PURSUANT to section 5A of the Money Lenders Act 1912-1982, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby grant Broadlands International Finance Limited, a body corporate of 249 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, hereinafter referred to as "the company", exemption from registration under that Act for the period specified in the Schedule to this proclamation and upon the conditions specified in that Schedule.

Schedule.

Period of Exemption.

3 years from the day on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette*.

Conditions of Exemption.

1. While this exemption has effect the company shall—

- (a) comply with; and
- (b) ensure that persons acting for it or on its behalf comply with,

the restrictions and requirements imposed by section 20 of the Money Lenders Act 1912-1982 as if the company were a money lender within the meaning of that Act.

2. The company shall not make a loan within Western Australia pursuant to this exemption other than a loan of not less than \$50 000 made to a body corporate.

3. The company shall, if and when requested to do so by the Attorney General, provide a statement of all loans made by it while this exemption has effect

showing the amount of each loan, the interest charged, and the reason advanced by the borrower for seeking the loan.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 34B (1) of the Land Act 1933, it is made lawful for the Governor to revoke an Order in Council issued pursuant to section 33 of that Act; and whereas by Order in Council dated 1 June, 1904, Reserve 4330 was vested in the Serpentine Road Board in trust for the purpose of "Agricultural Hall and Local Governing Purposes" with power, to lease the whole or any portion thereof for any term not exceeding twenty one (21) years from the date of the lease.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby directs that the beforementioned Order in Council be revoked and the Vesting Order cancelled accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act 1933, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 4330 (Mundijong Lot 58) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale in trust for the purpose of "Municipal Purposes and Doctor's Surgery".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale in trust for "Municipal Purposes and Doctor's Surgery" with power to the said Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands and Surveys to each and every lease or assignment of lease being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion thereof for any term not exceeding twenty one (21) years from the date of the lease, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to me by section 37 of the said Act; provided that no such lease or assignment of lease shall be valid or operative until the approval of the Minister for Lands and Surveys or an officer authorised in that behalf by the Minister, has been endorsed on the Lease Instrument, or Deed of Assignment, as the case may be.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954-1981, you are hereby required to remove from land owned or occupied by you all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following, and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including 26 April 1984, in such positions and to such dimensions as required by this Notice.

1. Rural Land: (Land other than that within the Mundijong, Serpentine, Jarrahdale and Byford urban areas and the North Ward of the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale). On or before the 30th day of November, 1983, and thereafter up until and including the 26th day of April 1984.

- 1.1 Have firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide inside and along all boundaries of land abutting road and rail reserves.
- 1.2 Have firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide so far as to surround all buildings, sheds and haystacks. The inner perimeter of such firebreaks to be within twenty (20) metres of the buildings, sheds and haystacks.

2. Rural Land—North Ward: Clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks or groups of buildings and haystacks situated on the land.

3. Urban Areas: (land situated within the urban areas of Mundijong, Serpentine, Jarrahdale and Byford). On or before the 30th day of November, 1983, and thereafter up until and including the 26th day of April 1984.

- 3.1 Have the land clear of all inflammable material where the area of the land is 1 012 m² or less.
- 3.2 Have the firebreak not less than two (2) metres wide immediately inside and along all boundaries of land exceeding 1 012 m² in area.
- 3.3 Have firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide immediately abutting all buildings situated on land exceeding 1 012 m² in area.

4. Small Holdings: Have the land clear of all inflammable material where the area of the land is 1 012 m² or less.

5. Where Council or its duly Authorised Officer, requires total boundary breaks of not less than two (2) metres wide upon properties, the Council or its duly Authorised Officer may in writing order the owner and/or Occupier to construct the necessary breaks.

6. If for any reason it is considered impractical to clear firebreaks or to remove the flammable material from the land as required by this notice, application must be made in writing to the council or its duly authorised officer, on or before 31 October 1983, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to abate a fire hazard. If permission is not granted by the council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Failure or neglect to comply with this notice renders you liable to prosecution. Penalty—fine of \$400, and the person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Note—

- (1) If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954-1981.

