CONSERVATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT (EXCISION FROM STATE FOREST) ORDER (NO. 1) 2022
Made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 9 of the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984*.

1. Citation

 DECLARATION AND EXEMPTION OF EMERGENCY VESSELS

Department of Transport,
 Fremantle WA, 30 March 2022.

I, Christopher Mather, Director Waterways Safety Management, Department of Transport, and delegate of the Chief Executive Officer pursuant to Instrument of Delegation (NWR-2021-204830), and Instrument of Delegation (WAMA-2021-204836), made on 15 November 2021 under section 116 of the *Western Australian Marine Act 1982*—

1. acting pursuant to regulation 19H of the *Navigable Waters Regulations 1958* (the Regulations) **hereby declare** each of the vessels listed in Schedule 1 to be emergency vessels, with the specifications in Schedule 2; and
2. acting pursuant to section 115A of the *Western Australian Marine Act 1982* (the Act), **hereby exempt** the vessels listed in Schedule 1 from notices made under the following sections of the Act (‘the exemption’), subject to the conditions in Schedule 3—
 - (a) section 66 (Closure of navigable waters); and
 - (b) section 67 (Limiting speed of vessels).

This instrument is to be known as NWR—2022—205094 and it revokes the declaration and exemption in NWR-2022-205021 and NWR-2019-203258 being notice MA402 as published in the *Government Gazette* 23 July 2019.

Schedule 2—Declarations Specifications

Pursuant to regulation 19H(2) of the Regulations—

1. A vessel listed in Schedule 1 is taken to be operating as an **emergency vessel** in the following circumstances only—
 - (a) The vessel is being deployed in relation to an identified emergency (sea search and rescue or other situations where serious injury and / or loss of life can either be reasonably expected or has been reported to the vessel); or
 - (b) The vessel is being used in connection with the official duties, including the compliance, monitoring and enforcement of legislation administered by the Department of Transport or the WA Police, of—
 - (i) An inspector or authorised person appointed under section 117 of the Act; or
 - (ii) A Police Officer.

2. The master (every person, except a pilot, having command or charge) of a vessel listed in Schedule 1, whilst it is operating as an emergency vessel must—
 - (a) Hold, as a minimum, a certificate of competency as Coxswain Grade 2; and
 - (b) Be an inspector or authorised person appointed under section 117 of the Act or a Police Officer.
3. The following provisions of the Regulations **do not apply** to a vessel listed in Schedule 1 whilst it is operating as an emergency vessel and if it is reasonable that the provisions should not apply—
 - (a) Regulation 19A (Speed limit in the Swan and Canning Rivers); and
 - (b) Regulation 48 (Limitation of speed).

A vessel listed in Schedule 1 is permitted to use a lamp displaying intermittent blue flashes at any time it is operating as an emergency vessel.

NWR—2022—205094

Schedule 3—Exemption Conditions

Pursuant to section 115A of the Act, the exemption applies only to vessels listed in Schedule 1 and only if the following conditions are met—

1. The vessel—
 - (a) Is deployed in relation to an identified emergency (sea search and rescue or other situations where serious injury and / or Loss of life can either be reasonably expected or has been reported to the vessel); or
 - (b) Is being used in conjunction with the official duties, (including compliance monitoring and enforcement of legislation administered by the Department of Transport or the WA Police), of—
 - (i) An inspector or authorised person appointed under section 117 of the Act; or
 - (ii) A Police Officer; and
 - (c) Exhibits a lamp displaying intermittent blue flashes whilst it is exceeding the speed limit; and
2. The master of the vessel—
 - (a) Holds, as a minimum, a certificate of competency as Coxswain Grade 2.
 - (b) Is an inspector or authorised person appointed under section 117 of the Act or a Police Officer.
 - (c) Complies with the *Prevention of Collisions at Sea Regulations 1983* including—
 - (i) Rule 5 (Look out).
 - (ii) Rule 6 (Safe Speed).
 - (iii) Rule 7 (Risk of Collision); and
 - (d) assesses it is appropriate to exceed the speed limit, taking into account the situation of the identified emergency.

WAMA-2022-205072

Approval and exemption from certain speed and equipment provisions for craft participating in SLSWA events, rescues and associated organised training

I, Christopher Mather, Director of Waterways Safety Management, Maritime, Department of Transport (DoT) and delegate of the Chief Executive Officer, acting pursuant to the powers in section 115A of the *Western Australian Marine Act 1982* (the Act) and regulation 52CA of the *Navigable Waters Regulations 1958* (the Regulations), hereby make the exemptions, approval and conditions set out below in relation to—

- inflatable rescue boats and personal watercraft (SLSWA vessels); and
- paddle boards, surf skis and surf rowboats (SLSWA craft);

under the control of a bona fide member or employee of Surf Life Saving Western Australia (SLSWA) whilst participating in—

- launching or retrieving a SLSWA vessel from a SLSWA club;
- an aquatic event listed in the SLSWA Activity Register; or
- the organised training for such an event, rescue or emergency response;

within 5 nautical miles of the mainland.

Exemptions

1. SLSWA craft are exempt from compliance with regulations 52BAD(3), 52BAD(4) and 52BAD(5), pursuant to regulation 52CA of the Regulations.
2. SLSWA vessels are exempt from compliance with regulations 52A, 52B(1), 52BAD(3), 52BAD(4), 52BAD(5) and 52C of the Regulations, pursuant to regulation 52CA of the Regulations.
3. SLSWA vessels are exempt from compliance with regulations, 49, 50B, 51D, 52BAA and 52BAB of the Regulations, pursuant to section 115A of the Act.
4. SLSWA vessels are exempt from compliance with notices made under section 66 and 67 of the Act, pursuant to section 115A of the Act.

Approval

5. Pursuant to regulation 48(a) of the Regulations, SLSWA vessels are approved to exceed the speed limit in water less than 3m in depth and within 50 metres of a riverbank or water's edge.

Conditions

The exemptions and approval at paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 will only apply if—

- (a) DoT is in receipt of a safety management plan/s which covers all events listed in the SLSWA Activity Register and addresses the number of rescue and/ or safety craft and the medical response (including evacuation and communications plans) in place throughout the duration of the events and associated training;
- (b) All aspects of SLSWA's 'Guidelines for Safer Surf Clubs' and safety management plans are adhered to;
- (c) The events and associated training commence after sunrise and are completed before sunset;
- (d) For exemption from regulation 52A and 50B, all operators and crew on board a SLSWA craft or vessel must wear a minimum of Level 50 lifejacket;
- (e) SLSWA vessels carry a SLSWA radio;
- (f) For exemption from regulation 52B(1), the vessel is no more than 2 nautical miles offshore;
- (g) For exemption from regulation 52BAB(1), at least one personal locator beacon is on board and is being worn;
- (h) A copy of this instrument is produced to DoT within 72 hours of request.

This instrument revokes WAMA-2021-204883 and WAMA-2021-204741 being notice MA403 as published in the *Government Gazette* 2 November 2021 and is in force until 1 August 2023 unless revoked sooner.
