WHEREAS by Clause XIV of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, dated 29 October 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent from the seat of Government or from the State he may in every such case, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint the Lieutenant-Governor, or if there be no such officer, or if such officer be absent or unable to act, then any other person, to be his deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters Patent, as shall in and by such instrument be specified; and whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the State: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint you the said Sir Francis Theodore Page Burt as from the time and date of my departure upon the said absence and during such absence to be my deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 10 (2) (c) of the Shipping and Pilotage Act 1967-1978 that the Governor may by proclamation vary any proclamation made under that section: Now therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby vary the proclamation of the Port of Dampier dated 6 October 1971 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 27 October 1971, by deleting the Schedule and substituting the following Schedule—

“ Schedule.

Port of Dampier.

The Port of Dampier is bounded by a line commencing at the high water mark on the coast of the mainland in longitude 116° 36'E and extending eastwards along the high water mark of the coast of the mainland and the west coast of Dolphin Island to a position in longitude 116° 50'E but excluding the waters of Boat Passage which are within the limits of the Port of Port Walcott; thence north along meridian 116° 50'E and along the high water marks of the coasts of Gidley, Keast and Legendre Islands west of that meridian to latitude 20° 18.2'S; thence in a south westerly direction to latitude 20° 23.7'S, longitude 116° 36'E; thence south along meridian 116° 36'E and the high water mark of the coasts of Rosemary Island, West Lewis Island and West Intercourse Island east of that meridian to the high water mark on the coast of the mainland in longitude 116° 36'E. ”

LAND TAX ASSESSMENT AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1983.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Land Tax Assessment Amendment Regulations 1983.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation on 1 January 1984.
- Principal regulations. 3. In these regulations the Land Tax Assessment Regulations 1976*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 3 and Schedule repealed and substituted. 4. Regulation 3 and the Schedule to the principal regulations are repealed and the following regulations and Schedule are substituted—
- “ 3. A memorial required to be delivered to the Registrar of Titles pursuant to section 46 (1) of the Act shall be in the form set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
4. For a certificate showing if there is any assessed land tax charged on land, pursuant to section 48 (1) of the Act, the Commissioner shall charge a fee of \$6.00.

Explanatory Note:

On and after 1 November 1983 the Commonwealth Electoral Office will be processing, on behalf of the State, all claims for enrolment on State electoral rolls. From that date persons wishing to enrol for State and Commonwealth Elections will only be required to complete a single enrolment card.

The new enrolment card is available at Australian and Western Australian Electoral Offices, and at Post Offices and Police Stations. Further outlets will be provided when arrangements are complete.

The new card is headed "Claim for Electoral Enrolment—Commonwealth of Australia, State of Western Australia". It replaces the 2 separate cards presently in use by the Commonwealth and the State.

On and after 1 November 1983 a claim card, when duly completed, is to be sent to the Australian Electoral Officer care of the Divisional Returning Officer for the Commonwealth Division in which the claimant resides. The address of each Divisional Returning Officer is shown on the card.

**WEST MURRAY TOWN PLANNING SCHEME—

1.2 Subdivision and development to be in general accordance with the Subdivision Guide Plan adopted by Council as part of the Scheme.

1.3 In this Special Rural Zone:

- (a) one dwelling house is permitted;
- (b) at the discretion of Council, rural uses other than piggeries, commercial poultrykeeping and activities of a commercial nature may be permitted;
- (c) no other uses are permitted.

1.4 No person in the designated floodway as indicated on the subdivision guide plan shall:

1.4.1 Undertake any development or planting without the prior approval of the Council;

1.4.2 Construct:

- (a) any building;
- (b) any roadway above the natural surface of the land;
- (c) any other embankment;
- (d) any wall or solid fence;
- (e) any mesh or net fence other than a fence which is aligned within 15 degrees of the direction of flood flow or which is collapsible.

1.4.3 Plant:

- (a) any orchard;
- (b) any line of trees or shrubs at closer intervals than 8 metres unless it is aligned within 15 degrees of the direction of flood flow;
- (c) any other vegetation which may in the opinion of the Council impede floodwaters.

1.4.4 Deposit any rubbish, wreckage or debris.

1.5 No person shall:

1.5.1 Erect any dwelling:

- (a) outside a designated building envelope;
- (b) on land which after filling and consolidation, is less than 0.5 metres above the 100 year flood level;
- (c) with a floor level which is less than 0.75 metres above the 100 year flood level.

1.5.2 Construct any septic tank such that the tank outlet and leach drain are less than 1.5 m above the maximum normal winter groundwater table of the site.

1.6 For reasons of flood control or drainage there shall be no constraints on the filling, development or planting of any part of a lot which lies outside a designated floodway, provided the Council is satisfied that at no time are such works likely to redirect flood or drainage waters onto adjacent land.

