WHEREAS by the Transfer of Land Act 1893, the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to revest in Her Majesty as of Her former estate all or any lands, whereof Her Majesty may become the registered proprietor, and whereas Her Majesty is now the registered proprietor of the land described in the Schedules annexed hereto: Now therefore, I, the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation revest in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the land described in the Schedules annexed hereto as of Her former estate.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 18 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act 1914-1981, that the Governor may, by proclamation, declare any part of the State named or defined in the proclamation to be a proclaimed area for the purposes of section 18 of the said Act; and may, by subsequent proclamation, vary or cancel any such proclamation: Now, therefore, I the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby vary the Gingin Groundwater Area by the addition of those parts of the State as described in the schedules hereto, as shown on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 53991-1 Sheets 1 and 2 as kept in the Public Works Department and declare it to be a proclaimed area for the purposes of section 18 of the said Act.

VARIATION TO GINGIN GROUNDWATER AREA.

HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

The Municipality of the Town of Kalgoorlie.

Health By-laws—Eating Houses.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 (as amended), a Local Authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made; Now, therefore, the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Kalgoorlie, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby record having resolved on 13 December 1982, to make and submit for the approval of the Governor the following by-laws.

PART I.

Interpretation.

1. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—
“Act” means the Health Act 1911; and any amendment thereof.
“Local Authority” means the Municipality of the Town of Kalgoorlie.
“Medical Officer” means the Medical Officer of the Local Authority and includes any person acting in that capacity.
“Health Surveyor” shall have the same meaning as it has under the Health Act.
“Eating House” shall have the same meaning as it has under section 160 of the Health Act and shall include for the purpose of registration Restaurants, Dining Rooms, Tea Rooms, Refreshment Rooms and Take-Away Food Premises.

"Licence" means a licence to conduct an eating house granted pursuant to the provisions of this by-law.

"Registered Premises" means any premises which are registered as an eating house under this by-law, and includes any yard or land appurtenant to such eating house.

The terms "food", "owner", "premises" and "proprietor" shall have the same meanings as they have under the Health Act.

"Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk or the Acting Town Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of the Town of Kalgoorlie.

PART II.

Licences and Registration.

2. No person shall occupy or use any premises as an eating house unless:—

- (a) The premises are registered under this by-law by the Local Authority, and
- (b) The proprietor of the said premises is the holder of a licence issued by the Local Authority authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of an eating house.

3. Before any premises are registered under this by-law, the proprietor thereof shall make application in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward his application, together with a plan of the premises in respect of which such application is made, and the prescribed fee, to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the Local Authority shall issue to the proprietor a Certificate of Registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

4. Before any licence to any proprietor to conduct an eating house is granted by the Local Authority under this by-law, the proprietor shall sign an application for the same in the form prescribed in Third Schedule hereto and shall forward same, together with the prescribed fee, to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the Local Authority shall issue to the proprietor a licence in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

5. Any person who makes a false statement in connection with any application under Clauses 3 or 4 hereof shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Every Certificate of Registration of premises registered as an eating house and every licence issued to a proprietor shall be signed by the Town Clerk and shall be duly entered in a book to be provided by the Local Authority for that purpose. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the Certificate of Registration and the licence on the registered premises and shall, when requested so to do by the Health Surveyor, produce to him the Certificate of Registration and also the licence issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.

7. Every Certificate of Registration and every licence shall be in force from the day of the date of the issue thereof until and inclusive of the 31st day of December then next ensuing, unless the same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

8. Applications for the renewal of Certificate of Registration and licences shall be made annually during the month of December. Such applications shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth and Sixth Schedules hereto, respectively, and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

9. The fees to be paid to the Local Authority on the registration of premises, on the issuing of a licence and on the renewal of any registration or licence shall be as set out in the Seventh Schedule hereto.

10. So often as any person holding a licence issued pursuant to this by-law changes his place of abode, he shall within seven days next after such a change give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk, specifying in such notice his new place of abode and he shall at the same time produce such licence to the Town Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

11. If the owner of any registered premises sells or transfers or agrees to sell or transfer the said premises to another person, he shall within 14 days from the date of such sale or transfer or agreement notify the Town Clerk thereof in writing on the form prescribed in the Eighth Schedule hereto.

PART III.

Management.

12. Any premises registered or required to be registered under the provisions of these by-laws shall in addition to the provisions hereof also comply with:—

- (i) The Food Hygiene Regulations (1973)
- (ii) The Health Act Model By-laws, Series A
- (iii) The Food and Drug Regulations (1961)

or any subsequent amendment thereto.

13. The proprietor of every eating house registered or required to be registered under these by-laws shall remove or cause to be removed the whole of the canned or preserved food or any food contained in an hermetically sealed container (such container not being composed wholly of glass or stone ware) intended for use on the registered premises from such original can or container immediately after the same shall have been opened.

14. The proprietor of every eating house registered or required to be registered under these by-laws:—

- (i) Shall remove or cause to be removed any food which may have been served to any person or placed on any table occupied by any customer on the registered premises and not then consumed or removed by him immediately after such person shall have finished his refreshment to the kitchen or serving room of such premises.
- (ii) Shall not permit suffer or allow any such food so removed to any such kitchen or serving room to be again served to any person on the premises.
- (iii) Shall immediately deposit any such food in the waste food garbage bin.

Provided that for the purpose of this Section "Food" shall not mean or include:—

- (a) Sugar, pepper, salt, mustard, vinegar, sauces, spices, or condiments if such substances are contained in receptacles or containers of a design approved by the Health Surveyor and so constructed that the contents of such receptacles or containers cannot be handled by any person.
- (b) Bread which is placed and kept in a glass receptacle or container of a design approved by the Health Surveyor and so constructed that the contents are only handled as required.

15. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and, upon conviction, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00, and, where such breach is of a continuing nature to a daily penalty not exceeding \$4.00.

HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

Shire of Roebourne.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 (as amended) a local authority may make by-laws, now therefore, the Shire of Roebourne being the local authority for the health district of Roebourne do hereby amend the application of the Model By-Laws—Series "A" made pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act 1911.

1. The Model By-Laws are amended by adding after by-law 1BB a by-law as follows:—

1C (1) for the purpose of this by-law the following definitions shall apply:—

(a) "building" means shops and other premises for the sale of goods by retail or the supply of services direct to the public, including:—

(i) eating rooms, tea rooms, coffee rooms, cafes, restaurants and milk and soft drink bars;

(ii) hair dressers' and barbers' shops, public laundries and undertakers establishments; and

(iii) markets, sale rooms, show rooms and service stations.

(b) "floor area" means the aggregate floor area of the parts of a building to which the public normally is permitted access during the normal trading hours of each shop in the building, but excluding malls, open spaces provided for public use, store rooms and warehouses.

(c) "public" means other than for staff or owner/occupier use.

(d) "Shire" means the Shire of Roebourne.

2. (a) A building having a floor area exceeding one thousand (1 000) square metres but not exceeding nineteen thousand (19 000) square metres shall be provided with sanitary facilities for public use during the trading hours of any shop forming part of the building.

(b) The sanitary facilities shall be readily accessible to the public and be situated within the perimeter of the building or if situated in a separate block, within ten (10) metres of the perimeter of the building.

3. A building having a floor area exceeding nineteen thousand (19 000) square metres shall be provided with such sanitary facilities for public use during the trading hours of any shop in the building as shall be determined by the Council of the Shire in meetings.

4. The sanitary facilities required by By-law 1C (2) (a) shall be provided according to the following scale and shall be in addition to and separate from those provided for the use of the proprietor or proprietors of the building or of the shops in the building or the employees or agents of such persons.
