District of the Shire of Northampton

(CHANGE OF WARDS AND REPRESENTATION) ORDER 2006

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and deputy of the Governor in the Executive Council on the recommendation of the Minister for Local Government and Regional Development.

1. Citation

This order is the District of the Shire of Northampton (Change of Wards and Representation) Order 2006.

2. Abolition of 5 existing wards in the District of the Shire of Northampton (s. 2.2 (1)(d) of the Act)

The Central Ward, Coastal Ward, North East Ward, South East Ward and West Ward in the District of the Shire of Northampton are abolished immediately before the first ordinary elections day of the Shire after the commencement of this order.

3. New ward created in the District of the Shire of Northampton (s. 2.2 (1)(a) of the Act)

- (1) On and after the first ordinary elections day of the Shire of Northampton after the commencement of this order a new ward is created in that district, named the Northampton Ward.
- (2) The Northampton Ward consists of the land described in Schedule 1.

4. Number of councillors changed (s. 2.18 (3) of the Act)

On and after the first ordinary elections day after the commencement of this order—

- (1) the number of offices of councillor on the council of the Shire of Northampton is 10 instead of 11; and
- (2) the number of offices of councillor for the Northampton Ward created under clause 3 is 6.

5. Continuing councillors allocated to new wards (s. 9.62 of the Act)

(1) In this clause—

"continuing councillor" means a person—

- (a) who was a councillor immediately before the commencement of this order; and
- (b) whose term of office as councillor continues beyond the day of the first ordinary elections after the commencement of this order.
- (2) A person who was a continuing councillor for a ward abolished under clause 2 immediately before the abolition of that ward, is, on and after the first ordinary elections day, to be taken to have been elected as a councillor for the Northampton Ward created under clause 3.
- (3) For the avoidance of doubt, it is declared that this clause does not affect the term of office of any continuing councillor.

6. Election to fill vacancies (s. 4.11 and 9.62 of the Act)

- (1) Any poll needed for an election to fill the offices is to be held on the first ordinary elections day after the commencement of this order.
- (2) Part 4 of the Act applies to preparing for and conducting the election as if the changes effected by clauses 2, 3, 4 and 5 had taken effect on the day on which this order commenced.
- (3) For the purposes of subclause (2)—
 - (a) Part 4 of the Act is modified to the extent necessary to give effect to subclauses (1) and (2); and

(b) without limiting paragraph (a), a reference in Part 4 of the Act to a ward, in relation to the district of the Shire of Northampton, is to be read as including a reference to the ward created under clause 3 as it is or will be, as a result of the operation of that clause, on the first ordinary elections day after the commencement of this order.

Schedule 1—Description of land in the Northampton Ward

(cl. 3(2))

The Northampton Ward consists of all that portion of land comprised in the Central Ward*, Coastal Ward*, North East Ward*, South East Ward* and West Ward* immediately before the abolition of those wards under clause 2.

NOTICE TO ALL LAND OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS OF LAND WITHIN THE TOWN OF BASSENDEAN

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 31 October 2006, or within fourteen days of the date of you becoming owner or occupier should this

be after the 31 October 2006 and thereafter up to and including the 31 day of March 2007, to have land of any size, the owner or occupier shall clear, to the satisfaction of Council or it's duly authorised officer, all flammable material from the *whole of the land except* living trees, shrubs and plants under cultivation and lawns

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than 28 October 2006, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$5000 and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE the Town of Bassendean Local laws prohibit the burning of foliage or bush without prior consent of the Council. If you need to burn your vacant land, please contact Council's Ranger for an evaluation of the land.

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 30 November 2006 or within fourteen days of the date of you becoming an owner or occupier, should this be after 30 November 2006, and thereafter up to and including 31 March 2007 to clear all flammable materials, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 19 November 2006, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If the Council or its duly authorised officer does not grant permission, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The Penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

The requirements of this notice should be carried out by means other than burning e.g., mowing and rotary hoeing.