- (3) In zone 4 only, immediately surrounding every area of crop not exceeding 100 hectares of small paddocks or 200 hectares in one paddock, and
- (4) Within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, bulk and drum fuel deposits and haystacks on the land, so as to completely surround the building, fuel deposit and haystack, and
- (5) Prepare firebreaks of not less than twenty metres wide around the perimeter of any scrub or timber which has been logged, chained or otherwise prepared for burning.

(b) Townsite Land (i.e. land within any townsite):—

- (1) Clear of all inflammable material the whole of the area where—
 - (i) The area of land is 2 024 square metres ($\frac{1}{2}$ acre) or less, or
 - (ii) The land is used for the storage of inflammable liquids, or
 - (iii) There is a hotel or tavern situated thereon.
- (2) If the area of land exceeds 2 024 square metres ($\frac{1}{2}$ acre) clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 2 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of land and also immediately surrounding all buildings or haystack situated on the land.

All firebreaks required by the foregoing must be prepared in:—

Zone 2—On or before 30 September 1983, and thereafter maintained clear of all inflammable material until 15 March 1984.

Zone 4—On or before 21 October 1983, and thereafter maintained clear of all inflammable material until 29 March 1984.

If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks in the position required by this notice, the approval of the Council or its duly authorised Officer must be obtained to provide them in an alternative position.

2. Firebreaks not less than two metres in width inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the properties owned or occupied by you. But where this is not practicable the firebreaks must be provided as near as possible to, and within, such boundaries.

3. Firebreaks at least three metres in width completely surrounding and not more than twenty metres from the perimeter of any building, group of buildings, or haystacks. All inflammable material must be removed from an area two metres in width immediately surrounding the building. All inflammable material must be removed from an area three metres in width immediately surrounding an unattended electric motor site.

Townsites.

4. On or before 29 October 1983 all town lots within the townsite of Moora, Miling, Watheroo, Bindi Bindi and Coomberdale are required to be treated as follows:—

- (a) Where the area of land is 2 024 square metres or less, remove all inflammable material from the whole of the land.
- (b) Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 square metres, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least two metres wide immediately inside all internal boundaries of land, and also immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks, situated on the land and maintained free of such material until 6 April 1984.

If the requirements of this Notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

A. Rural Land: (All land other than a pine plantation and that listed as URBAN). Firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide must be provided in the following positions:

- (a) Immediately inside and along the boundaries of all land, including that which is uncleared, so as to form a continuous break around the holding except where an exemption is granted.
- (b) Inside and along the common boundaries of land which abuts a used public road. (Note: Firebreaks constructed on road verges do not constitute a legal firebreak).
- (c) Not more than 100 metres and not less than 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

B. Special Rural Land: The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned as Special Rural under Town Planning Schemes must maintain clear of all inflammable materials a fire break not less than two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

C. Urban Land (Residential, Commercial and Industrial land within a townsite or within any area subdivided for residential purposes).

In respect of land owned or occupied by you within any townsite or any area subdivided for other purposes, you shall:

- (a) Where the area of land is 2 024 m² (approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land, AND
- (b) Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 m² ($\frac{1}{2}$ acre), provide firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner/occupier, the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group or lot.

D. Fuel and/or Gas Depots: In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall maintain the land clear of all flammable materials.

E. Pine Plantations: Any pines planted for commercial purposes constitute a pine plantation and you are required to provide firebreaks:

- (a) not less than 20 metres wide around the perimeter of each plantation;
- (b) not less than 20 metres wide along those portions of the plantations which abut a used public road;
- (c) not less than 6 metres in width in such position that no part or compartment of the plantation exceeds twenty eight (28) hectares in area.

New Plantation: Pines or any other non-indigenous trees planted for commercial purposes on or after 17 August 1978, constitute a new plantation and you are required to provide firebreaks not less than forty (40) metres wide in the above situations.

Important information relating to your responsibility as a landholder in the Shire of Busselton.

