### Money Lenders Act 1912-1982. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Rear-Admiral Sir Richard John To Wit:
RICHARD TROWBRIDGE, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

PURSUANT to section 5A of the Money Lenders Act 1912-1982, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby grant A.G.C. (General Finance) Limited, a body corporate whose registered office in Western Australia is situated at 165 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, hereinafter referred to as "the company", exemption from registration under that Act for the period specified in the Schedule to this proclamation and upon the conditions specified in that Schedule.

Schedule.

Period of Exemption.

Three years commencing on and including 11 November 1983.

Conditions of Exemption.

- 1. While this exemption has effect the company shall—
  - (a) comply with; and

(b) ensure that persons acting for it or on its behalf comply with,

the restrictions and requirements imposed by section 20 of the Money Lenders Act 1912-1982 as if the company were a money lender within the meaning of that Act.

- 2. The company shall not make a loan within Western Australia pursuant to this exemption other than a loan of not less than \$50,000 made to a body corporate.
- 3. The company shall, if and when requested to do so by the Attorney General, provide a statement of all loans made by it while this exemption has effect showing the amount of each loan, the interest charged, and the reason advanced by the borrower for seeking the loan.

THE HONOURABLE BRIAN THOMAS BURKE, M.L.A., the Treasurer, have been requested under the provisions of section 7F of the Housing Loan Guarantee Act 1957-1973 (in this notice called "the Act") to do so, do by this notice declare the following matters, that

- (a) the maximum amount which the Treasurer may guarantee under the Act during the period commencing 19 May 1958, and ending 30 June 1984, is the sum of eighty-five million dollars (\$85,000,000);
- (b) the maximum amount in respect of which agreements for indemnity may be entered into by the Treasurer during the period commencing 1 January 1962 and ending 30 June 1984, is the sum of seven million dollars (\$7 000 000);
- (c) the maximum rate of interest which an approved institution may charge on a loan to a borrower or on the purchase money to a purchaser in respect of any period whilst an agreement for indemnity is in force in respect of the loan or purchase money, is twelve and three quarter per centum (12 3/4%); and
- (d) for the purposes of section 7B of the Act the maximum amount which an approved institution shall advance to a borrower on the giving of a first mortgage of a new house or the maximum amount of the purchase moneys which an approved institution shall permit to remain payable under a contract for sale and purchase of a new house before an indemnity is given by the Treasurer under the Act, is seventy per centum (70%) of the value of a new house as defined in the Act.

  - (3) A person shall not cause or permit a sign referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation, to be exhibited on a taxi-car before the completion of a hiring if the sign was not so exhibited when the hiring was commenced and shall not cause or permit the removal or obliteration of such a sign from a taxi-car before the completion of a hiring if the sign was exhibited on the taxi-car at the commencement of the hiring.
  - (4) The size, form, and content of a sign exhibited on a taxi-car under subregulation (1) of this regulation and the position or positions in which it is exhibited on the taxi-car shall be as approved by the Board. ".





#### PRECINCT BOUNDARIES