1.7 For the purposes of this scheme, flood levels and groundwater levels shall be the levels prescribed for the lot by the Under Secretary for Works.

1.8 The Council shall seek the advice of the Under Secretary for Works on matters pertaining to flood levels, groundwater levels, drainage, and flood flow.

1.9 No person shall drain or fill a wetland without the approval of the Council.

1.10 Fences shall be maintained to the satisfaction of the Council on all boundaries between freehold land and Public Open Space.

1.11 The Council will facilitate discussion between land owners and the Bushfires Board with a view to locating firebreaks where they will prevent the spread of fire without adverse effects upon the landscape of the area.

1.12 Further to the provisions of Clauses 5.4.2 and 5.5, Council may require the preparation and implementation of a landscape plan as a condition of development.

1.13 No dwelling shall be constructed or approved for construction unless supplied by a reticulated water supply.

1.14 The Council may impose limits on the keeping of livestock, temporarily, seasonally or permanently.

1.15 All household rubbish and refuse shall be transported to, and deposited in, a disposal site gazetted under the Health Act.

1.16 Council will encourage landowners to undertake tree planting programme providing the provisions relating to floodways are complied with.

MINIMUM PRICES TO DAIRYMEN:

Minimum price to be paid to dairymen by the Authority at the dairy for market milk containing not less than 11·75% per cent total milk solids as determined by Australian Standard Method 1084-1974, section 3, in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; and containing not less than 3·2 per cent milk fat as determined by the Babcock or Milko-Tester methods in relation to the same representative composite sample at the rate of 28·67 cents per litre.

Minimum price to be paid to dairymen by the Authority at the dairy for special products milk containing not less than 11·75 per cent total milk solids as determined by the Australian Standard Method 1084-1974, section 3, in relation to a representative composite sample taken over a testing period; and containing not less than 3·2 per cent milk fat as determined by the Babcock or Milko-Tester methods in relation to the same representative composite sample at the rate of 17·25 cents per litre.

MAXIMUM PRICES TO AUTHORITY:

Maximum price to be paid to the Authority by dairy produce factories for market milk at the rate of 30·87 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be paid to the Authority by dairy produce factories for special products milk at the rate of 28·69 cents per litre.

MAXIMUM TRANSPORT CHARGES (Market Milk only):

Maximum charge for transport of market milk from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area to dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area at the rate of 1·72 cents per litre.

OTHER CHARGES (Market Milk only):

Maximum charge for treatment, excluding pasteurisation and packing, of market milk at dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 1·92 cents per litre.

Maximum price to be charged at dairy produce factories in the metropolitan area for market milk received for treatment from dairy produce factories outside the metropolitan area at the rate of 36·18 cents per litre.

ACCEPTANCE AND DISPOSAL OF MILK BY THE AUTHORITY:

It is further determined that, where milk delivered by a dairyman—

is found to contain less than 11·75 per cent total milk solids, as determined by the aforementioned Standard Method during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1983 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found to contain less than 3·2 per cent milk fat, as determined by one of the aforementioned methods during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1983 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain antibiotic on a second occasion after January 1, 1983 or a second occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain antibiotic on a third or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1983 or on a third or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by the dairyman for the duration of that testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on the first occasion after January 1, 1983 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added water on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1983 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on the first occasion after January 1, 1983 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of two testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day to contain added solids on a second or succeeding occasion after January 1, 1983 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of four testing periods.

is found by the Department of Agriculture of Western Australia on a certain day after January 1, 1983 or on any day in a subsequent quota year, to have a bacterial count of over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre not less than 10 days—

after an initial examination indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre;

or, after any two initial examinations within the quota year indicating over 100 000 bacteria per millilitre;

or, after two consecutive initial examinations indicating over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre—

milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk as follows:

on the first occurrence in any quota year—for that one day;

on the second occurrence in any quota year—for that day and for the two closest days within the same test period;

on the third or succeeding occasion in any quota year—for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs.

Where milk delivered by a dairyman is acceptable as market milk or special products milk and the abovementioned prices for market milk or special products milk apply—

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority is accepted by the Authority at the dairyman's registered dairy produce premises.

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman and accepted by the Authority is disposed of by the Authority to the dairy produce factory at the point of acceptance by the Authority.

DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT 1973-1982—*continued*

PROVIDED THAT nothing in the Dairy Industry Act 1973-1982, requires the Authority to accept all or any milk delivered to it by any person; and milk delivered to and accepted by the Authority may be disposed of by the Authority to milk vendors or other persons.

The Maximum Prices—

- to be charged by milk vendors to milk vendors and milk distributors;
- to be charged by milk distributors to milk shops;
- to be charged consumers;