1. You shall clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 2 metres wide;

- (a) Within 100 metres inside all boundaries of land and also immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel installations situated on the land; (firebreaks constructed on road verges do not constitute a legal firebreak under the Bush Fires Act); and
- (b) Not more than 100 metres and not less than 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land; and

- (c) Where the area of the land exceeds 121 hectares (approximately 300 acres) additional firebreaks so as to divide the land into areas of not more than 121 hectares (approximately 300 acres) which are completely surrounded with a firebreak.

B. Special Rural Land: The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned as Special Rural under Town Planning Schemes must maintain clear of all flammable material, a firebreak not less than two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

C. Urban Land: (Residential, Commercial and Industrial land within a townsite or within any area subdivided for residential purposes)

1. Where the area of land is 2 024 sq. m. (approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living trees, shrubs and plants from the whole of the land, and
2. Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 sq. m. (approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ acre) clear of all flammable materials firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

D. Fuel and/or Gas Depots: In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall maintain the land clear of all flammable materials.

E. Pine Plantations: Firebreaks not less than 10 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which pines are planted; not less than 10 metres in width along those portions of pine plantations which enjoy a common boundary with a road reserve, and not less than 10 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a pine plantation shall exceed 28 hectares in an area.

Special Notice to Land Owners and Occupiers.

The Council forwards a copy of this Firebreak Order with rate assessments each year. The notice is also published in the Busselton-Margaret Times.

The aim of the Council is to eliminate destructive bush fires and to this aim, some areas of the Shire are subject to a District Fire Protection Plan where large-scale hazard removal and roadside burning is carried out by the Shire's Bush Fire Brigades and Council workforce.

The requirements of this order are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work required to protect not only individual properties but the district generally. In addition to the requirements of this Order, Council may issue separate special orders on owners or occupiers if hazard removal is considered necessary in some specific areas.

- (b) All other lots—effective firebreaks around the perimeter of all buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land cleared of all flammable material to a width not less than two metres.

Special Rural Zone "Bindoon Heights and Lake Chittering Heights".

Land owners may make a contribution of \$20 to Council to install a firebreak not less than two metres wide on the external boundaries of the Special Rural Zone and in such other places as determined on the Strategic Firebreak Plan as approved by Council. In all other respects the Fire Break Order applies.

Owners not wishing to participate in this scheme shall comply with all the other requirements of this notice.

Not less than two metres wide immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps situated on the land.

Other Directions—

REGIONAL COUNCIL CONSTITUTION AGREEMENT.

1. Constitution of Regional District.

1.1 In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Local Government Act the Councils of the Original Constituent Municipalities having caused their seals to be affixed hereto hereby record having resolved on the dates referred to in Item 1 of the Schedule to enter into and submit to the Minister this Constitution Agreement proposing the constitution of the combined area of the whole or a portion of their respective municipal districts as a Regional District.

1.2 This Constitution Agreement shall take effect upon the making by the Governor of an Order constituting the Regional District in accordance with subsection (3) of section 697 of the Local Government Act.

2. Interpretation.

2.1 In this Constitution Agreement, unless the context requires otherwise:

- “Additional Constituent Municipality”—means a Constituent Municipality referred to in Item 5 of the Schedule;
- “Annual Contribution”—means the financial contribution to be made to the Regional Council by a Constituent Municipality towards meeting any deficiency disclosed in the municipal fund budget of the Regional Council for a financial year;
- “Constitution Agreement”—means this Agreement as approved by the Minister under section 697 of the Local Government Act, or this Agreement as varied from time to time in accordance with that Act;
- “Constituent Municipality”—means a municipality the whole or a portion of whose municipal district is for the time being included in the Regional District and for the purposes of this Constitution Agreement shall be a municipality referred to in Item 4 or Item 5 of the Schedule;
- “Designated Function”—in relation to the Regional Council means a function for the time being designated as a function of the Regional Council under this Constitution Agreement;
- “Fees”—means all fees, charges, and other imposts and rates authorised to be imposed by the Regional Council under any Act;
- “Health Act”—means the Health Act 1911 (as amended);
- “Initial Contribution”—means a financial contribution made to the Regional Council by a Constituent Municipality upon the execution of this Agreement or upon becoming a Constituent Municipality pursuant to section 698 of the Local Government Act;
- “Local Government Act”—means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended);
- “Original Constituent Municipality”—means a Constituent Municipality referred to in Item 4 of the Schedule;
- “Regional Council”—means the regional council of the Regional District constituted pursuant to this Constitution Agreement and the Local Government Act, the name of which is designated in clause 3 hereof;
- “Regional District”—means the combined area of the whole or portion of the respective municipal districts of the Constituent Municipalities constituted as a regional district by Order of the Governor pursuant to the provisions of section 697 of the Local Government Act, the name of which is designated in clause 3 hereof;
- “Waste”—means house and trade rubbish and refuse and other waste matter including any wastes composed wholly or in part of liquid.

