NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of the Committee of the Western Australian Trotting Association held at Gloucester Park, East Perth on 28 June 1983 it was resolved by an absolute majority of the Committee as follows:—

That Rule 436 be deleted and that in the place thereof there be inserted the following:—

436.

- (a) There shall be kept at the office of the Controlling Body a Register of Sires (in this Part called "the Register") and application may be made by the owner for the entry therein of the name of any trotting or pacing stallion used, or proposed to be used, for stud purposes. A sire registered in the Register is hereinafter referred to as "a registered sire". A stallion shall not be eligible for entry in the Register:—
 - (i) as from 1 August 1960 unless his name appears in the Australian Trotting Stud Book,
 - (ii) as from 1 February 1983 unless his name appears in the Australian Trotting Stud Book and the owner furnishes to the Controlling Body for the purpose of blood typing a blood sample taken from the stallion such blood sample having been taken in such manner as the Controlling Body shall from time to time prescribe.

Where the name of any stallion is entered in the Register the owner thereof shall keep a written record of all mares served by such stallion, and shall not later than 28 February in each year, furnish to the Controlling Body the registered name of every mare serviced by the stallion in the stud season immediately preceding and the name and address of the owner of each such mare and such particulars shall be recorded at the office of the Association.

- (b) The application for the entry of a stallion in the Register shall be in such form and be accompanied by such fee as the Controlling Body shall from time to time prescribe.
- (c) the owner of every brood mare to be served shall obtain from the Controlling Body a brood mare breeding card for that mare.
- (d) The owner of a mare that has been served by a registered sire shall before taking delivery of the mare from the studmaster having the charge of such registered sire supply to the studmaster the brood mare breeding card of the mare that has been served.
- (e) A studmaster having the charge of a registered sire shall not permit a mare that has been served by a registered sire to be returned to the owner of the mare unless he is in possession of the mare's brood mare breeding card.
- (f) The studmaster having the charge of a registered sire shall, in respect of each service by such sire, ensure by reference to the brood mare breeding card that the mare that has been served is beyond doubt the mare which it is represented to be.
- (g) The studmaster having the charge of a registered sire shall in respect of each mare served by a registered sire complete and deliver to the owner of that mare the brood mare breeding card in respect of that mare and the Certificate of Service/Result of Service form.
- (h) (i) The studmaster having the charge of a registered sire shall no later than 28 February immediately following the end of a stud season deliver to the Controlling Body the original Sire Summary Sheet listing all mares served by that sire during the immediately preceding stud season.

- (ii) A studmaster who delivers or causes to be delivered to the Controlling Body any certificate paper or record containing information in relation to mares serviced by a sire under his control that is in any particular inaccurate incomplete or incorrect shall be guilty of an offence under these Rules.
- (i) (i) The owner of every brood mare shall within twenty one (21) days of the date of such mare foaling complete and deliver to the Controlling Body the Certificate of Service/Result of Service form in respect of that mare;
- (ii) The owner of every brood mare not producing a live foal shall no later than 28 February following the end of a stud season complete and deliver to the Controlling Body the Certificate of Service/Result of Service form in respect of that mare.
- (j) The fees payable by the owner of a brood mare in respect of the registration of a service to a brood mare shall be as follows:—
 - (i) if such service is notified no later than 28 February following the end of the stud season in which that mare is served—such fee as the Controlling Body shall from time to time fix.
 - (ii) if such service is so notified later than the aforesaid 28th day of February referred to in the preceding paragraph (i) such fee being greater than that fixed for the purpose of paragraph (i) as the Controlling Body shall from time to time fix.
- (k) All progeny shall be branded with such identifying code brand as the Controlling Body shall from time to time require before such progeny is weaned from the mare and the owner of such progeny shall furnish the Controlling Body with a detailed description of such progeny and the identifying code brand with which such progeny is so branded.
- (l) Whenever:—
 - (i) the Certificate of Service/Result of Service form in respect of a mare which has been served by two or more stallions is received by the Controlling Body stating that a live foal was produced;
 - (ii) the Certificate of Service/Result of Service form in respect of a mare is received by the Controlling Body stating that the mare has produced a live foal less than three hundred and fifteen (315 days) or more than three hundred and seventy (370) days after the date of her last service;
 - (iii) the detailed description furnished to the Controlling Body and or the identifying code brand of a horse differ significantly from those stated on the Certificate of Service/Result of Service form received by the Controlling Body;
 - (iv) it is suspected by the Controlling Body that the identities of two (2) horses may have been interchanged, or
 - (v) the coat coloration of a foal stated on the Certificate of Service/Result of Service form is not in accordance with the following genetic principles:—
 - (a) as chestnut coloration is recessive to all other coloration the progeny from a chestnut to chestnut mating must be a chestnut.
 - (b) as grey coloration is dominant in relation to all basic coloration if the progeny has a grey coloration at least one of a foal's parents must have grey coloration.

