1. (1) These by-laws may be cited as the Country Areas Water Supply Amendment By-laws (No. 2) 1983.

(2) In these by-laws the by-laws made under the Country Areas Water Supply Act 1947 and reprinted and published in the *Government Gazette* on 1 May 1968 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954, as amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal by-laws.By-law 1

substituted.

2. (1) The heading to by-law 1 of the principal by-laws is deleted and the following heading is substituted—

“ Citation, Commencement, Application, and Repeal. ”.

(2) By-law 1 of the principal by-laws is amended by inserting before sub-by-law (1) the following sub-by-law—

“ (1a) These by-laws may be cited as the Country Areas Water Supply By-laws 1957. ”.

By-law 104AA
inserted.

3. After by-law 104A of the principal by-laws the following by-law and heading are inserted—

“ Concessional Consumption Charges.

104AA. (1) In this by-law—

“dependant”, in relation to an eligible person, has the same meaning as is given to that term in relation to a pensioner by the definition of that term in section 3 (1) of the Pensioners (Rates Rebates and Deferments) Act 1966, as amended, except that a reference in that definition to “pensioner” shall, for the purposes of this definition, be taken to be a reference to “eligible person”;

“eligible person” has the same meaning as is given to the term “pensioner” by the definition of that term in section 3 (1) of the Pensioners (Rates Rebates and Deferments) Act 1966, as amended, except that the reference in that definition to “the Minister” shall, for the purposes of this definition, be taken to be a reference to the Minister referred to in section 7 of the principal Act;

“relevant consumption period” means a consumption period commencing on 1 July 1983 or after 1 July 1983 but prior to 1 July 1984.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of these by-laws a person who is liable under the principal Act to pay money due for water supplied by measure to particular land during a relevant consumption period shall be allowed a discount under this by-law in respect of the money so due if—

(a) at the time payment is made, he satisfies the Minister that he is an eligible person;

(b) the land comprises a holding or part of a holding classified as of Class 1 as prescribed in by-law 104A of these by-laws;

(c) the land is occupied exclusively by—

(i) the eligible person referred to in paragraph (a) of this sub-by-law; or

(ii) the eligible person referred to in paragraph (a) of this sub-by-law and one or more other persons, where each such other person is a dependant of the eligible person or is also an eligible person,

or the Minister has dispensed with the requirements of this paragraph in relation to that case under sub-by-law (3) of this by-law;

(d) he is not liable under the principal Act for the payment of money due for water supplied by measure to that or any other land during a consumption period that commenced before the consumption period to which the discount relates;

- (e) he has not been allowed a discount under this by-law in respect of money due for water supplied by measure to any other land except where the portions of the relevant consumption period to which the discounts relate do not, to any extent, coincide; and
- (f) payment is made in full of the total amount due within 4 months after demand therefor in writing by the Minister or his authorized officer.
- (3) Where the Minister, having regard to the circumstances of the case, sees fit, he may dispense with the requirements of sub-by-law (2) (c) of this by-law.
- (4) The discount to be allowed under this by-law in respect of money due for water supplied to land is 50 per cent of the amount of money due for water supplied to the land that is chargeable at a rate of 24 cents per kilolitre in accordance with item 4 of the Second Schedule or item 4 of the Fourth Schedule, as the case may be.
- (5) A person who, in connection with or for the purpose of obtaining a discount under this by-law, gives information that he knows or has reasonable cause to believe to be false or misleading in any material respect commits an offence and is liable to a penalty not exceeding \$40. "