2.2 Subject to the preceding subclause and unless the context requires otherwise the words and phrases used in this Constitution Agreement have the respective meanings given to them in the Local Government Act and the Health Act.

3. Names.

3.1 The name of the Regional District shall be “Eastern Metropolitan Regional District”.

3.2 The name of the Council of the Regional District shall be “Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council”.

4. District.

4.1 The Regional District shall be the combined area of the whole or portions of the municipal districts of the municipalities referred to in Items 4 and 5 of the Schedule.

4.2 The whole of the municipal district of a Constituent Municipality shall be deemed to be included in the Regional District unless the portion of a municipality to be included is defined in either Item 4 or Item 5, whichever is relevant, with sufficient particularity to identify clearly and unequivocally all land within and all land outside that portion.

5. Council.

5.1 Upon the constitution of the Regional District in accordance with the provisions of subsection (3) of section 697 of the Local Government Act, the Regional Council shall be constituted to perform in respect of the Regional District the Designated Functions.

5.2 The Regional Council shall comprise that number of councillors which equals the sum of the numbers set against the names of the Constituent Municipalities in Item 2 of the Schedule.

5.3 The number of Regional Councillors to be appointed by any Constituent Municipality in accordance with section 701 of the Local Government Act shall be the number set out in Item 2 of the Schedule against the name of that Constituent Municipality.

6. Designated Functions.

6.1. Without limiting the power of each constituent municipality to do all things connected with Waste treatment and disposal which have not been delegated to the Regional Council pursuant to this Constitution Agreement the Regional Council shall have the following Designated Functions to be performed by it to the extent that municipalities in Western Australian are authorized or required under any statute from time to time to perform them in respect of their respective municipal districts:—

- (a) The orderly and efficient treatment and/or disposal of Waste delivered to a building or place provided for those purposes by the Regional Council;
- (b) The provision and maintenance of fit buildings places equipment and machinery reasonably necessary for the purpose of carrying out any Designated Function;
- (c) The charging of Fees to all individuals both natural and corporate for the carrying out of the Designated Functions;
- (d) Whenever appropriate and in particular when required under the Health Act, or another Act to nominate two Regional Councillors as the Regional Council's representative members on the Western Australian Disposal Advisory Committee. One of such representatives shall be the Chairman of the Regional Council, or in his absence the Deputy Chairman;
- (e) The carrying out and doing of all other acts and things which are reasonably necessary for the bringing into effect of the Designated Functions herein or which are incidental to or consequential upon their operation;

6.2. Nothing in this Constitution Agreement shall affect the doing of anything connected with Waste treatment and disposal by a Constituent Municipality in any portion of its municipal district not included in the Regional District.

7. Financial Provisions.

7.1. In this Clause:

"Initial Total"—means the total of the financial contributions required by the Regional Council from the Constituent Municipalities upon the coming into existence of the Regional Council for it to begin implementing its Designated Functions, and shall be the amount specified in Item 3 of the Schedule if ascertained at the time of execution of this Constitution Agreement;

"net value of Regional Council assets"—means the market value of all the assets less liabilities of the Regional Council ascertained by a person qualified to make such valuations appointed for that purpose by the Regional Council;

"Population"—means at any time the total number of persons shown as electors on the electoral roll for the last preceding annual municipal election of a Constituent Municipality. If only a portion of the municipal district of a Constituent Municipality is included in the Regional District the Population of that portion shall be deemed to be the Population of that Constituent Municipality for the purpose of the provisions of this Constitution Agreement dealing with the calculation of the contribution by Constituent Municipalities of their Initial Contributions and Annual Contributions and contributions of capital sums pursuant to the provisions of section 723 of the Local Government Act.