the Controlling Body may at its discretion demand of the owner of a mare, the owner of a registered sire and or the studmaster having the charge of a registered sire that such owner owners or studmaster, as the case may be, shall furnish to the Controlling Body for the purpose of blood typing a blood sample taken from the mare and or registered sire, as the case may be, such blood sample to be taken in such manner as the Controlling Body shall from time to time prescribe.
- (m) Unless the Controlling Body by its Committee otherwise determines or unless the blood typing of a foal's sire and dam proves to the satisfaction of the Controlling Body that such is possible a foal shall not be registered unless the foal's coat coloration is in accordance with the above mentioned genetic principles.
- (n) Any progeny resulting from a mare for which no Certificate of Service/Result of Service form has been lodged with the Controlling Body shall not be considered for registration until the parentage of the progeny is proved to the satisfaction of the Controlling Body by blood typing.
- (o) (i) The owner or any person having charge of any standard-bred stock, shall, when required to do so by a person who renders to him an authority duly signed by the Secretary of the Controlling Body forthwith—
 - (a) permit and assist such person to inspect any standard bred stock on his property or under his control;
 - (b) permit such person to inspect and if necessary retain all written records relating to such standard bred stock;

- (ii) No person shall obstruct delay or mislead a person authorised by paragraph (i) in the doing of any of the acts or things therein mentioned and any person who does so shall be guilty of an offence under these Rules, and in addition to any other penalty that may be imposed under these Rules, any standard bred stock under his control or in which he has any interest whatsoever may be disqualified from being registered or in any other way being recognised under these Rules.
- (p) Except as provided in sub-rule (r) of this Rule no horse foaled in Western Australia shall be eligible to race unless the name of the sire thereof appears in the Register, and the requirements of the foregoing sub-Rules have been observed. Provided that where a service occurs without the knowledge or premeditation of the owners of the stallion and mare concerned, application may be made at any time before the mare foals, but not after, for the registration of such service as though the sire appeared in the Register, and the Committee of the Controlling Body may refuse, without assigning any reason, or grant such application upon such conditions and subject to the payment of such fee as it may determine.
- (q) In the event of the death of any sire, mare or progeny in connection with which any notification has been made to the Controlling Body under the provisions of the foregoing sub-Rules, the Studmaster shall notify the Controlling Body within twenty-eight (28) days of such death.
- (r) Notwithstanding the provisions of the foregoing sub-Rules the Controlling Body may grant at any time an application for the entry of a stallion in the Register and accept notices of services and foalings and all other notifications or information required by such sub-Rule as though lodged in accordance therewith but may require—
- (i) any information to be in the form of a Statutory Declaration;
 - (ii) the observance of such conditions as it may impose; and
 - (iii) payment of such fees or additional fees as it may prescribe.
- (s) (i) Any person who fails or refuses to comply with the sub-Rules relating to the registration of sires, services and foalings shall be guilty of an offence against these Rules.
- (ii) The Controlling Body may without assigning any reason refuse any application for the entry of a stallion in the Register or decline to accept or recognise any notification of service or foaling or impose such conditions in relation thereto as it may think fit.

