## NAVIGABLE WATERS REGULATIONS.

## Water Ski Area.

Department of Marine and Harbours,  
Fremantle, 27 September 1983.

ACTING pursuant to the powers conferred by Regulation 48A of the Navigable Waters Regulations the Department of Marine and Harbours, by this notice, amends subparagraph (1) (i) of the notice published in the *Government Gazette* edition of 4 December 1981 relating to the Geraldton Harbour Water Ski Area and declares that for Sunday, 2 October 1983 the following additional area of navigable waters is set aside for the purpose of water skiing and orders that bathing shall be prohibited therein:

All waters contained within an area extending from the beach take off area to the west of the existing boat ramp on a bearing of 046°T for a distance of 830 metres to a marker buoy, hence on a bearing of 247°T to a second buoy a distance of 1 170 metres, then on a bearing of 087°T for a distance of 660 metres. The start and finish line is marked by two buoys, all buoys are of the red plastic type approximately 2 ft. diameter and are easily seen.

Provided that the launching ramp is kept clear at all times and usage of the additional area is restricted to the Geraldton Water Ski Club members competing in the "King of the Harbour" between the following hours:—

Sunday, 2 October 1983: from 09 00 hours to 16 00 hours.

After 16 00 hours on Sunday, 2 October 1983 water skiing will revert back to the normal water ski area.

## APPLICATION FOR LEASING.

APPLICATIONS are invited under section 116 of the Land Act 1933 for the leasing of King Location 620 containing an area of about 5.5 hectares for the purpose of "Poultry Farm" for a term of 21 years at a rental of \$450.00 per annum.

Intending applicants shall submit with their applications details of intended utilisation and proposed development indicating size and type of intended structures, cost estimates, source of funds and programme for construction whether staged or not.

The Minister for Lands and Surveys reserve the right to refuse any application on the grounds that the proposed utilisation, development and/or development programme is inadequate or unsuitable or that the applicant has failed to show adequate capacity to fund the development.

It is necessary for intending applicants to possess a licence for a minimum of 2 000 birds from the W.A. Egg Marketing Board.

At any time during the currency of the lease, subject to at least two thirds of the demised land being utilised for the commercially viable production of poultry and eggs in conformity with the lease conditions and to the satisfaction of the Minister, the lessee may surrender his lease to the intent that he may apply for purchase of the said land. In this event a purchase price of \$6 500 shall apply for a period of 3 years from the date of approval of the lease (following which period the price shall be subject to review) and fees associated with the issue of a Crown Grant shall be payable.

The land is made available for leasing subject to examination of survey and the following conditions:—

- (1) The land shall not be used for any purpose other than "Poultry Farm" without the prior approval in writing of the Minister for Lands and Surveys.
- (2) The rent shall be subject to reappraisal at the end of the third year of the term of the lease and each successive three yearly period thereafter.
- (3) The lessee shall pay cost of survey when called upon.
- (4) The lessee shall not without the previous consent in writing of the Minister assign, transfer, mortgage, sublet or part with the possession of the demised land.
- (5) The land shall be occupied and used by the lessee for the purpose specified within nine (9) months of the commencement of the lease and thereafter will be continuously so used to the satisfaction of the Minister.
- (6) The lessee shall commence construction within nine (9) months and thereafter continue construction and complete and operate the works within two (2) years from the date of the commencement of the lease.
- (7) All buildings, erections, paving, drainage and other works shall be to the approval of the Local Authority and the lessee shall perform, discharge and execute all requisitions and works unto the demised land as are or may be required by any local or public authority operating under any statute, by-law or regulation.
- (8) The lessee shall, within twelve months from commencement of the lease, fence the external boundaries to the satisfaction of the Minister.
- (9) The lessee shall maintain existing and future improvements to the satisfaction of the Minister.
- (10) The only residence permitted will be that of the lessee or a manager or manager/caretaker.
- (11) The lessee shall indemnify the Minister against all claims for damage to property or persons arising from the use of the land.
- (12) The Minister or his representative may enter the land for inspection at any reasonable time.
- (13) Compensation will not be payable for damage by flooding of the demised land.
- (14) Compensation shall not be payable to the lessee in respect of any improvements effected by him on the demised land and remaining thereon at the expiration or earlier determination of the lease.
- (15) It shall be lawful for the lessee at any time within the three calendar months immediately following the expiration of the term or earlier determination of the lease, to take down, remove, and carry away any buildings, structures, improvements and plant the property of the lessee.
- (16) On determination of the lease, the lessee shall fill in, consolidate and level off any unevenness, excavation or hole caused by him during the term of the lease or by removal of his improvements and shall leave the demised land in a clean, neat and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Minister and shall remove any or all waste matter as required by the Minister.

Applications must be lodged at the Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth on or before Wednesday, 2 November 1983 accompanied by a deposit of \$260.00 together with the required development details.

All applications lodged on or before that date will be treated as having been received on the closing date, and if there are more applications than one for the location, the application to be granted will be decided by the Land Board.

#### BUSH FIRES ACT 1954-1981.

Shire of Kulin.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Kulin.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 15 October 1983 and thereafter up to and including 30 April 1984 to have a Firebreak clear of all inflammable material at least 2.5 metres wide (or such other width as is specified herein) in the following positions on all rural and townsite land owned or occupied by you:

- (1) Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
- (2) In such other positions as is necessary to divide land in excess of 200 hectares into areas not exceeding 200 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and
- (3) Immediately surrounding any part of the land used for pasture or crop; and
- (4) Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps situated on the land; and
- (5) Immediately surrounding any drum or drums or other receptacles situated on the land which are normally used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not, provided that the firebreak required to comply with this paragraph only shall be not less than 5 metres wide; and
- (6) Immediately inside land on which bush has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not); provided that the firebreak required to comply with this paragraph only, shall be not less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 15 October 1983 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reasons to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised Officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council, or its duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$400.00 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

#### BUSH FIRES ACT 1954-1981.

Shire of Quairading.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, the following notice is given to owners and/or occupiers of land within the district of the Shire of Quairading.

1. Rural Land (i.e. land other than in a townsite). Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the District of the Shire of Narrogin.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 31 October 1983 to clear of all inflammable material firebreaks not less than 2.438 metres (8 feet) wide in the following positions on all rural and townsite land owned or occupied by you and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including 15 April 1984.

1. Inside and within 20.116 8 metres (1 chain) of the boundary of all land, and
2. In such other positions as is necessary to divide land in excess of 404.68 hectares (1 000 acres) into areas not exceeding 404.68 hectares (1 000 acres), each completely surrounded by a firebreak.

3. Surrounding all areas on which buildings, haystacks, fuel ramps and fuel containers are situated on the land at a distance of not more than 45.720 metres (150 feet) from the exterior of such buildings, haystacks, fuel ramps and fuel containers.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 25 October 1983 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$40 or more than \$400 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning such burning must be in accordance with the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954-1981.