7.2. The Initial Contribution of an Original Constituent Municipality shall be:—

- (a) An amount which bears the same proportion to the Initial Total as the Population of that Original Constituent Municipality bears to the total of the Populations of all of the Original Constituent Municipalities at the time of execution of this Constitution Agreement; but
- (b) If an amount is set out against the name of the Original Constituent Municipality in Item 6 of the Schedule then its Initial Contribution shall be that amount.

7.3. The Initial Contribution of an Additional Constituent Municipality shall be:—

- (a) An amount which bears the same proportion to the net value of the Regional Council assets as the population of the Additional Constituent Municipality bears to the total of the populations of all Constituent Municipalities including the Additional Constituent Municipality, both the net value of Regional Council assets and the populations being ascertained as at the time of the Additional Constituent Municipality joining the Regional Council; but
- (b) If an amount is set out against the name of the Additional Constituent Municipality in Item 7 of the Schedule, then its Initial Contribution shall be that amount.

7.4. Subject to the next succeeding subclause the Annual Contribution of a Constituent Municipality shall be an amount which bears the same proportion to the deficiency disclosed in the municipal fund budget of the Regional Council for a financial year as the Population of the Constituent Municipality bears to the total of the Populations of all Constituent Municipalities at the time of the adoption of that Budget.

7.5.1. The Annual Contribution calculated in accordance with the preceding subclause shall be varied if in the opinion of the Regional Council it is reasonable to do so in any instance to take account of the following:—

- (a) The usage by each Constituent Municipality in the financial year under consideration of land, works, improvements, plant, machinery and other things ("the Facilities") controlled or owned by the Regional Council; and/or

(b) The predicted usage of the Facilities by a Constituent Municipality in the year under consideration if it did not use the Facilities in the preceding year.

7.5.2. If in a financial year a Constituent Municipality—

does not make any use of the Facilities but—

with the written approval of the Regional Council given pursuant to section 715 (1) of the Local Government Act performs functions of the Regional Council within its own municipal district or the part thereof included in the Regional District—

then the Annual Contribution of that Constituent Municipality for that financial year shall so far as is possible exclude any portion of the expenses attributable to usage of the Facilities but may include a proportion of the other expenses of the Regional Council.

7.6. For the purpose of section 723 of the Local Government Act, the capital sum payable by a Constituent Municipality shall be an amount which bears the same proportion to the total of the moneys required to be raised by the Regional Council as the Population of the Constituent Municipality bears to the total of the Populations of all the Constituent Municipalities at the time of service on the Constituent Municipality of a proposition under subsection (1) of section 723 of the Local Government Act.

7.7.1. Initial contributions shall be paid on the day and in the manner specified in Item 8 of the Schedule.

7.7.2. Annual contributions shall be paid by equal quarterly instalments, the first of which shall be made within 42 days of service of a copy of the annual budget of the Regional Council on each Constituent Municipality or such period greater than 42 days as may be determined by the Regional Council.

7.7.3. The capital sum to be contributed by a Constituent Municipality for the purpose of section 723 of the Local Government Act shall be made in the manner and at the time or times determined by the Regional Council provided that the Regional Council shall inform the Constituent Municipality of the time or times at which and manner in which its capital sum is required to be contributed when the Regional Council serves on the Constituent Municipality the written proposition referred to in section 723 of the Local Government Act.

7.8. The Regional Council shall have authority to borrow money by the issue and sale of debentures and the provisions of Division 3 of Part XXVI of the Local Government Act shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to the Regional Council as if they were set out herein.