- (a) For the purpose of this by-law, the term "residential lot" shall mean or include any parcel of land upon which there is constructed a dwelling used or intended to be used for human habitation, and the term "other lot" shall mean and include any parcel of land not being a "residential lot" within the meaning of that term.
- (b) No person shall keep more than six head of poultry (excluding the young of such poultry up to the age of three months) on any residential lot or other lot less than 1 000 square metres in area.
- (c) No person shall keep more than six head of poultry (excluding the young of such poultry up to the age of three months) on any residential lot or other lot exceeding 1 000 square metres in area without first having made application to the Local Authority in that regard. The application referred to herein shall specify the number of head of poultry which it is intended to keep on that residential lot.
- (d) No shed or yard constructed on a residential lot or other lot for the keeping of poultry shall be erected closer than nine metres to any dwelling house thereon nor shall poultry be permitted to stay within nine metres of a dwelling house thereon.
- (e) Any person keeping poultry on any residential lot or other lot within the area of the municipality of the City of Gosnells shall provide an adequate shed constructed in accordance with the requirements of the building by-laws of the City of Gosnells from time to time provided that in addition to any requirements of the building by-laws as referred to any shed or poultry run erected for the keeping of poultry within the area of the municipality of the City of Gosnells shall:—
 - (i) Have a minimum floor area of 7.4 square metres.
 - (ii) Be constructed of cement trowelled to a smooth finish and laid with a fall of one in fifty towards the front of the shed.
 - (iii) Have fences constructed of galvanised wire netting not less than 1.8 metres high supported by uprights of jarrah or a reasonable substitute not less than 75 millimetres by 60 millimetres which uprights shall be set at 2.4 metres intervals with not less than 610 millimetres of uprights below ground level.

- (iv) Where poultry are kept under the deep litter method as approved by the Department of Agriculture the provisions of paragraph (ii) of this by-law with respect to cement floors shall be optional.
- (f) The owner of any residential or other lot shall not keep or permit to be kept a rooster, peacock, or turkey without the written consent of the Council in that regard.
- (g) That paragraphs (c) to (f) of this by-law do not apply to lots exceeding 2 000 square metres which are zoned rural under Council's Town Planning Scheme.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN MARINE ACT 1982.

Restricted Speed Areas—Pleasure Vessels.

Department of Marine and Harbours,
Fremantle, 12 July 1983.

ACTING pursuant to the powers conferred by section 67 of the Western Australian Marine Act the Department of Marine and Harbours, by this notice:—

- (1) Limits the speed of motor vessels to that of four (4) knots within the following areas:—
- (a) Canning River:
All waters of the Canning River upstream of the old Riverton Bridge.
- (b) Harvey Estuary:
All waters south of the ford which extends from the easternmost point of Lot 1990 to Herron Point in the Harvey Estuary.
- (2) Limits the speed of motor vessels to that of five (5) knots within the following areas:—
- (a) Swan River:
- (i) From a point 100 metres downstream of the Point Reserve Swimming Jetties to the Bassendean Road Bridge;
 - (ii) From a point 100 metres downstream of the Governor Stirling Jetties to a point 100 metres upstream of those jetties;
 - (iii) From a point being the starboard hand marker approximately 100 metres upstream of Caversham House and for navigable waters upstream of that point.
 - (iv) Armstrong Spit—from a line drawn between spit posts numbered 33 and 34 and a line between spit posts numbered 30 and 31 as shown on Plan P.W.D. 44106.

Note: Other sections of the Swan River are subject to differing speed restriction (see 3 (a) and 4 (a)).

- (b) Fremantle Fishing Boat Harbour:
All the water contained within the Fremantle Fishing Boat Harbour and including the entrance channel thereof.

(c) Rottneest Island:

(i) Thomson Bay:

All those waters of Thomson Bay bounded by lines drawn from Bathurst Point Lighthouse in a 035 degree direction for 330 metres to the Duck Rock Light Beacon thence in a 143 degree direction for 1265 metres to the eastern beacon of inner Kingston Reef, thence in a 187 degree direction for 575 metres to the northern end of the Army Jetty.

(ii) Parakeet, Geordie and Longreach Bays:

All the waters of Parakeet, Geordie and Longreach Bays bounded by lines drawn from North Point in a due north direction for 130 metres thence in an easterly direction to Monday Rock Beacon thence south to Bathurst Point Lighthouse.

