures to be fixed to a concrete raft or strip footing with M10 bolts or masonry anchors at 1 800 mm maximum centres.

- (e) Concrete strip footings to be continuously reinforced with two layers of reinforcement comprising two 12 mm diameter bars (Grade 410C or 410Y) per layer and tied with R6 ligatures at centres not exceeding 2.5 times the depth of the footing.

## 2. *Framed Wall Construction*

(a) Where metal framing is used:

- (i) The framing to conform to Australian Standard 1538, being item 27 of the First Schedule, or Australian Standard 1664, being item 55 of the First Schedule, and to be braced, nogged and fixed together using welding or the equivalent in strength using self tapping screws or bolts.
- (ii) Wall plates to be continuous between cross walls or spliced so that no loss of strength occurs.
- (iii) Material used in walls, other than bracing, not to be less than 1.2 mm in thickness.

(b) Where timber framing is used:

- (i) The framing to be fixed together by the use of timber framing connectors nailed with a minimum of three 2.8 mm diameter x 30 mm long nails to each fixing plate of the connector or if of seasoned timber, may be alternatively fixed with two 2.8 mm diameter nails, machine nailed through the top or bottom plate into the stud.
- (ii) Wall plates to be continuous between cross walls or spliced so that no loss of strength occurs.

## 3. *Masonry Construction*

Where masonry construction is used:

- (a) No internal or external wall to exceed 4 m in length unless stiffened by means of cross walls or by columns or bracing designed by a practising structural engineer.
- (b) Cross walls to be tied to the internal leaf of cavity walls by fully bonding or by metal ties, complying with by-law 36.6, at every second course.
- (c) Mortar to be at least as strong as a 1:1:6 mortar and the masonry units to have good mortar adherence properties and bricks to be laid on a full bed of mortar with cross joints properly filled.
- (d) Both leaves of all external masonry walls to be reinforced with two R6 bars (Grade 230), or two 3.15 mm diameter bars (Grade 450), in the course immediately under window sills and over door and window heads.
- (e) Reinforcement to extend a minimum of 300 mm beyond the supporting cross walls or columns and reinforcement to the external leaf to be galvanised.
- (f) Continuous reinforced brick bond beams, comprising two R6 bars (Grade 230), or two 3.15 mm diameter bars (Grade 450), in each of the top three bed joints, to be constructed—
  - (i) in every case, on the internal leaf of all external walls and on all cross walls; and
  - (ii) where the roof is pitched on the external leaf of the external walls, on that external leaf.
- (g) Cross wall reinforcement to be turned and lapped 300 mm into the external walls.
- (h) Splices in reinforcement not to be less than 300 mm.
- (i) The top two courses of all internal walls and of the internal leaf of all external walls to be constructed of bricks that contain no perforations.

## 4. *Veneer on Framed Construction*

Where veneer on framed construction is used:

- (a) Only veneers comprising an external skin of masonry and internal partitions of timber or metal framing to be used.
- (b) The veneer to be fixed in accordance with Part 42.

## 5. *Roof Construction*

- (a) The roof structure to be braced so that all horizontal loads are transferred directly to the cross walls.
- (b) The roof framing to be fixed to the wall top plate by the use of timber framing connectors nailed with a minimum of three 2.8 mm diameter x 30 mm long nails to each fixing plate of the connector.

- (c) Where the walls are of masonry construction all top plates to be connected to the walls by masonry anchors, or equivalent fixing at a maximum of 1 800 mm centres, and every such fixing to be fixed into the second top course.

### Construction of Certain Residential Buildings in Zone 2

#### *Application of this By-law*

30.6. (1) This by-law applies to—

- (a) buildings of Class I; and
- (b) buildings of Class IA, II or III in which the building elements separating the different occupancy units are vertical and not horizontal,

that are constructed in Zone 2.

#### *Prohibited Construction*

(2) In a building to which this by-law applies the following are prohibited—

- (a) unreinforced masonry construction;
- (b) overhanging ornamentation, parapets and free standing masonry chimneys.

#### *Design and Construction of Structural Members*

(3) Subject to sub-by-law (4) the structural members of a building to which this by-law applies shall be—

- (a) designed by a practising structural engineer; and
- (b) constructed,

in accordance with Australian Standard 2121, being item 61 of the First Schedule, as if the building was a building to which that standard applied.