7.9. The Regional Council shall have authority to act under section 528 of the Local Government Act to establish general or particular reserve funds for any purpose consistent with the Designated Functions herein.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a) hereof, Council may, in writing, give any nominated officer the authority to engage in, or terminate from, an employment any other officer or employee subject to the conditions expressed in that written authority and subject, further, to the provisions of subclause (3) hereof.

Reports to Council.

(5) Every nominated officer shall advise Council, no later than the next full Council meeting, of the following matters:—

- (i) the name of any officer or employee engaged in, or terminated from, an employment;
- (ii) the classification of the officer or employee concerned;
- (iii) the award, if any, binding upon Council in respect of such engagement or termination, and
- (iv) the reason for such engagement or termination.

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

"Act" means the Local Government Act 1960, and includes any amendment to ... or re-enactment of that Act for the time being in force;

“amusements” means merry-go-rounds, swing boats, shooting galleries, water chutes, and other things usually conducted for amusement at fairs, carnivals, and shows, whether conducted at a fair, carnival, or show or elsewhere, and includes dancing rooms, skating rinks, and amusement parks however designated, and whether conducted at a fair, carnival, or show, or elsewhere;

“authorised officer” means a person appointed by the Council to enforce these by-laws;

“by-law” means one of these by-laws;

“Council” means the Council of the municipality of the Shire of East Pilbara;

“district” means district of the municipality of the Shire of East Pilbara;

“Schedule” means a schedule to these by-laws;

“sub-by-law” means a sub-by-law of the by-law in which the term is used;

words and expressions not defined in these by-laws have the meanings respectively given to them in and for the purposes of the Act.

2. A person shall not provide or conduct an amusement within the district unless he is the holder of a licence issued to him by the Council in accordance with these by-laws.

3. A person who desires to provide or conduct an amusement within the district shall make application in writing to the Council for a licence and shall state in the application—

- (a) the type of amusement for which the licence is desired;
- (b) the place at or premises in which the amusement is to be provided or conducted;
- (c) the hours during which the amusement will be provided or conducted.

4. The Council may either—

- (a) grant a licence to the applicant; or
- (b) refuse to grant a licence on any of the following grounds—
 - (i) that the applicant has committed a breach of any of these by-laws;
 - (ii) that the proposed amusement is or would be dangerous, unduly noisy, unsightly or otherwise objectionable;
 - (iii) that the proposed amusement would adversely affect the amenities of the area;
 - (iv) for any other reason that the Council thinks fit.

5. The Council may impose conditions upon which a licence is issued in respect of any one or more of the following matters—

- (a) the place at which the amusement may be provided or conducted;
- (b) the type of amusement that may be provided or conducted;
- (c) the days and hours during which the amusement may be provided or conducted;
- (d) any other matters the Council thinks fit.

6. A licence shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the First Schedule and shall—

- (a) state the type of amusement in respect of which it was issued;
- (b) specify the place at or premises in which the amusement may be provided or conducted;
- (c) specify any conditions on which the licence is issued;
- (d) specify the period during which the licence remains valid unless previously revoked.

7. The fee specified in the Second Schedule is payable in respect of the issue of a licence.

8. The holder of a licence to provide or conduct an amusement shall not provide or conduct the amusement—

- (a) except at the place or in the premises specified in the licence;
- (b) in a manner that is contrary to the provisions of these by-laws or any condition upon which the licence was issued;
- (c) except on the days and during the hours specified in the licence;
- (d) in a street, way, footpath or other public place so as to cause an obstruction.

9. The holder of a licence to provide or conduct an amusement shall—

- (a) keep the amusement in good condition and repair and proper working order and in a safe condition;
- (b) permit an authorised officer to inspect the amusement at all reasonable times;
- (c) not transfer or attempt to transfer the licence;
- (d) not sell, offer for sale or permit the consumption of any alcoholic beverage at the place or in the premises where the amusement is provided or conducted;
- (e) not act in an offensive manner;
- (f) not engage in any dishonest practice;

- (g) carry his licence with him and produce it upon demand to an authorised officer;
 - (h) have his name and licence number legibly displayed on the amusement;
 - (i) produce his licence to an authorised officer or member of the Police Force on demand;
 - (j) not permit gambling or any game of chance or unlawful game to be played on the premises or at the place where the amusement is provided or conducted.
10. The Council may revoke a licence on any of the following grounds—
- (a) that the holder of the licence has committed a breach of these by-laws;
 - (b) that the holder of the licence has committed a breach of any condition on which the licence held by him was issued;
 - (c) that the holder of the licence is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
 - (d) that the holder of the licence has transferred the licence issued to him or does not himself carry on the business.

