ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1974 ROAD TRAFFIC CODE 2000

ROAD TRAFFIC CODE (MASS AND DIMENSIONS FOR ELECTRIC RIDEABLE DEVICES) VARIATION FOR COMMERCIAL OPERATORS NOTICE 2022

Made by the Hon Paul Papalia CSC MLA, Minister for Road Safety, pursuant to Regulation 3A(4) of the Road Traffic Code 2000.

1. Citation

This Notice is the Road Traffic Code (Mass and Dimensions for Electric Rideable Devices) Variation for Commercial Operators Notice 2022.

2. Commencement

This Notice comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the Government Gazette.

3. Terms used

In this Notice—

commercial operator or **operator** means a person or organisation who hires or provides rideshare services for electric rideable devices for reward or commercial gain.

electric ridable device has the meaning given to that term in regulation 3A of the *Road Traffic Code 2000*.

scooter has the meaning given to that term in regulation 3 of the Road Traffic Code 2000.

4. Mass and Dimensions

Subject to clause 5, the following mass and dimensions variations are approved in accordance with regulation 3A(4) of the Road Traffic Code 2000—

- (i) the length of the electric rideable device must not be more than 1300mm; and
- (ii) the width of the electric rideable device must not be more than 700mm; and
- (iii) the height of the electric rideable device must not be more than 1350mm; and
- (iv) the electric rideable device must have an unladen mass of less than 35kg.

5. Limitations

The variation in clause 4 only applies where—

- (i) the electric rideable device is a scooter; and
 - (ii) the scooter is owned and operated by a commercial operator who is lawfully operating under contract to provide electric scooter ride-share or electric scooter hire services.