(iii) Marjorie Bay, Narrow Neck and Stark Bay:

All the waters of Marjorie Bay, Narrow Neck and Stark Bay southeast of a line commencing at a point 60 metres north of Hayward Cape and thence running in a 064 degree direction to Crayfish Rock at the northeast end of Stark Bay.

(iv) Parker Point and Porpoise Bay:

All those waters lying to the north and west of a line drawn between Parker Point and Bickley Point.

(d) Ocean Reef Boat Harbour:

All the waters contained therein, the limits of which are from the extremity of the western breakwater in a north-easterly direction for 70 metres to the entrance channel port hand marker thence in a south southeasterly direction for 130 metres to the extremity of the northern breakwater.

(e) Shire of Mandurah:

- (i) All the waters contained within the Ormsby Street Lagoon from its junction with the Peel Inlet.
- (ii) All the waters of the Mary Street Lagoon from its junction with the Peel Inlet.

(f) Shire of Murray:

- (i) All the waters contained within the Murray River Island Branches known as Wargoorloop, Jeegar-njeejip, Meeyip, Worallgarook, Yunderup, Minjoogup, Little Yunderup and Goongoolup but excluding the main branch known as Coolenup.
- (ii) All the waters contained within the Yunderup Canals commencing at the innermost port and starboard markers of the marked entrance channel.
- (iii) All the waters contained within a point 50 metres downstream of the Ravenswood Bridge to a point 300 metres upstream of the Ravenswood Bridge.
- (iv) All those waters contained within the canal known as Murray Waters from its junction with the Murray River at South Yunderup.

- (g) Shire of Irwin: Port Denison Fishing Boat Harbour:
Port Denison Fishing Boat Harbour—all of the waters within the Port Denison Fishing Boat Harbour but excluding the gazetted swimming area where boating is prohibited.
- (h) Shire of Shark Bay—Monkey Mia:
All that water contained in an area commencing 20 metres east of the jetty at Monkey Mia and extending along the foreshore for a distance of 200 metres and extending 300 metres to seaward, with the exception of the dolphin feeding area measuring 50 metres by 40 metres and situated to the west of the boat launching ramp.
Entry to the dolphin feeding area is prohibited to all boats.
- (i) Town of Bunbury:
That portion of the Port of Bunbury between the seaward end of the Point Macleod Channel and Anglesea Island.
- (j) Champion Bay—Geraldton Harbour:
All those waters lying within the Geraldton Inner Harbour and to the west of a line drawn from the northeast end of No. 5 Berth in a direction due north to the West Breakwater.
- (k) Carnarvon:
All that area of the water within the Carnarvon Fishing Boat Harbour and including the approach channel from its junction with the main Teggs Channel.
- (l) Denmark:
All the waters of the Denmark River.
- (m) Green Head:
All that area of water contained within a radius of 250 metres from the northwest corner of the Green Head Service Jetty.
- (3) Limits the speed of motor vessels to that of eight (8) knots within the following areas:—
- (a) Swan River:
- (i) Between the Fremantle Traffic Bridge and a line drawn from Roe Point in a southerly direction to the Bicton Jetty.
- (ii) Between a line drawn from Roe Point in a 128 degree direction to the Bicton Swimming Jetties and a line drawn from Chidley Point in a 128 degree direction to the foreshore at Bicton.
Provided that this speed restriction will apply only on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays between 1 October and the following 30 April.
- (iii) Within the area of water of the Swan River from the Bunbury Railway Bridge upstream to Punt Road, Rivervale, provided that the following condition shall apply:—
That the speed restriction will apply only between the hours of 12 noon and 5.00 p.m. on those Sunday afternoons that the Maylands Yacht Club is conducting races.
- (iv) Between the upstream limit of the A Class Reserve at Maylands to the downstream limit of the water ski area commencing 580 metres upstream of the Garratt Road Bridge.
- (v) From a position 235 metres downstream of the Ascot Swimming Jetties to a position 100 metres downstream of the Point Reserve Jetties, but excluding the gazetted swimming area at Ascot;
- (vi) From the Bassendean Road Bridge to a point 100 metres downstream of the Governor Stirling Jetties;
- (vii) From 100 metres upstream of the Governor Stirling Jetties to the starboard hand marker being approximately 100 metres upstream of Caversham House.
Note: Other sections of the Swan River are also subject to differing speed restrictions (see 2 (a) and 4 (a)).
- (b) Fremantle Harbour:
- (i) Within the Fremantle Harbour.
- (ii) Within that part of the Fremantle Outer Harbour eastward of an imaginary line extending from the North Mole Lighthouse to a point where the northern boundary of the Outer Harbour meets the shore of the mainland.
- (iii) Within 0.8 kilometres radius of the oil refinery jetties at Kwinana.
- (iv) Within 0.8 kilometres radius of the Rockingham Jetty, situated at the foot of Railway Terrace, Rockingham.
- (c) Canning River:
- (i) Between Canning Bridge and a line drawn between Point Heathcote and the outer end of Como Jetty.
- (ii) Between 1.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Saturdays, sunrise to 9.00 a.m. on Sundays and 2.00 p.m. and 5.00 p.m. on those Public Holidays whilst authorised rowing regattas are in progress—All the waters of the Canning River between Canning Bridge and Mt. Henry Bridge.
Provided that this speed restriction shall not apply to vessels used by officials of the W.A. Rowing Association and used in the conduct of rowing regattas.
- (iii) On Mondays to Fridays (not including Public Holidays)—All the waters of the Canning River north of a line drawn due east from Deepwater Point to the Manning foreshore and extending to Canning Bridge.
Provided that this speed restriction shall not apply to vessels used by officials of the W.A. Rowing Association and used in the conduct of rowing training.
- (iv) Within Bull Creek from its junction with the Canning River.
- (d) Bunbury: Koombana Bay:
All that area of Koombana Bay southward of a line drawn from Point Casuarina Breakwater light and extending in an easterly direction to the northern groyne of "The Cut" but excluding the waters of Leschenault Inlet and upstream of Point Macleod.
- (e) Shire of Albany:
- (i) Emu Point: Within the channel in Oyster Harbour, Albany, between King George Sound and the Emu Point Small Boat Harbour.