#### *Alternative Design and Construction in certain cases*

(4) Where a building to which this by-law applies—

- (a) is not of masonry or veneer on framed construction;
- (b) does not have a roof of concrete tiles or terracotta tiles; and
- (c) is of one storey in height,

sub-by-law (3) need not be complied with in relation to the design and construction of the structural members of the building if those structural members are designed and constructed in accordance with Table 30.6.

TABLE 30.6

### SINGLE STOREY RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS IN ZONE 2 WITHOUT CONCRETE TILE OR TERRACOTTA TILE ROOF AND NOT OF MASONRY OR VENEER ON FRAMED CONSTRUCTION— ALTERNATIVE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION.

#### 1. *Foundations and Footings*

- (a) Stumps supporting framed structures to be of steel or reinforced concrete and stumps with an out of the ground length exceeding 500 mm to be braced.
- (b) Floor beams to be fixed to the top of stumps with two 10 mm diameter bolts or the equivalent thereof.
- (c) Corner stumps to be braced in two directions and where a building dimension exceeds 8 m in length or width intermediate bracing to be provided at 8 m maximum centres.
- (d) The bottom plate of framed structures to be fixed to a concrete raft or strip footing with M10 bolts or masonry anchors at 1 200 mm maximum centres.
- (e) Concrete strip footings to be continuously reinforced with two layers of reinforcement comprising two 12 mm diameter bars (Grade 410C or 410Y) per layer and tied with R6 ligatures at centres not exceeding 2.5 times the depth of the footing.

#### 2. *Framed Wall Construction*

- (a) Where metal framing is used:
  - (i) The framing to conform to AS 1538, being item 27 of the First Schedule, or Australian Standard 1664, being item 55 of the First Schedule, and to be braced, noggged and fixed together using welding or the equivalent in strength using self tapping screws or bolts.
  - (ii) Wall plates to be continuous between cross walls or spliced so that no loss of strength occurs.
  - (iii) Material used in walls, other than bracing, not to be less than 1.2 mm in thickness.

- (b) Where timber framing is used:
- (i) The framing to be fixed together by the use of timber framing connectors nailed with a minimum of three 2.8 mm diameter x 30 mm long nails to each fixing plate of the connector or if of seasoned timber, may be alternatively fixed with two 2.8 mm diameter nails, machine nailed through the top or bottom plate into the stud.
  - (ii) Wall plates to be continuous between cross walls or spliced so that no loss of strength occurs.

### 3. *Roof Construction*

- (a) The roof structure to be braced so that all horizontal loads are transferred directly to the cross walls.
- (b) The roof framing to be fixed to the wall top plate by the use of timber framing connectors nailed with a minimum of three 2.8 mm diameter x 30 mm long nails to each fixing plate of the connector.

### **Free Standing Masonry Walls**

30.7 A person shall not construct a free standing masonry wall exceeding 1.2 m in height in Zone 1 or 2 unless the wall is designed by a practising structural engineer to resist seismic loads.

By-law 53.4 amended.

3. By-law 53.4 of the principal by-laws is amended by inserting after sub-by-law (2) the following headings and sub-by-laws—

“ *Reflective Glazing*

(3) In sub-by-law (4) “reflective glazing” means glass or other glazing material that for one, or a combination of two or more, of the following reasons, namely—

- (a) the properties of the glass or material;
- (b) the application to the glass or material of a reflective film or of any other form of treatment;
- (c) the method of construction used in the building component of which the glass or material forms part, has a light or heat reflective value that exceeds 16%.

*Restriction on Use*

(4) Reflective glazing shall not be used in a door, window or other component of a roof or external wall of a building of Class II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII or IX without the approval of the Council.

*Council to Consider Adverse Effects*

(5) The Council shall not give its approval under sub-by-law (4) unless it is satisfied beyond reasonable doubt that the use of the reflective glazing—

- (a) will not cause glare or heat radiation that will have any undue adverse effect on the surrounding environment; and
- (b) will not create any undue traffic hazard.

*Evidence may be Required*

(6) The Council may require the submission of evidence relevant to the matters as to which it has to be satisfied under sub-by-law (5).
