AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth this 30th day of August 1983 the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Constitution Act 1889-1982.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act 1889-1982 provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may vest in heads of departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments to public offices under the Government of the State: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby—

(a) vests in the Administrative Officer and Assistant Administrative Officer, Department of Marine and Harbours, and in any persons appointed to act in the positions of the Administrative Officer and Assistant Administrative Officer during their absence or incapacity, the power to make appointments in respect of the Department specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto, of employees in the categories specified respectively in Column 2 of the Schedule hereto in relation to those Departments, on such terms and conditions as are contained from time to time in the award and/or agreement specified respectively in Column 3 of the Schedule hereto in relation to those categories of employees:

and

(b) revokes the power previously vested in Peter William Smith and in any person temporarily appointed to perform the normal duties of the said Peter William Smith during his absence or incapacity, to make minor appointments in respect of the Department specified in Column 1 of the schedule herein.

Child Welfare Act 1947-1982. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Child Welfare Act 1947-1982 that the Governor may by Order in Council (inter alia) appoint a Special Magistrate or Special Magistrates for any Court or Courts established under that section and may, in like manner, amend, vary or revoke any appointment made under that section; and whereas it is now expedient that those powers should be exercised in the manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth appoint David Wilford Walsh as a Special Magistrate for two years under the Child Welfare Act 1947-1982, with effect from 17 January 1983.

Health Act 1911 (as amended). ORDER IN COUNCIL.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the northernmost northwestern corner of Plantagenet Location 6706, a point on a present northern boundary of the Wilson-Torbay Drainage District and
