PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas
TO WIT, } Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the

monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Constitution Act, 1889-1963, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly from time to time, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by the Act, do hereby prorogue the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly until Tuesday, the sixteenth day of November, Nineteen hundred and seventy-one.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the State, at Perth, this eleventh day of October, Nineteen hundred and seventy-one.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Constitution Act, 1889-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to fix the time and place for holding the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly; and whereas the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now stand prorogued until the sixteenth day of November, Nineteen hundred and seventy-one: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, do by this Proclamation announce and proclaim that the Second Session of the Twenty-seventh Parliament shall be holden for dispatch of business on Tuesday, the sixteenth day of November, Nineteen hundred and seventy-one, at the hour of three o'clock in the afternoon, in the House of Parliament in the City of Perth; and Members of the Legislative Council and Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at that time and place accordingly.