11. A person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws is guilty of an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) and to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of twenty dollars (\$20.00) per day.

By-laws Relating to the Keeping of Bees.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 16 December 1981 to submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

PART I—Interpretations.

1. In these by-laws unless the contrary intention appears—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Wanneroo.

“Residential area” means any land zoned for residential purposes by the Town Planning Scheme.

“Special Rural area” means any land situated within a special rural zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme.

“Town Planning Scheme” means Shire of Wanneroo Town Planning Scheme No. 1 published in the *Government Gazette* on 13 September 1972 and amended from time to time (including amendments made after the date of coming into operation of these by-laws) or any other town planning scheme or by-laws made by the Council for the time being in force.

PART II—Keeping of Bees.

2. A person shall not keep a beehive in a residential area or a special rural area without approval of Council, and when so directed by Council, shall remove the said beehive within a time specified in the notice.

3. Any person who fails to comply with or contravenes this by-law or any part thereof commits an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$200.00.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1982.

The Municipality of the Shire of Yilgarn.

By-laws Relating to Fencing.

1. In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 17 June 1983, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:
2. These by-laws are made for the general control of fences within the boundaries of the Townsite of Southern Cross in the Municipality of the Shire of Yilgarn.
3. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise:—
 - “Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Yilgarn.
 - “Dangerous” in relation to a fence, means a fence in a dangerous condition by reason of faulty design, location, construction, deterioration of materials, damage by termites, decay, changes in ground levels or any other cause.
 - “Fence” means a fence abutting a road reserve or a fence on a boundary line of an allotment of land and includes a wall.
 - “Industrial and Commercial Zone” means any portion of the Townsite of Southern Cross that is classified in Southern Cross Town Planning Scheme No. 1, as District Shopping, Local Shopping, Office, Showroom Warehouse, Warehouse, Service Station, Drive-In Cinema, Motel, Hotel, Light Industry, General Industry, Caravan Park, other Commercial Business and Special Business.
 - “Residential Zone” means any portion of the Townsite of Southern Cross from time to time classified in Southern Cross Town Planning Scheme No. 1 as a Residential Zone.
 - “Urban Deferred Zone” means any portion of the Townsite of Southern Cross which is held in rural use in Southern Cross Town Planning Scheme No. 1 but with a view to ultimate Residential, Commercial or Industrial use.
4. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the First Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a Sufficient Fence for the purpose of the Dividing Fences Act 1961 within those portions of the Townsite of Southern Cross classified as Residential Zones.
5. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a Sufficient Fence for the purpose of the Dividing Fences Act 1961 within Industrial and Commercial Zones.
6. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the Third Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a Sufficient Fence for the purpose of the Dividing Fences Act 1961 within those portions of the Townsite of Southern Cross classified as Urban Deferred Zones.
7. Where a fence is erected on the boundary between differing zones a Sufficient Fence shall be that authorised by Council.
8. No person shall erect a fence of secondhand material without the written consent of the Council, which consent the Council may grant on condition that the material is of an acceptable quality and appearance.
9. No person shall on an allotment of land situated at the corner of two streets erect a fence or any other structure on or adjacent to the street boundary greater than 750 mm in height within six metres of the street corner.
10. No person shall without the consent of the Council construct a fence or any other structure in front of the building line in a Residential Zone greater than 750 mm in height.
11. No person shall without the consent of the Council erect a Dividing Fence on a boundary behind a building line in a Residential Zone greater than 1 800 mm in height.
12. A fence constructed of free standing asbestos sheeting, having a minimum of 25% of its total length below finished ground level and subject to relevant height specifications contained in Schedules hereto, shall constitute acceptable material for fences within all areas of the Townsite of Southern Cross.
13. No person shall erect a fence wholly or partly of barbed wire except:—
 - (a) in an Urban Deferred Zone;
 - (b) in an Industrial or Commercial Zone—provided that no barbed wire shall be used below 1 800 mm from finished ground level or;
 - (c) in any other part of the Townsite of Southern Cross only with permission of the Council and subject to no barbed wire being used below 1 800 mm from finished ground level.
14. No person shall erect a fence which is dangerous within three metres of the boundary of a public place.
15. In order to maintain adequate sight distance between vehicular and pedestrian traffic, no person shall on Residential land construct a fence more than 750 mm in height closer than 1 500 mm to either side of a driveway/crossover on any property boundary, within the property such a fence shall be truncated to a depth of 2 400 mm measured from the property boundary.