- (ii) Kalgan River: All the waters of the Kalgan River between the Lower Kalgan Bridge and Upper Kalgan Bridge with the exception of the gazetted water ski area.
- (f) Shire of Augusta-Margaret River: Blackwood River:
- (i) Within the area of Blackwood River lying between the new Alexandra Bridge and the Warner Glen Bridge.
- (ii) All that water contained within an area commencing at a point 250 metres upstream of the Molloy Island Ferry Crossing and extending downstream for 500 metres.
- (g) Shire of Busselton:
- (i) Meelup-Cape Naturaliste: Within all the water lying from Cape Naturaliste for 915 metres offshore to Castle Rock in Geographe Bay.
- (ii) Geographe Bay—All those waters of Geographe Bay between a line bearing 055 degree true from Castle Rock and a line bearing 315 degree true from Wonnerup Inlet and within 100 metres of the foreshore except for the following areas which may be used as water ski take-off and set-down points.
- (a) East Busselton: All the waters extending 300 metres to seaward from the foreshore between a point 100 metres west of the foot of Carey Street and a point 100 metres west of the foot of Georgette Street.
- (b) West Busselton: All the waters contained within an area commencing 100 metres west of the boat launching ramp at the foot of Dolphin Road for a distance of 450 metres west along the foreshore and extending 300 metres to seaward.
- (c) West Busselton: All the waters contained within an area commencing 50 metres west of the boat launching ramp at Newton Beach for a distance of 450 metres west along the foreshore and extending 300 metres to seaward.
- (d) Quindalup: All the waters contained within an area commencing at the eastern boundary of Reserve A 46 and continuing for a distance of 200 metres westwards along the foreshore and extending 300 metres seaward.
- (e) Siesta Park: All the waters contained within an area commencing at the Siesta Park Groyne for a distance 300 metres east along the foreshore and extending 300 metres to seaward.
- (h) Shire of Denmark: Nornalup: All the waters of the Frankland River.
- (i) Shire of Dumbleyung:
- (i) Dumbleyung: Within Lake Dumbleyung with the exception of Reserve 26665 which has been set aside for water skiing and swimming.
- (ii) Coblinine River: All the waters of the Coblinine River.
- (j) Shire of Gingin: Moore River: All the waters of the Moore River.
- (k) Shire of Greenough: Greenough River: All the waters of the Greenough River except for the water ski area which is located between an imaginary line drawn from a point on the northern foreshore on a bearing of approximately 290 degrees from the southeast corner of Lot 4200, thence across the river to the southern foreshore in a direction of 220 degrees, to a second imaginary line from a point on the northern foreshore due west of the junction of Greenough River Road and Murray Road thence across the river to the southern foreshore in a direction of 180 degrees, as marked by signs.
- (l) Shire of Harvey: Leschenault Inlet:
- (i) Within the dredged channel leading into the Paris Road boat launching ramp at Australind.
- (ii) Within the marked channel leading from Leschenault Inlet to the mouth of the Collie River.
- (iii) Within the Collie River and including the marked entrance channel from Leschenault Inlet.
- (m) Shire of Mandurah: Mandurah Estuary: Between the seaward end of the Breakwaters at Mandurah and the southern end of the Sticks Channel in Peel Inlet with the exception of an area 410 metres in length and 6 metres in width adjacent to the western foreshore of Peel Inlet and immediately upstream of a point 500 metres south of the Mandurah Traffic Bridge. This area has been set aside for authorised boat demonstration and engine testing.
- (n) Shire of Manjimup: Walpole Inlet: Within Walpole Inlet and the channel connecting Walpole with Nornalup Inlet.
- (o) Shire of Murray:
- (i) Murray River: All the waters of the Murray River including the marked entrance channel commencing at the outermost port and starboard markers but excluding the waters contained within the Murray River Island Branches known as Wargoorloop, Jeeearnjeejib, Meeyip, Worallgarook, Yunderup, Minjoogup, Little Yunderup and Goongoolup and excluding the waters contained within a point 50 metres downstream of the Ravenswood Bridge to a point 300 metres upstream of the Ravenswood Bridge.
- (ii) Serpentine River: All the waters of the Serpentine River including the marked entrance channel commencing at the outermost port and starboard markers.
- (p) Shire of Northampton: Murchison River: All the waters of the Murchison River with the exception of the gazetted swimming and water skiing areas.
- (4) Limits the speed of motor boats to that of twelve (12) knots within the following areas:—
- (a) Swan River: From a point 200 metres downstream of the Belmont Swimming Jetties (Springs) to the upstream limit of the

