THE GOVERNMENT SCHOOL TEACHERS' TRIBUNAL.

IN the matter of the Determination by the Hon. Minister for Education of salaries and allowances to be paid to teachers as published in the *Government Gazette* of 2nd July, 1970 (and amendments thereto).

And in the matter of appeals lodged against such Determination by the State School Teachers' Union of Western Australia (Incorporated).

DECISION OF TRIBUNAL—SALARIES OF TEACHING STAFF.

PART I—GENERAL.

1. This determination will operate as from the 1st July, 1970.
2. The salary rates prescribed in this schedule shall be varied to the extent necessary to give effect to any decision of the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission in a National Wage Case, made during the currency of this schedule and expressed to be on general economic grounds and which has general application.
3. All salaries quoted in this schedule are expressed as the male equivalent but shall not be applicable to females until 1st January, 1971.

Until that date the female rate shall be determined by making the following deductions from the male rate:—

PART II.—DEFINITIONS.

For purposes of this schedule—

“two-year trained teacher” means a teacher who has successfully completed a minimum of two years' full-time tertiary training as a student of an approved teachers' college.

“three-year trained teacher (category 1)” means a teacher who has successfully completed a minimum of three years' full-time tertiary training at least two of which were spent as a student of an approved teachers' college.

“three-year trained teacher (category 2)” means a teacher who has completed more than three years of full-time tertiary training of which at least two years were spent as a student of an approved teachers' college but who has not the qualifications to become a four-year trained teacher.

For the purposes of this schedule only, a two-year trained teacher has the qualifications to become a three-year trained teacher when he obtains, subsequent to his initial training period, passes in three full units, other than Education towards a Bachelor Degree of the University of Western Australia, or a diploma of the Technical Education Division, or other equivalent qualifications from time to time prescribed.

“four-year trained teacher” means a teacher who has had a minimum of four years' full-time tertiary training including at