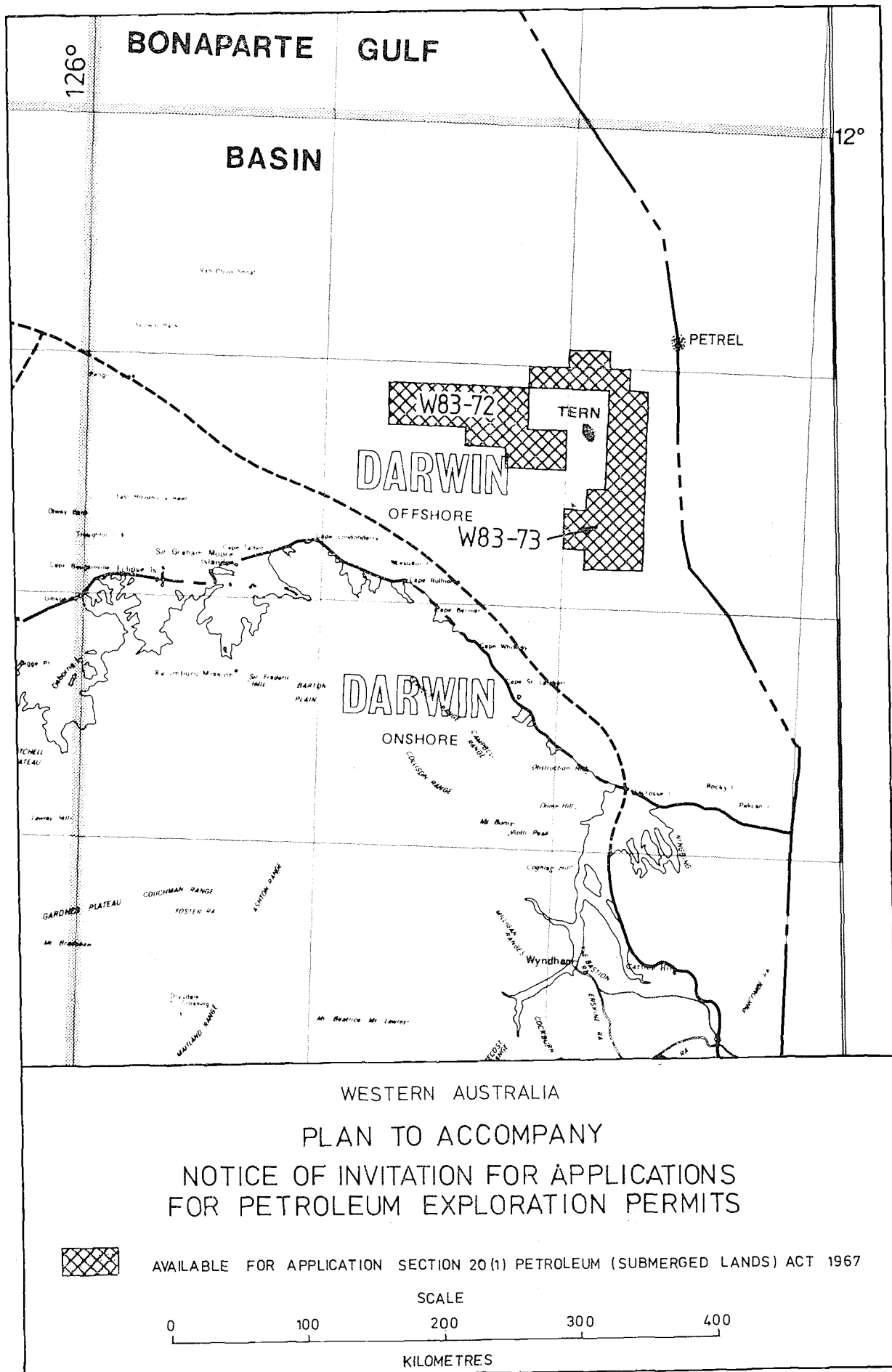

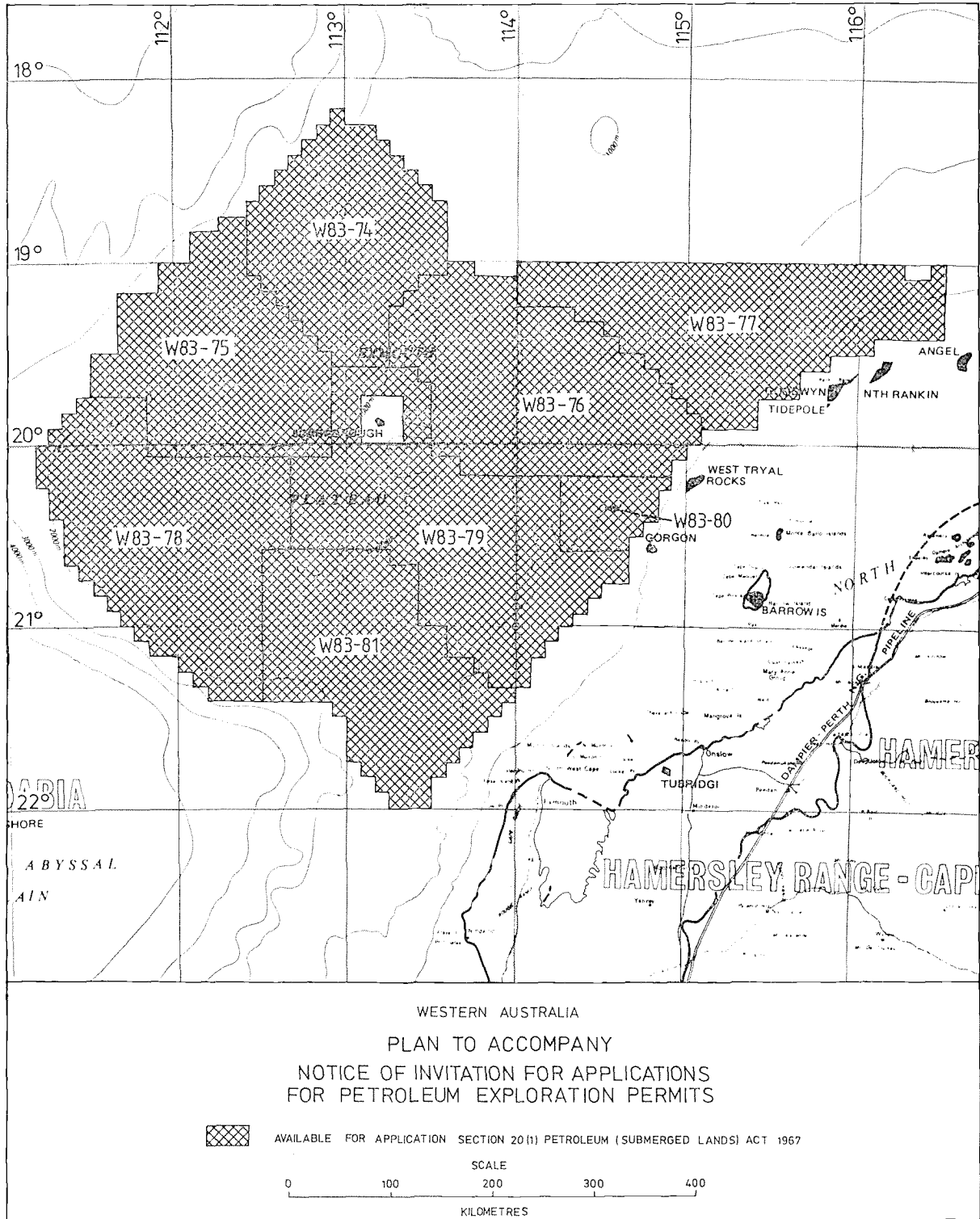