the A Class Reserve at Maylands but excluding the gazetted swimming area at Belmont.

Note: Other sections of the Swan River are also subject to differing speed restrictions [see 2 (a) and 3 (a)].

- (5) Revokes all previous notices relating to restricted speed areas for private pleasure craft published in the *Government Gazette* pursuant to the powers conferred by section 16B of the Western Australian Marine Act 1948.

That the speed restrictions will apply only between the hours of 12 noon and 5 p.m. on those Sunday afternoons that the Maylands Yacht Club is conducting races.

- (iii) Between the upstream limit of the "A" Class Reserve at Maylands to the downstream limit of the water ski area commencing 580 metres upstream of the Garratt Road Bridge.

- (iv) From a position 235 metres downstream of the Ascot Swimming Jetties to a position 100 metres downstream of the Point Reserve Jetties, but excluding the gazetted swimming area at Ascot.
- (v) From the Bassendean Road Bridge to a point 100 metres downstream of the Governor Stirling Jetties.
- (vi) From 100 metres upstream of the Governor Stirling Jetties to the starboard hand marker being approximately 100 metres upstream of Caversham House.
- (vii) Between a line drawn from Roe Point in a 128° direction to the Bicton Swimming Jetties and a line drawn from Chidley Point in a 128° direction to the foreshore at Bicton.

Provided that this speed restriction will apply only on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays between 1 October and the following 30 April.
