At the Court at Buckingham Palace. The 17th Day of March, 1955.

Present, The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of Western Australia (being one of the States constituting the Commonwealth of Australia) reserved on the thirtieth day of August, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-four a certain Bill passed by the Legislature of the said State, intituled "A Bill for an Act to amend the Matrimonial Causes and Personal Status Code, 1948-1953" for the signification of Her Majesty's Pleasure thereon:

And whereas the said Bill, so reserved as aforesaid, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that it should be assented to by Her Majesty:

WHEREAS the Bill for an Act to Amend the Matrimonial Causes and Personal Status Code, 1948-1953, was, on the 30th day of August, 1954, reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure; and whereas at the Court at Buckingham Palace on the 17th day of March, 1955, the said Bill was laid before the Queen's Most Excellency Majesty in Council and that Her Majesty did then by order, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, deby and with the advice of Her Privy Council, de-clare Her Assent to the said Bill: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 8 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1954, do by this pro-clamation declare that Her Majesty has assented to the said Bill and that the said Bill shall come into operation as an Act on the day whereon this proclamation is published in the Government Gazette.