16. The owner or the occupier of land on which a fence is erected shall maintain the fence in good condition and in such manner as to prevent it from becoming dangerous, in bad condition and repair, dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the amenity or value of the property in, or the inhabitants of, the neighbourhood.

17. The Council may give notice in writing to the owner or the occupier of any land upon which is erected a fence which is dangerous in bad condition and repair, dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the amenity or value of property in, or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood or is contrary to the provisions of these by-laws, requiring such owner or occupier to pull down, remove, repair, paint or maintain such fence within the time stipulated in the notice.

18. Where the owner or occupier of land who has been given notice under By-law 17 of these by-laws fails to comply therewith the Council may enter upon such land and carry out the works specified in the notice and costs and expenses incurred by the Council in so doing may be recovered from such owner or occupier in a Court of competent jurisdiction.

19. Any person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws commits an offence and shall be liable to:—

- (a) a maximum penalty of five hundred dollars (\$500) and
- (b) a maximum daily penalty of fifty dollars (\$50) for each day during which the offence continues.

First Schedule.

Residential Zone.

Dividing Fence along Side Boundary and Rear Boundary.

(i) Wood: Front corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm and rear corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm and intermediate posts shall be 125 mm x 75 mm all spaced at not more than 2 700 mm centres.

All posts shall have tops with 62 mm weather and shall be sunk at least 600 mm in the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm soles and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails.

Rails shall be 75 mm x 50 mm each rail spanning two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

Fences shall be covered with 75 mm x 19 mm sawn pickets placed 75 mm apart double nailed to each rail.

(ii) Steel: A steel fence is a fence consisting of rail or link mesh to a height of 1 200 mm.

Front corner posts shall be 50 mm in diameter and rear corner posts shall be 50 mm in diameter. Intermediate posts shall be 32 mm minimum in diameter all spaced at not more than 2 700 mm centres.

All posts shall be capped and sunk at least 600 mm in the ground.

Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 38 mm diameter struts and set in concrete.

Rails shall be a minimum of 32 mm in diameter.

(iii) Masonry or Other Materials as Approved by Council.

Second Schedule.

Industrial and Commercial Zones.

(a) Subject to (b) hereunder a fence consisting of rail-less link mesh to height of 1 800 mm on top of which are three strands of barbed wire carrying the fence to height of not less than 2 100 mm supported by galvanised iron posts of a minimum diameter of 32 mm and sunk in the ground a minimum of 600 mm encased in concrete.

(b) On Industrial and Commercial land abutting a limited or controlled access highway the fence adjacent to such highway shall be constructed of materials as the Council shall from time to time determine.

Third Schedule.

Urban Deferred Zones.

The fence shall be erected from sawn, split or round wooden posts, steel or concrete set not less than 600 mm in the ground and not less than 1 200 mm out of the ground and spaced not more than 3 600 mm apart with strainer posts set 1 040 mm in the

ground and suitably and securely strutted at all corners, gateways and fence-line angles but not exceeding 1 000 mm apart. Each fence post shall be bored with not less than five 12 mm suitably spaced holes to be threaded with not less than five plain galvanised wires. Wire shall be wrapped around strainer and strained tight.