Burning Rubbish or Refuse

A person shall not—

- (a) Without the written approval of the Manager Environmental Services, and

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT 2005

APPROVED LOCAL TOWN PLANNING SCHEME AMENDMENT

City of Rockingham

Town Planning Scheme No. 2—Amendment No. 26

Ref: 853/2/28/4 Pt 26

It is hereby notified for public information, in accordance with Section 87 of the Planning and Development Act 2005, that the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure approved the City of Rockingham Local Planning Scheme Amendment on the 19th September 2006 for the purpose of deleting Clause 25(i) from Schedule No. 4—Special Rural Zones (Portions of Planning Unit 2 of the Rural Land Strategy) and renumbering the remaining sub-clauses as follows—

- 25. Where lots have been identified as containing vegetation that is of regional conservation value (such as being included within Bush Forever as Bush Forever Site No. 278), the following requirements shall apply—
 - (a) Management of the vegetation to comply with the approved Environmental Management Plan prepared to ensure its long term protection. The Environmental Management Plan shall include a Fire Management Plan and Strategic Revegetation Plan and shall address boundary fending and strategic firebreaks to avoid unnecessary fragmentation, clearing and degradation of the vegetation.
 - (b) The Environmental Management Plan will be provided to prospective purchasers.
 - (c) Building Envelopes shall be defined at the time of subdivision and be of a size sufficient to include all buildings and the required 20 metre fuel reduction zone around buildings. The location and area of building envelopes shall be to the satisfaction of the Council and may be varied at the discretion of the Council.
 - (d) No clearing or development, other than for fire management purposes (consistent with the Fire Management Plan) or to construct a vehicle accessway which has received the prior written approval of the Council shall be approved outside the designated Building Envelopes.
 - (e) A Memorial be placed on the Title of each lot to notify prospective landowners of the conservation value of the vegetation on the site.
 - (f) In the Priority Conservation Area, no planting of non-indigenous species is permitted.
 - (g) No uses other than single dwelling, associated outbuildings and home occupation to be approved.
 - (h) On-site effluent disposal servicing development on the lots shall be to the satisfaction of the Council.
 - (i) All buildings and outbuildings are to utilise non-reflective materials in their construction and where possible are to use earth tones and colours such that the buildings are sympathetic to, and integrated with, the surrounding environment.
 - (j) The keeping of horses or livestock is not permitted.
 - (k) All subdivision is to be in general accordance with the Subdivision Guide Plan certified by the Chief Executive Officer as the subdivision plan relating to Lot 10 Fletcher Road, Karnup. No further subdivision is recommended.

Should any of the above requirements conflict with other provision in the Scheme that relate to the Special Rural zone, the above requirements shall prevail.

PUBLIC SECTOR MANAGEMENT ACT 1994

EXEMPTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 25 OF THE PUBLIC SECTOR MANAGEMENT ACT 1994

In accordance with s.25 (1) (a) of the *Public Sector Management Act 1994*, I partially exempt the Department of Community Development from the Recruitment, Selection and Appointment Standard, for the following occupational groups—

 Social Work positions including Team Leaders, Level 6, Senior Field Officers, Level 5, Senior Community Child Protection Workers, Level 5 and Senior Officer Care Services, Level 5;

- Field Workers, Level2/4
- Education Officers, Level 2/4; and
- Clinical and Counselling Psychologists L6 and L5

This exemption applies to the open and competitive components of the Recruitment, Selection and Appointment Standard only, for a period of no more than twelve months, unless repealed or amended under s.25 (1) (b) of the *Public Sector Management Act 1994*.

During the period of the partial exemption, all other components of the Recruitment, Selection and Appointment Standard and associated procedures pursuant to the Public Sector Management (Breaches of Public Sector Standards) Regulations 2005 remain applicable.

This exemption aims to provide for the Department of Community Development to consolidate its staffing and to source candidates on an ongoing and ad hoc basis in order to attempt to meet staffing needs arising from a recent increase in funding.

The exemption is applicable to the abovementioned occupational groups only and cannot be used for any other groups or positions in the department.


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
